# Dialogue on Dues - Frequently Asked Questions

When I spoke on Yom Kippur about the idea of moving to a Sustainability Model for revenues instead of our current dues structure, my goal was to start the conversation going. From all of the questions and comments we have received, I am happy to report that I was successful.

Our efforts to open the topic of how we work together to keep our congregation financially supported are continuing. In addition to the reprint of my Yom Kippur speech in our November bulletin, I am dedicating the space usually used for my column to the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) we have developed so far about the Sustainability Model.

#### Q. Why are we considering this change?

Our goal is to switch to a giving program that:

- encourages engagement and thoughtful giving
- focuses on our community working to sustain our congregation
- maximizes individual choice
- attracts new members, particularly younger members, and returning members

#### Q. Have other congregations successfully moved to this format?

Other congregations have successfully moved to the dues structure with increased participation and revenues.

#### Q. Are dues being increased?

No

#### Q. Is tuition for religious school included in the giving level we select?

No, tuition for Religious School will continue to be charged with the congregation continuing to cover over half of the costs to operate the school programs.

#### Q. Will there still be a Kol Nidre Appeal?

Yes. We are considering having a check-off box allowing congregants to include their Kol Nidre appeal within their Giving Level. We will continue to run other fundraisers.

#### O. Will there be different privileges of membership for different giving levels?

No, other than Associate Members all will be full members of Congregation Torat El, with voting rights, High Holy Days tickets, life cycle event services and membership discounts.

#### Q. Will there be any incentives for giving levels?

Yes, we are planning on giving incentives as special thank you's for those who choose a giving level at or above the Sustaining Level.

#### Q. Will we be publishing who chooses which giving level?

We would only publish the names of those who choose giving levels above the Sustaining Level and then, only if they want their names to be published.

#### Q. Who gets to know who is in each category?

Our plan is to maintain the level as confidential, limited to key staff and lay leaders involved in our finances. The Board and general membership will be informed of how many members selected each giving level.

# **Dialogue on Dues - Frequently Asked Questions**

#### Q. Will there still be assessments?

No

#### Q. Will there be a minimum giving level?

Yes, except for members who need dues relief and Legacy Members. Associate Members will have a different minimum giving level.

#### Q. What is the Sustaining Level and how is it calculated?

The Sustaining Level represents what we need from each member to sustain us financially. The calculation is based on our budget (not including fundraising and rental revenue) divided by the number of members (adjusting for members who need dues relief and Legacy Members).

# Hanukkah & The Mitzvah Of Going Public

Where do you light your *Hanukkiah* on Hanukkah? In the kitchen? On the dining room table? Or someplace where you are sure that it won't start a fire? When I was growing up, we actually had two places for candle lighting. We lit our main Hanukkiah in the kitchen (probably because we had a tile counter and that was the "safest" thing to do), and we lit our "electric" Hanukkiah in the window. As a young child, I always thought that the electric Hanukkiah, with its orange bulbs and plastic frame was a bit cheesy and I never understood exactly why we put it in our window in the first place. Little did I know that our electric Hanukkiah was actually put in the "traditional place" -- as a public proclamation of Hanukkah for all to see.

Indeed the rabbis teach us that our celebration of Hanukkah is supposed to be "public," more so than our other holidays, many of which are primarily focused inward -- at home or in the synagogue. More specifically, on Hanukkah we are taught to publicize the miracles of the Hanukkah story (*Pirsumei Nisa*) for all to see. As the Talmud teaches:

One must place the Hannukkiah by the door of one's house or on the outside. If one dwells on an upper floor, one places it by the window nearest to the street (Tractate Shabbat 21b).

Each night, as we light another candle in our homes, we watch as the lights get brighter. In our home, we have the custom of lighting one Hanukkiah for each member of our family. By the end of the Festival, the beauty of the light in our home is breathtaking. We place a huge table in front of the window, cover it with foil, and carefully proclaim to all who pass by that we are proud, hopeful, and confident. We are proud -- of who we are as Jews, of our history, of our people's tendency to overcome adversity, and of our family's attempts to stay true to our values and practices as Jews, just like the Maccabees of old. We are hopeful -- that a world which can seem very dark at times will always contain some light. And we are reminded that many times, it is our job to be the light, to bring more light into the world each and every day through our actions.

We are confident -- that small everyday miracles do indeed exist if we are willing to open our eyes, our ears, and our hearts to notice them. And precisely because we are proud, hopeful, and confident;



precisely because we are secure in our beliefs and bursting with love and pride as the candles are lit each night, we are inspired to share our energy, our hope, and our passion with the world.

So this year, as you light your Hanukkiyot, I invite you to try lighting them in the window (carefully, of course)! And then, I encourage you to take this practice a step further. Light with intention. Ask yourselves and your family the following: **How do** I demonstrate my Jewish pride? Do I live out my Jewish values? Do I talk openly with others about my beliefs or tell others about my Jewish practices and traditions? Do I share with my friends why I care about being Jewish? Am I **hopeful?** Do I believe that things in my life and in our world can get better? Do I have faith in God? Have I lost the ability to hope, and if so, how might I get it back? Am I confident? Do I know what I stand for as a Jew? Am I confident that miracles do indeed exist and do I know how to recognize them as such?

The traditional greeting on Hanukkah is *hag urim sameach*, literally "may this festival of lights be joyous." My wish and prayer for each of you is that by lighting your Hanukkiah for all to see, and taking time to consider some of these questions, the joy and light of our tradition fills your heart and soul just as those delicious latkes fill your stomach!



# History of the B'nai Sholom/Beth El Foundation

It's just about ten years ago that its first grant of \$3,400 for a Scholar in Residence weekend at Temple Beth El launched a program of giving by the B'nai Sholom/Beth El Charitable Foundation. Since that time, the Foundation has granted almost \$400,000 for endeavors by deserving Monmouth County non-profit organizations.

The Foundation, which is affiliated with Congregation Torat El, was endowed completely by proceeds from the sale of real estate by Congregation B'nai Sholom as part of its merger agreement with Temple Beth El, along with a half million dollars for Temple Beth El capital improvements.

The mission of this lasting gift is to support community-wide religious, cultural and educational programs which reflect credit on Congregation Torat El. Income from its invested assets are awarded annually, with its capital nurtured so our Foundation continues as a significant legacy. Presently, the Foundation has financial assets equal to its initial funding.

Major recipient organizations have included:

Program highlights have included Madeleine Albright, Eli Weisel, Rabbi Harold Kushner, Debbie Friedman, Tovah Feldshuh as Golda Meir, Israeli musical star Rami Kleinstein, annual Martin Luther King observances, three New Jersey Cantors' Choir concerts, African-American Cantor Joshua Nelson, and a wide variety of other special musical programs.

Publications include *Flowers From Ashes*, an anthology of Holocaust poetry, prose and artwork by 5-12 grade students (a Brookdale Center project) for school teachers and libraries that had such nationwide demand it went to four printings; *To Tomorrow's Children*, a traveling school and library display with accompanying literature, focusing on personal Holocaust experiences; and Hebrew/Jewish Songbook with CD.

#### Easy Jelly Donuts

#### **Ingredients:**

3 cups unbleached flour sifted

2 tsp. baking powder, 2 tbs. sugar

2 eggs, 2 cups sour cream

Canola oil for frying

Jelly of your choice, Powdered sugar

#### Directions:

- 1. In a bowl combine first five ingredients and mix until well blended
- 2. Heat the oil to 375°
- 3. Add 1 tbs batter for each donut making sure not to over crowd the dough
- 4. Fry until lightly browned and puffed and turn to cook on other side
- 5. Drain donuts on paper towel
- Poke a small hole in each donut and fill with your choice of jelly and sprinkle with powdered sugar

#### **Ingredients:**

2 sweet potatoes, shredded

2 eggs, lightly beaten

1 tbs. brown sugar

2 tbs. all-purpose flour

1/2 tsp. ground cloves, 1 tsp. ground cinnamon Vegetable oil for frying

#### Directions:

- 1. Place sweet potatoes in a strainer. Squeeze with clean kitchen towel or cheesecloth to release as much liquid as possible. Let sit and squeeze again.
- 2. Mix all ingredients in a large bowl except the oil.
- 3. Heat oil in heavy skillet to 375°
- 4. Form mixture into pancakes and fry 2-3 minutes on each side.
