

Celebrating The Wonder Women of Chanukah



When you think of the hero of the Chanukah story, who do you think of? If you are like most people, the first person that comes to mind is "Judah the Maccabee," that brave son of Mattathias who led a small band of Hasmoneans against the Assyiran (Seleucid) army (c. 167-160 B.C.E). When I was a very young child, I used to love telling the story of Judah, Mattathias, and the evil Antiochus, using a felt board complete with cut-out characters that my mom had put together for use every night. Each time I told the story, I would delight in putting up the brave Judah against the mean and terrible tyrant Antiochus. I loved recapturing the moment when the jar of oil was discovered, the miracle happened,

and the Temple was restored. Each night, I would wait for just the right time and proudly put up the green felt Temple on the board while throwing the blue Antiochus to the ground! But there was another character that my mom had put together for the story as well – someone that I had always thought everyone "knew" was a part of the Chanukah story, but who I later discovered is somewhat lesser known. Her name was Hannah and she had seven sons (orange-colored felt). She had to watch Antiochus kill each of her sons as punishment for refusing to bow down to him and, in the way I learned the story, she was the last to die a sad and tragic death. I am not sure how my mom was okay with me learning such a violent story — but that is for another time!

Who was Hannah? What does she have to do with Chanukah? And are there other heroes that are less known in the Chanukah story?

It turns out that Hannah is a reference to a character found in the Second Book of Maccabees (ch.7). Told in the extracanonical work called the Apocrypha, this character is rooted in the story of an unnamed woman with seven sons who martyrs herself at the hands of the Assyrians, after watching them do the same. Because they refused to eat pork. By the Medieval period, this previously unnamed character becomes known to all as a woman named Hannah. She becomes associated with the Chanukah story as a woman who stood her ground and was even willing to risk her life for her beliefs. While the thought of choosing to die, rather than transgress a mitzvah, might strike us as somewhat extreme today (particularly given the modern use of the term "martyr"), the broader point being noted here is that Hannah was a woman of principle who knew what she stood for, who was steadfast in her faith, and put her values and beliefs above all else. As a general principle, this is a value that most of us would likely get behind.

And it turns out that Hannah was not the only woman heroine associated with the Chanukah story. Have you ever heard of a woman named Judith? The Book of Judith is also found in the Apocrypha and though the story is set in the Babylonian period, the story is thought to have originated during the time of the Maccabees. Indeed later Medieval Hebrew versions of Judith understood her story in the context of the Hasmonean revolt. And just who was Judith? Judith was a widow who found herself suffering along with her fellow Israelites at a time when Jerusalem was under siege. Using her intellect and her beauty, the story goes that she got up from her mourning, snuck into the enemy camp and lured the enemy general Holofernes into his tent. Enticing him with cheese to eat and wine to drink, she got him drunk enough that he fell asleep. While he was sleeping, she cut off his head and returned to the Israelite camp with his head in a bag – finishing the job that the men seemingly were unable to handle. Incidentally, this story is why some have the custom of eating cheese on Chanukah.

Why do I share all of this with you? Because, violent and disturbing as they may be, these are two stories that celebrate women. They are stories that remind us of the brave women throughout Jewish history that have stood up for their beliefs, defended the Jewish people, and who are just as brave and accomplished as the men that we have come to celebrate on Chanukah as well. Ours is a tradition that is deeply rooted in patriarchy. This is something that is largely understandable from a historical perspective, but it is also something that we should continually work to correct. It is with that in mind that on this Chanukah, I want to encourage you to be inspired by the legacies of Hannah and Judith.

As you light your Chanukah candles, and eat some delicious latkes, take a moment to consider your female heroes. Who are the women throughout Jewish history, throughout American history, and throughout your personal lives who have inspired you? Who are the women who have stood out to you as heroes? Who are the women whose stories are not as familiar to your children and grandchildren as Judah the Maccabee? Hannah and Judith were included in the stories of the Maccabees for a reason. Let us work to ensure that their memories live on as an inspiration to the generations of Jews that would follow. Let us work to ensure that they, and women like them, have stories to be told and honored as well.

For the first time in human history, there are four generations of individuals alive in large numbers at one time. 

Easy Jelly Donuts

Ingredients:

3 cups unbleached flour sifted

- 2 tsp. baking powder, 2 tbs. sugar
- 2 eggs, 2 cups sour cream

Canola oil for frying

Jelly of your choice, Powdered sugar

Directions:

- 1. In a bowl combine first five ingredients and mix until well blended
- Heat the oil to 375°
- 3. Add 1 tbs. batter for each donut making sure not to over crowd the dough
- 4. Fry until lightly browned and puffed and turn to cook on other side
- 5. Drain donuts on paper towel
- 6. Poke a small hole in each donut and fill with your choice of jelly and sprinkle with powdered sugar

Sweet Potato Latkes

Ingredients:

2 sweet potatoes, shredded

2 eggs, lightly beaten

1 tbs. brown sugar

2 tbs. all-purpose flour

1/2 tsp. ground cloves, 1 tsp. ground cinnamon

Vegetable oil for frying

Directions:

- 1. Place sweet potatoes in a strainer. Squeeze with clean kitchen towel or cheesecloth to release as much liquid as possible. Let sit and squeeze again.
- Mix all ingredients in a large bowl except the oil.
- Heat oil in heavy skillet to 375°
- 4. Form mixture into pancakes and fry 2-3 minutes on each side.

In the Shadow of Alabama is a deeply personal novel based on the experience of the author's father, a Jewish boy from Brooklyn, who as a master sergeant during World War II, is put in charge of an all African-American platoon in the segregated South. He and his platoon are responsible for the maintenance and cleaning of Vultee BT-13 bombers, which crashed at an alarming rate. He not only found a way to prevent the crashes, but his strong sense of social justice led him to fight for fair treatment of his soldiers, despite being denied that fair treatment himself. Interwoven with his story, is the story of the author's gradual understanding of her relationship with her father, a man who, over 50 years after WWII, was honored by the NAACP and Veteran's Hall of Fame.

Judy Reene Singer was born in Alabama and raised in New York. She is a former high school English teacher and the author of Horseplay, Still Life with Elephant, and An Inconvenient Elephant


