

Celebrating and Cultivating A Community of Caring

"Rabbi, Sarah Goldberg just had a baby girl!

"Rabbi, Max Cohen's daughter just gave birth to a baby boy!"

"Rabbi, did you know that Shlomo Schwartz is at Jersey Shore?"



"Rabbi, my mother, a long time member of the congregation, just passed away. Can you officiate at the funeral? What do I need to do?"

"Rabbi, we have a member who is in her 90's and would love a visit? Would you, or someone from the synagogue be able to stop by?"

What all of these questions have in common (other than fictitious names) is that they come up in our synagogue on a regular basis. *But what most people do not know*, is that in addition to your clergy, we have a chesed (caring) committee that quietly and lovingly works tirelessly to celebrate with our members in times of joy, and support our members in times of suffering. This committee is unfortunately, one of the best kept secretes of our congregation.

People are often surprised when they get a call, or receive a shiva platter, or small gift from the synagogue. But "as a community building relationships with God, Judaism, and each other" this is exactly the type of holy work that our community should be engaged with. It is my hope that eventually this does not come to be surprising, but rather becomes an expected part of what it means to belong to Congregation Torat El. Recently, someone who is extremely involved in the synagogue was contacted by the chesed committee because they wanted to deliver a meal for this individual upon his return home from the hospital. The congregant was so grateful and remarked that he had no idea that such a committee even existed.

But they do exist and the work that they do is incredibly holy. This chesed committee is available for delivering a platter to a shiva home, calling someone when they are in the hospital, or bringing a gift to a family that recently celebrated the birth of a newborn, We are currently working on putting together a list of people in our congregation who are elderly, have trouble getting out, and do not have many family members or friends in the area. I recently had the honor of sitting with two such members on the same day who are 98 and 102 years old. It was my privilege to help bring a smile to their faces, and of course, I received much more from them than I gave by stopping by for a short visit. And this is not something reserved for your clergy or chesed committee members. If you you would like to volunteer to sit with someone for a visit on a semi-regular basis (and if you know someone who could benefit from such a visit), please e-mail me or contact Alyce Isaacson, our chesed committee chair person at *alyce1492@aol.com*.

This brings me to my last point: whether we are talking about mazal tov phone calls and gifts, or hospital visits, or supporting someone after a loss, or sitting with someone who is elderly and alone -- **we are only as good as our information**. There are times when people "assume" that the synagogue knows about a situation- but that assumption is usually incorrect. So if you know of someone who could benefit from some personal contact from either myself, Cantor Siegel, or your chesed committee, please call the office to let us know (732) 531-4410. We would love to be helpful to you!

Thank you to all have helped us with this endeavor thus far (Alyce Isaacson, Leah Zimmerman, Susan Sprung, and Mike Gordon). And thank you to those who have recently joined the committee. We are honored to have you helping us and so appreciative of the work that you do!

**One footnote to those who are interested in this type of caring work beyond the needs of the synagogue. The Jewish Federation of Monmouth County is sponsoring a "Caring Conference" kickoff event on Sunday, February 9, from 11am-4pm at Centra State Medical Center in Freehold, NJ. This conference is being arranged to train and support volunteers in our Jewish community who are interested in reaching out to others in times of crisis and need. ONLY a personal communication from you or a family member will allow us to know that you or a family member are in the hospital. It's heartbreaking to learn that you or a loved one were in the hospital without the opportunity to call or visit you, and without having our Chesed Committee get the chance to send a meal to your home to help lighten the load a bit.

Assistant Rabbi/Education Director Search Committee
