Tu B'Shevat: A Time for Rebirth and Renewal

"A person is like a tree of the field," Deuteronomy 20:19 tells us we need to nourish our roots to stand strong, to grow and produce. Tu B'Shevat is beginning of spring in Israel and is known as the birthday of the trees. It is also a time of rebirth and renewal. This year Tu B'Shevat begins at sundown on February 3 and continues until sundown on February 4th.

Tu B'Shevat is not mentioned in the Torah but rather is believed to originally be an agricultural holiday celebrating the beginning of spring in Israel. By Tu B'Shevat, in Israel, most of the winter rains have already fallen and the sap inside trees is starting to rise, causing new buds to form and the trees to bloom in spring.

Here in New Jersey, it looks like anything but the beginning of spring. In the dead of winter, cold and dark, we recently celebrated the Festival of Hanukkah. Each night, we lit an additional candle, reminding us that light can push back darkness. So too, with Tu B'Shevat, we remind ourselves that spring is coming. Our ground has not thawed and our trees are not getting ready to bloom yet, but they will. Until then, we look ahead, with anticipation to spring, to seeing renewal and rebirth in nature and in our own lives.

Tu B'Shevat is a great time to look to the areas of our lives that have not had attention recently. This can be difficult but it is ultimately worthwhile. Last week, I was thinking about an old friend. Both our lives have gotten busy and we haven't talked for many months, maybe even a year. When we finally reached each other on the phone and could both talk, the beginning of our conversation was a bit forced and difficult. As the conversation continued, it became easier and we shared more with each other, picking up right where we left off. The longer we spoke, the more we were reminded of how much we care for each other. While a bit difficult at first, one phone call renewed our friendship.

This type of renewal is at the heart of Tu B'Shevat. Just as nature renews itself to blossom and flower, we can as well. How can you bring new life into your relationships? Get back in touch with old friends and rekindle friendships. Has it been a while since you made shabbat dinner or come to synagogue? Join us, we would love to see you. Have you started a project and haven't worked on it in a long time? Pick it back up again. While we wait through winter for our beginning of spring, we can bring new life and renewal to our lives. We can nourish our roots and continue to grow, just as the trees in Israel are starting to do.

Sounds of Silence

The Simon and Garfunkel hit from 1965 continues to resonate for many of us. Of course silence in the form of quiet and calm is something we all value. Paul Simon's lyrics speak to a different silence. Art Garfunkel has been quoted that their collaboration focuses on the difficulty we all have sometimes in communicating -- "people talking without speaking, people hearing without listening". DISMISSAL PROCEDURES



For the continued safety of our students and staff, the doors of the synagogue will remain locked while Religious School is in session.

We realize there are times when you must pick up your child early. Therefore, the following procedures have been put in place:

- ♦ If you are picking up early, please call ahead, send an e-mail or send a note with your child letting Rabbi Metz know what time you will be picking up your child. This enables us to retrieve your child from class as quickly as possible.
- ♦ When you arrive, you will be asked to sign your child out.
- ♦ After 5pm on Wednesdays and on Sunday mornings, to gain entry to the building after school has started, please call 732-456-0489. Either Rabbi Metz or one of our teachers will answer the phone and the door will be opened for you as soon as possible. A sign will be posted on the door of the Religious School with the phone number as well.

The entire school comes together at the end of the day for tefillah in the small sanctuary. The teachers and Rabbi Metz love every opportunity to greet parents. Please feel free to park your car, come in for tefillah and see your child in action.

If you do not wish to come in, you may pick up through the carpool line, which will now begin in front of the Main Sanctuary doors, rather than down at the Religious School entrance.

As always, our children's safety is our highest priority. Rabbi Metz and the Education Committee welcome your comments and suggestions as we continue to work toward making dismissal a safe, smooth and convenient process.

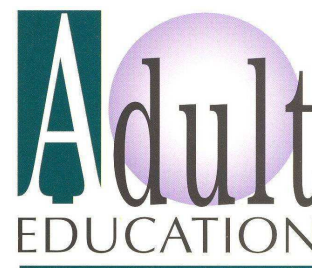
