Yes, We Are Welcoming To Interfaith Families



People are often surprised when they learn that we, a Conservative synagogue, are quite welcoming to interfaith families. Often interfaith couples and families assume that there is no place for them in our *kehillah kedosha,* our sacred community building relationships. Yet in actuality, while we may not be the perfect fit for every interfaith family (or every single-faith family for that matter), we have come a long way in the past six years in creating an environment that is welcoming, inclusive, caring, and valuing of all interfaith families who are committed to raising Jewish families and wish to bring the beauty, wisdom, and value of Torah living into their

lives.

Yes, it is true, that according to the current policy of the Rabbinical Assembly, Conservative rabbis are not allowed to officiate at an intermarriage, nor are they technically allowed to attend. This is challenging to our members and it is also painful for your rabbis. We, like a huge majority of Jews in America, have many friends and family members who are in interfaith relationships. Some Conservative clergy have made conscious choices to attend interfaith ceremonies, or receptions, regardless of the RA standard. And while most of us may prefer endogamy and bringing people into the covenant through conversion in order to create a Jewish family for a number of reasons, we also are very aware that people do not often choose who they fall in love with, and that intermarriage in and of itself is not necessarily a rejection of Judaism.

For me, the question often comes down to this: Once someone is already in a serious relationship with a non-Jewish partner, how can I as a rabbi, and we as a synagogue, encourage this family to bring the richness, meaning, wisdom, and beauty of Judaism into their life? How can I work, to bring these *krovei yisrael* (those who are close to the people of Israel) into our community? Because the research shows that there is a huge potential for actually increasing Jewish identity and affiliation by supporting these families and helping them to make Jewish choices.

You recently received a letter explaining that we have created a section in our Beth El cemetery for interfaith couples to be buried next to one another in their final resting place. This section was based on 2010 legal responsa written by the Committee on Jewish Law and Standards and we hope that if this is relevant to your life situation, or to someone who you know and love, you will share this information with them. But the truth is that this is just one of a handful of changes that we have made over the past few years in an effort to be more welcoming and inclusive of interfaith families who wish to make Judaism an integral part of their lives. Gone are the days when your rabbi or synagogue will not congratulate you on a joyous occasion in your life. If someone in your family is getting married -- to anyone -- we will happily announce that in the bulletin and please let me know so that I can wish you a proper mazal tov! If you have a family simcha, such as a bar or bat mitzvah, both parents (regardless of religion) will come up to the bima to present their child with his or her talit, or surround him as he or she is given a Hebrew name. During either occasion, both parents will stand next to their child while he or she is given a blessing, and both parents will stand together as the Jewish spouse chants the aliyah in honor of this special occasion. Immediate family members who are not Jewish will be welcomed to the bima to read a number of English readings as they celebrate this milestone in their family. Contrary to popular belief, the bima does not have an imaginary force-field around it. It should be a welcoming space for all families who have chosen to raise a Jewish child.

I am sure that there is more that we could be doing. But, as with all areas of synagogue growth and development, I am asking for your help. If you are a parent, grandparent, or spouse trying to navigate the complexities of an interfaith family, please share your story with me. We are more than willing to create programs to help facilitate discussions around this issue. To share just one idea, I would love to create a group for people in our congregation who would like to discuss issues relating to intermarried children or grandchildren. Additionally, if you know of people who have left our community because of pre-conceived notions, please help us to set the record straight. I have no problem with Jews who are committed to the Reform movement. But I struggle with Conservative Jews across the country who find themselves in Reform synagogues because they feel that they have no place in their own community. Let us work together to help promote the areas that we are successful and welcoming, and not simply the more challenging areas.

As you may know, both Temple Beth Torah and Temple Beth El had cemeteries. Those cemeteries are still managed by Congregation Torat El. The oversight of those cemeteries involves maintaining the grounds, keeping records, the sale of plots, and ensuring that halachic laws are observed. The office and the Cemetery Committee have been doing an excellent job in meeting these demands.

Recently, the Board approved our creating an interfaith section of the Beth El cemetery. This will allow us to continue our efforts of being an open and accepting family of families and to meet the ever increasing need for a place for mixed faith families to be together. The Board also approved our entering into a contract for the sale of a block of plots to Monmouth Reform Temple. That sale will cover the costs for the planning and construction of the new interfaith section. We will also have the space and ability to expand the interfaith section as needed in the future. This is yet another example of the efforts your Congregation is taking to meet the needs of our members and grow with the times and realities of the modern world. Many thanks to Alan and Sonny Winters and Neil Weitzenkorn for all the hard work they put into this project.




