LEARNING TO LOOK UP



The story is told that among the many Israelites who left Egypt were two men: Shlumiel and Buz. Slaves never look up; they only look down. And as slaves for their entire lives, Shlumiel and Buz had grown so accustomed to looking down they could no longer lift their eyes. When Moses brought us across the Red Sea, we all witnessed the great miracle: The sea parted, and we escaped from slavery. We became a free people. We came to know that God has a purpose in our history. Shlumiel asked Buz, "What do you see?" "I see mud," Buz responded. "I see mud, too. What is all this about freedom? We had mud in

Egypt; we have mud here!" And they missed the miracle of their escape. The sea split before them, but they didn't see it. They saw only mud. Then we stood at Mount Sinai in the Presence of God and heard God's voice proclaiming the commandments. We accepted God's Covenant and pledged ourselves to become a holy people, God's partners in healing the world. Shlumiel asked Buz, "What do you hear?" "I hear someone shouting commands," Buz answered. "I hear commands, too. What's all this about Torah? They shouted commands in Egypt; they shout commands here." And they missed the miracle of hearing God's voice. God spoke to every Israelite, but Shlumiel and Buz didn't hear His voice. They had heard enough commands. Finally, after forty years of wandering in the desert, we arrived at the Promised Land, the land of milk and honey, the land promised our ancestors. We arrived in the place of our fondest dreams. Buz asked Shlumiel, "How do you feel?" "My feet hurt," Shlumiel replied. "My feet hurt, too. What's all this about a Promised Land? My feet hurt in Egypt; my feet hurt here!" And they missed the miracle of entering our own land, Eretz Yisrael. The Israelites returned to the land promised them by the Covenant. The promise to our ancestors was fulfilled. Shlumiel and Buz didn't know it -- they knew none of it. Their feet hurt too much... (Feinstein, Capturing The Moon, Lift Up Your Eves And See)

Too many of us walk through life like Shlumiel and Buz. We spend too much time looking down, and not enough time looking up. The rest of the story goes that Shlumiel and Buz turned around, and ended up walking back to Egypt, and back to slavery. Those of us who walk through life with our eyes constantly facing downward are their descendents. This lesson is true in life, and it is true in terms of how we view our synagogue community. Synagogue members and leaders in the 21st century have a choice in the way that we choose to orient our eyes, our hearts, and our thinking when it comes to our synagogue community. We can spend all of our energy looking down (at financial concerns, demographic concerns, the changing face of institutional Judaism in the 21st century), or we can remember that while all of these things are indeed challenges that are not to be ignored, if we are constantly looking down, we will miss the myriad positive happenings occurring in our Torat El community. For example, did you know the following?

- Shabbat morning attendance has doubled in the past five years and we are now joined by our religious school students and families each week.
- Every Friday, a group of volunteers go to Brandywine Senior Center to lead Friday night services for the Jewish members. They do so quietly and consistently on behalf of our community.
- ♦ This year we celebrated our 12th annual interfaith tribute to MLK, including interactive conversations about race relations, and creating more unity in an increasingly divided and polarized society. We had over 200 people in attendance!
- We have seen an increase in unafiliated young families attending our festival and holiday programming, and have made strides to reach out into the community to connect with unafilliated Jews at events such as our Barnes and Noble Chanukah book reading.
- We are the only Conservative synagogue in the area to have a daily minyan (morning and evening) for people to join us in prayer and say Kaddish.
- We are one of 30 synagogues in the country who have moved away from a traditional dues model and have a very successful sustaining commitment program that has seen an increase in commitments over the past two years.
- We host weekly Al-Anon meetings.
- We host Jewish Family and Children's Senior Programs twice a week and are also the distribution center for Kosher Meals on Wheels -- providing food to individuals in need.
- We host a weekly adult education class which regularly has more than 30 individuals gathering to study Torah together (age range 40s- 90s!).
- Our Sisterhood, Men's Club, and Hazak programs continue to offer social opportunities to our members and the broader community.
- We have created a Teen Tikkun Social Action program for our youth in which they learn about social activism, leadership, and gain community service leadership hours for their local schools.
- We have increased our lay Torah readers, both adult and teen, thanks to the hard work of Ben Laskowitz.

We have much to be proud of as a Torat El community building relationships. And while there will always be something to kvetch about, there is also more than enough to applaud and celebrate. Todah Rabbah to our staff, leadership, and members who make all of this possible. Things are very much looking up! Let's remember that we should be looking up as well!


Lunch 'n Learn - Journey Through The Torah

FROM THE DESK OF THE TEMPLE PRESIDENT

This past New Year's holiday, I was able to travel to the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, California to watch my alma mater, Penn State, play. It was a great time. I got to see friends from college I had not seen or spoken to in 20 years. I got to watch a great game, although the result is not what I had hoped for. Most importantly, I was able to share this experience with my father, my daughter and my brother.

As I get older, I have come to realize that it is the experiences we have that we remember as we go through life. Think about it -- what from your life do you remember? Big events like family vacations, attending weddings, seeing a great game. The "small" experiences are meaningful, too. Watching your child play a sport or perform in a concert or dance recital, something funny that happened in the car or at a restaurant, the smell of chicken soup when you came in from a cold day as a child.
