## A Free Indoor Winter Activity That Is Priceless



Maybe it's that I am coming off of a wonderful sabbatical where I had time to work on some family history projects, which included organizing some fascinating primary documents and interviewing one of my uncles about my mom's side of the family. Maybe it's because I have recently started reading some of our collected family stories to our children before bed – stories about their grandparents and great grandparents that have been written down for precisely this purpose. Maybe it's that whenever I officiate at a funeral, I feel so honored and privileged to hear about your own family stories and sometimes can't help but wonder what stories I will pass on about my own family, or what stories will one day be passed on about me. Maybe it's because we are a few months from celebrating the bat mitzvah of our oldest. Or maybe it's just that I am getting older and, as some of you like to point out to me, a little bit grayer! Whatever the reason, I have been spending a lot of emotional time in the past

lately, considering the lives of those who are no longer with us, and working to ensure that their legacy does not end once I am no longer here to tell their story.

By now, most of you know that this is a topic which I return to with some frequency. I once read a piece describing an interview featuring Elie Wiesel (*zichrono u'verakha*, may his memory live on for a blessing). The interviewer commented that Wiesel seemed 'to live in the past.' To which, Professor Wiesel retorted: 'I don't live in the past. But what can I do - the past lives in me.' That is how I feel a great deal of the time. Each one of us has a rich family history, a tapestry of stories, significant life events, and lessons that have happened to us, to our grandparents, parents, siblings, children, and grandchildren. These stories have, to varying degrees, formed who we are as individuals, instilled within us the values which make us who we are, and have hopefully contributed to enriching our lives and our world for the better. And yet, unfortunately, I don't think this is something that we take a lot of time to consider or discuss, with our partners, siblings, children, and grandchildren.

How many of you have spoken with your family members about questions such as the following in the recent past?

Who has been the biggest influence on your life? What was your childhood like? Who were your favorite relatives? What are the classic family stories? Do you remember your grandparents? What did you learn from them? What were your parents like and how did they influence your life? Where is your family from and how did they arrive to this country? What are the most important lessons you've learned in life? How did you decide what to study in college? When did you first fall in love? How did you get engaged? When did you first vote and who did you vote for? What was it like when your child was born? How did you get your first job? How did you get your last job? Is there a childhood friend who you lost touch with, but who you will never forget? Where were you when Kennedy was shot? Where were you on September 11<sup>th</sup>? What book changed the way you look at the world? Do you believe in God? What role does Judaism play in your daily life? Where is your favorite vacation spot? What have you learned from life? <sup>1</sup>

Looking for a way to start writing down some of your stories for your children and grandchildren? Looking for a topic of conversation at the dinner table, or in the car when schlepping kids or grandkids somewhere? Start with this list. Or, even better, with recording and video capabilities now, quite literally, in the palm of our hands, think about recording some answers to these questions (though, not while you are in the car!). If you think "no one is interested," write down some of your thoughts, or make the recordings anyway. Trust me; your loved ones will be grateful one day.

As we settle into the cold days of winter, spending more time indoors with friends, family, and loved ones, why not take a few moments to engage with some family history activities? Take a moment to put down the phone to consider just why it is that many of us on social media have up-to-the-minute information and pictures about our friends and family today, but much less information about those who are no longer around to "share" their story. Sometimes I think we are living too much in the present, and not nearly enough in the past. What would the Facebook feeds of our parents and grandparents have looked like? What would they have "shared" and wanted us to know?

There is no one correct way to approach this sacred work. You might consider the questions above. You might consider using pictures to help jog your memory. You might use this as an excuse to pick up the phone and interview a loved one about their background and their life. Regardless of the medium, you owe it to yourselves, to your children, to your family and to your friends, to share and save your stories; and to retrieve the stories that may soon disappear without your assistance.

Don't wait until you "have time." Set a goal for yourself to have at least two different stories to share at your Passover Seder in a few months. Find a few minutes this week and get started. You will be glad that you did. *B'hatzlacha* - good luck. As always, I am looking forward to hearing about how this experience went for you.



## Meet Adam Valen Levinson, author of The Abu Dhabi Bar Mitzvah



Armed only with college Arabic and restless curiosity, our author set out to "learn about the world 9/11 made us fear." From a base in Abu Dhabi, he lunches in Taliban territory in Afghanistan, travels under the watchful eye of Aleppo's secret police, and risks shipwreck en route to Somalia.

Traveling through many Islamic countries, Levinson finds that people who pray differently often laugh the same and he learns that we cannot live by decisions born of fear.

Adam Valen Levinson is an affiliate of the Middle East Institute in Washington, D.C., and a fellow at the Center for Cultural Sociology at Yale University, where he studies humor as a key to cultural understanding.






