From The Rabbi's Study...

A New Year's Resolution

Happy New Year! As Jews, we are fortunate to celebrate more than one New Year! We have Rosh Hashanah, January 1, and we even have Tu B'Shevat, the new year of the trees that falls on January 20, 2011. Originally connected to the agricultural laws of tithing in the Land of Israel, Tu B'shevat was considered to be the date when biblical farmers offered the first fruits of their harvest at the Temple. As Tu B'shevat marked the



beginning of the fruit crop in Israel, it was one year later, on the following Tu B'shevat, that these farmers could begin using their new produce for their own personal or economic gain.

Throughout the years, however, Tu B'Shevat has evolved. In the middle ages, the Jewish mystics of Tzevat developed the Tu'B'Shevat Seder as a way to honor God's creation of the world. With the beginnings of Zionism and the establishment of the State of Israel, Tu'B'Shevat was re-established as a holiday which connects the Jewish people with the land of Israel. Most recently, Tu B'shevat has been set aside as a day on which Jews take a moment to celebrate the earth and our environment. It is this most recent understanding, one which has deep "roots" in our tradition, that I would like us to think about as we prepare to celebrate this year.

Unlike the homes that many people own, when it comes to the earth, the Bible is clear that there is no such thing as human "ownership." The words of the Pslamist teach that *The Earth is the Eternal One's and all that it holds, the world and its inhabitants* (Psalms 24:1). In other words, each one of us is blessed to be a tenant on this earth and we should approach this role in a responsible way. From the Jewish perspective it is the height of hubris to claim that the earth is ours and that we can do with it as we see fit. And yet, while most people in this world might not actually come out with such an explicit proclamation, this is unfortunately how we often behave. Each one of us is guilty, and often with the little things: leaving the water running too long, using too many paper towels, not being careful about recycling, not using environmentally friendly light bulbs in our homes, wasting gas, and discarding our electronics in an unsafe manner. Many of these habits are hard for us to change, and yet Tu B'Shevat reminds us that we must try. Because if we don't, there will come a day where the damage has been done and God's world will be in real danger.

This focus on "Going Green" has been a Jewish concern even before the holiday of Tu B'Shevat came into being. The Midrash famously teaches that:

In the hour when the Holy One created the first human being, God took the person before all the trees of the garden of Eden, and said to the person: "See my works, how fine and excellent they are! Now all that I have created, for you I have created. Think upon this, and do not corrupt and desolate my world for if you corrupt it, there will be no one to set it right after you. **Kohelet Rabbah 7:13**

Or, as George Burns put it in the movie "Oh God:" If we're not careful, eventually, we will be the cause of our own undoing and; "that will be that, 86 on the fishes, good bye sky, so long world, over and out."

The majority of the mainstream scientific community seems to agree with our tradition's understanding that each of us, collectively and individually can have an impact on the earth. And while we may argue as to how much impact humans are actually having when it comes to our environment, one thing is for certain: As Jews who are privileged to live on this earth, we are the ones responsible for taking care of our environment. This is true in our personal lives and in the life of Congregation Torat El. Organizations such as the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs have been on the forefront of helping synagogues improve in this area. From eco-friendly Shabbat Candles, to LED lights in the Ner Tamid, there are many ways that our synagogue might be more environmentally conscious. Perhaps we should be recycling more, using bio degradable plates and utensils at Kiddush on Shabbat, or doing less on paper and more electronically. These are just a few suggestions for how we might strive to do more as a congregation when it comes to the mitzvah of shmirat ha'adamah, protecting our environment.

Let us use this Tu B'Shevat as an opportunity for personal and communal reflection concerning how we care for our environment. "Going Green" is a very old Jewish value and being environmentally conscious and responsible has never been more important.

Shabbat candles are just two ways that we have begun to turn over a new "leaf" as we enter into Tu B'Shevat this year. But there is always more that we as a synagogue, and each of us as individuals, can do to grow in this area. So this year, let us celebrate the birthday of the trees, by giving the world and our descendents the gift of "Going Green." Being environmentally conscious and responsible has never been more important. This Tu B'Shevat, let us pledge to take the necessary steps to work on the little, and perhaps even big things, that each of us can do to ensure that we are doing our part as responsible tenants of God's Earth.

From the Desk of Alan Stern...

Led by Rabbi Schonbrun and his mentor, Rabbi Daniel Pressman. Services were well attended, inspiring, and educational. 

Your presence will be significant, you'll have a chance to connect with your Judaism in a way that is not time consuming, and you may even enjoy it.

SIXTH ANNUAL DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. COMMUNITY CELEBRATION EVENT TO TAKE PLACE AT MONMOUTH ROAD

Torat El With B'nai Sholom/Beth El Foundation Grant Reaches Out to All to Re-Affirm Shared Values and Human Liberty and Dignity


At our Friday evening Shabbat Service on **January 14th**, the members of Congregation Torat El and our friends of various faiths, races and ethnic backgrounds, from both our local community and from around our state, will celebrate the life and accomplishments of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. At this service, Jews, Christians and Moslems will stand together in the Main Sanctuary at Monmouth Road, as brothers and sisters, to acknowledge and proclaim the core values for which Dr. King sacrificed his life and which are at the center of both religion and civilized society. In addition to clergy and congregants from the forty-three congregations that are being invited, we will be joined by the choir of Trinity and St Philip's Cathedral in Newark for an inspiring performance of "We Shall Overcome", the song that epitomized the goals of the Civil Rights Movement under Dr. King, and "America, the Beautiful", which expresses the continuing hopes for our country. The invitation list includes all of the Jewish congregations that participate in the Long Branch Ministerium as well as the broad spectrum of Protestant and Catholic congregations within this organization and the related Moslem congregations associated with Imam Shakur Abdulrahmin, a long-standing friend and prior participant in our Dr. King programs.

We shall also be addressed by Imam Shakhur Abdulrshmin, who will reaffirm the work of Dr. King, our shared values as Americans of every faith, and condemn Islamic terrorism in all its forms and wherever expressed as a betrayal of Islam and an affront to individual rights and liberty. We are looking forward to sharing this experience with the greater community in our sanctuary, filled to capacity, recognizing Dr. King and reapplying the values for which he struggled to a new and complex age that calls upon each of us to protect and defend liberty and humanity. By providing this forum and exerting leadership on this topic and in this time, Torat El, with a generous grant from the Foundation, seeks to join with our greater community to advance our shared values and demarcate the principles for which we all stand. We will also develop and reaffirm friendships and continue to celebrate Dr. King and these values during the extended Oneg Shabbat that will follow the service.

The work of Dr. King increases in importance and the stature of this courageous defender of liberty continues to grow because his fight was, in reality, a fight for the promise of America. That promise must be available to all or, in truth, it is available to none. We are either each guaranteed essential human rights, irrespective of race, religion, creed, gender, orientation and physical or emotional challenge, or these rights can be denied to any individual or group by fiat. Dr. King struggled in the wilderness of intolerance when such truths were not so self-evident, but he did not struggle alone. Today, the threats to human liberty and dignity have developed additional sources. International terrorism functions in the guise of a "spiritual" doctrine that is morally bankrupt but which nonetheless challenges all of our freedoms, happiness and way of life. The devastation of 9/11 descended upon our community in Monmouth County as well as our entire nation and many other nations of the world. This extraordinary evil cannot be truly defeated by weaponry and security measures alone. It must be dealt with ultimately on a moral plane that reveals its skewed interpretation and deficient foundation.

Now we have the opportunity to recognize and continue Dr. King's work as we proclaim the core values shared within every tradition and refocus our determination to improve the world, one message and one friendship at a time. Imam Shakur's message will be especially compelling, appropriate and timely. It will be among the first of its nature from the Islamic community. America is where these statements and dialogues must take place because they can do so without fear of physical retaliation and with the help of other traditions, such as ours, which also address these moral insights. The scope and intensity of this program will be unprecedented and of great importance. The themes at the center of this event are historical, educational and spiritual, and constitute the essence of what all of us and are country are about.
