January 20th - 21st Featuring Cantor Nancy Abramson

Director of the H. L. Miller Cantorial School and College of Jewish Music at JTS

Cantor Nancy Abramson is director of the H. L. Miller Cantorial School and College of Jewish Music at JTS. She trains future hazzanim in prayer, *nusah* and religious leadership, and is helping shape cantorial arts and practices for the 21st century. Having served as president and two-time national convention co-chair of the Cantors Assembly,

Cantor Abramson is immediate past president of the organization, the first female officer in the Cantors Assembly's 68-year history.

Cantor Abramson has performed as a soloist at Carnegie Hall, Avery Fisher Hall, and the Rose Theater of Jazz at Lincoln Center, and has sung with the Rinat Choir in Israel. Cantor Abramson came to JTS from New York City's Park Avenue Synagogue, where she directed all musical aspects of congregational life, and previously served West End Synagogue in Manhattan and Congregation Sons of Israel in Briarcliff Manor, New York. She has taught at the Abraham Joshua Heschel School in New York, and directed the music program at Ramah camps in Wisconsin and New England. She has been a scholar-in-residence in communities throughout the United States. Cantor Abramson sits on the board of the Zamir Choral Foundation and the Magic Circle Opera Repertory Ensemble.

Cantor Abramson is a graduate of the Joint Program of the Albert A. List College of Jewish Studies of JTS and Columbia University, from which she earned a BHL in Jewish History and a BA in Music. She received her cantorial education at JTS, and earned a master's degree in Music Education from Teachers College, Columbia University. She is married to Mitch Glenn; they have three children and one delightful grandson.

Honoring the Legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.



In a few weeks we will once again celebrate our annual MLK event with our community partners in faith. As I mentioned on Rosh Hashanah, and in my last bulletin article (are you sensing a theme here), these days it seems that our society would do well to remember that Judaism is a religion that stresses the belief that all human beings are equal, sacred, and deserve to be treated as such. As Jews we are taught to love our neighbor as ourselves, to honor the poor, the widow, and the stranger -- because we too were strangers in the land of Egypt. As I said on Rosh Hashanah, our life-long task and challenge is to

become a blessing to others; to fill the world with compassion and understanding; to stand up to bigotry, intolerance, divisiveness, and this idolatrous, blasphemous behavior that is all too common in our world. And it starts through our relationships with others. It starts by having events such as our annual MLK tribute. As a *kehillah kedosha*, "a sacred community building relationships," we seek to provide spaces such as this for human beings to gather in celebration of our diversity, our shared sense of faith, and our commitment to healing a broken world and a fractured society. To that end -- please turn to page 8 to read about a different type of MLK event that will include dialogue and discussion with our neighbors as we seek to truly come to "know" one another over food and thought-provoking discussions, in addition to our favorite program moments filled with beautiful song and inspirational speakers. **I hope that you will mark your calendars and consider joining us for this event on Wednesday, January 11th at 6:30pm.**

In addition, this year, I would like to suggest that you take a few moments on MLK Day to consider the following Jewish lessons that relate to this day and share them with your friends and family. Below are five different Jewish texts that relate to the themes of the day. I invite you to pick one or two of the following texts, post them on social media, discuss them around the dinner table, or share them with some friends. And remember that study is considered so important in Judaism because it should lead to action. Ask yourselves how these texts might transform your life if you took them seriously.

- 1. The Holiness of Every Human Being: For this reason Adam was created as a single person: To teach you that anyone who destroys one soul is described in Scripture as if he destroyed an entire world, and anyone who sustains one soul is described in Scripture as if he sustained an entire word... And (second) to declare the greatness of the Holy One, blessed be God; for a person uses a mold to cast a number of coins, and they are all similar to each other, while the Sovereign of all sovereigns, the Holy One, blessed be God, casts each person in the mold of the first human being and none of them is similar to any other. Therefore each and every person must say: "For me the world was created."

 Mishnah Sandhedrin 4:5
- **2.** We share this world together: Rabbi Shimon bar Yohai taught: There was once a group of men on a ship, one of whom took a borer and began drilling beneath his seat. His fellow travelers said to him: What are you doing? He responded: What does it matter to you, I am only drilling under my seat? They responded: Yes, but if you keep drilling, the water will come into the entire boat and flood the ship for us all. **Midrash Leviticus Rabbah 4:6**
- **3.** We are responsible to care for one another: The more deeply immersed I became in the thinking of the prophets, the more powerfully it became clear to me what the lives of the prophets sought to convey; that morally speaking, there is no limit to the concern one must feel for the suffering of human beings. It also became clear to me that in regard to cruelties committed in the name of a free society, some are guilty, while all are responsible. Heschel, Moral Grandeur and Spiritual Audacity, The Reasons for My Involvement in the Peace Movement, 225).
- **4.** *Hate is a poison:* There is a story that the famous Rabbi Shlomo Carlebach, the singer who came to America as a teenager fleeing Nazi persecution, used to go back to Austria and Germany to give concerts. Someone once asked him how he could go back there and he answered: "If I had two souls, I would devote one full-time to hating them. But I don't. I only have one soul and I am not going to waste it on hating."
- **5.** If you are angry about injustice, remember to use your anger constructively: Rabbi Pinhas once said to his student: "If a man wishes to guide the people in his house the right way, he must not grow angry at them. For anger does not only make one's soul impure; it transfers impurity to the souls of those with whom one is angry." Another time he said: "Since I have tamed my anger, I keep it in my pocket. When I need it, I take it out." **Buber, Tales of the Hasidim, 128**

I am looking forward to seeing each of you in a few weeks as we honor the life and legacy of Dr. King. As we gather together on that day, may the texts of our tradition, coupled with our relationships with our neighbors, inspire us to continue working each and every day toward a world that is just, equitable, and free from hatred, bigotry, and racism of all kinds. May God give us the strength to live out these values each and every day as we strive to create a world that is filled with love, healing, and wholeness for all of God's creatures. Happy New Year to all!

The Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. event at Torat El this year takes a new path in honoring the life and values of Dr. King and his call for brotherhood in a truly united America where the content of character is the measure of each individual. This year the event moves to our Social Hall where 250 guests will experience dinner together, enjoy the program presented from the stage and discuss at each table a specific topic drawn from the principles advanced in Dr. King's teachings.

The goal is to get beyond the surface of our presentation, and to listen, talk and understand real view-points and experiences as we implement our values and learn that they are truly shared across all races, traditions and ethnicities. The choirs will be with us together with presentations addressing Dr. King, and updates on the progress being achieved in the Asbury Park School District as concepts presented in last year's event are being set in place. The thoughts and interactions gained from our dinner discussions will also be presented.

The event including dinner will be held without charge, but it is essential to sign up promptly at the congregation office since attendance will be limited by our ability to seat a maximum of 250 guests for dinner. The traditional concepts and entertaining features associated with the Dr. King event will all be there, but presented within a new venue and format. We look forward to your attendance and participation.

PROF. CARL AND SANDRA KOREEN AND FAMILY LIBRARY DEDICATION

Carl and Sandra Koreen have been continuous members of our heritage synagogue for some 40 years. Their family has celebrated many life cycle events here -- births, Bar and Bat Mitzvahs, graduations, baby naming-- as evidenced by the many leaf plaques on the walls. In addition, Carl is a past and present member of the Board of Trustees.

The Koreens have three married children who are all similarly involved in their respective Conservative Synagogues. Ann is a high school science teacher; and Larry and Susan, together with their spouses, are all MD certified ophthalmologist surgeons. They have eight grandchildren ranging from 6 months to 12 years old.

In honor of their 45th wedding anniversary, the Koreen family made a generous gift to the synagogue with the stipulation that the money be used for the direct benefit of the Library and that the Library be named the **Prof. Carl and Sandra Koreen and Family Library.**

Why did they choose the synagogue and the library? The Koreen family has always loved books. Sandra has a Master's Degree in Library Science and worked for 37 happy years as a certified public school librarian in New York City and then in New Jersey. When she retired, she volunteered organizing the Temple Beth El Library for several years. Now she is working with the Congregation Torat El Library Committee with Beth Jacob and Madeline Schulman to modernize and streamline the library.

Carl was born in Baghdad and graduated #1 in the entire country in the Government College Entrance Examinations before being permitted by the Iraqi government, that was then persecuting the Jews severely, to leave the country to study at Columbia University. Carl's love for learning has taken him to study science and the mathematical sciences, and he has taught about 40 years as a Prof. of Mathematics at Monmouth University. In addition, he was in charge of procuring mathematics books for his Department Library for many years. The Koreens' roots are steeped in Judaism. Sandra's grandfather was a Rabbi in Lithuania. Carl has a great many immediate relatives in Israel, as well as numerous relatives who have served in the Israeli Armed Forces. His uncle, Dr. Ezra Korin, is an Israel Prize laureate.

The Koreens hope that their donation will inspire their children, grandchildren, and members of our congregation to follow in their footsteps to make our community and the world a better place.

Congregants are invited to join the Koreens and their family in dedication of the library on January 28 during Shabbat Services. Lunch will follow. Also, everyone is invited to visit the Library after lunch and borrow a book and audiovisual materials using our new Shabbat borrowing books system. Come and join the Koreens in celebrating this happy occasion for our synagogue.






