ACTING AS A WELCOMING COMMUNITY

Do you remember your first day of kindergarten? If that's too far back, what about your first day of high school or college? Do you remember the first day of your current job, the first time that you came into our synagogue, or when you first moved into your neighborhood? Each of these moments probably came with a certain degree of nervousness. Will I know where to find everything? What will my teacher be like? What will the other kids in the class be like? Will my colleagues at work like me? Am I dressed appropriately? Will there be anyone here who will befriend me? What kind of a new place have I entered?



When a rabbi enters a new congregation, they often do so with some of these very same anxieties. I can remember when we first came to Torat El four years ago. We did not know anyone except for the few people involved in the search process. We did not know where to go grocery shopping, or where to get the basic necessities to set up the house. We did not know where to find a bank, dry cleaning, or a vet for our dog. We didn't know many people's names -- despite the fact that it seemed as if almost everyone knew our names. Our entry into Ocean Township was challenging at first. Fortunately, in keeping with the mitzvah of *hachnasat orchim*, welcoming in guests, the synagogue had arranged a number of "meet and greets" for us during the first few months of our arrival. I cannot tell you how important these gatherings were to us. They made us feel welcome, cared for, and at home in our new surroundings. Even more important than these "planned events" were the few individuals who spontaneously came up to us to make us feel welcome and offered to help us as we adjusted to life in our new home of Ocean Township.

For some people, reaching out to a rabbinic family can be challenging. In part, this is because some individuals find it generally difficult to reach out to people that they do not know very well. And in part, this is because some people get nervous about reaching out to "the rabbi" and his or her family: "If I invite them over, will they eat in our home?" "If I invite them out to eat, will they eat in a non-kosher restaurant?" (The answer for us, by the way, is yes to both.) We even had some people over the past few years who nervously asked us if we would join them at their beach club; they weren't sure that rabbis went to the beach.

I bring all of this up because as you are reading this, Rabbi Sara Metz, her husband Lev, and their son Doron will be joining our community. Our Torat El values statement says that *hachnasat orchim*, welcoming in guests, is one of the most important values of our community. We will be having formal "meet and greets" during this transition period. But whether or not you are involved in that process, please make every effort to introduce yourself to the Metz family as they join our Torat El community. Invite them to your beach club, ask them over for meals, and make them feel welcome, loved, and cared for.

Incidentally, this advice is not reserved for new rabbis who are coming into our community. When was the last time that you had someone from the synagogue, who you *do not know* that well, over at your home? When was the last time that you thought about inviting them out for a meal, or for a social outing? The summer is a great time to start!

Can we have too much community?

For many of us summer provides an opportunity to enjoy the fact that we live near the ocean. For more than 150 years families and friends have gathered to relax, swim, sunbathe, converse, and re-connect. Over the next months, we will be welcoming Rabbi Metz, her husband Lev, and their son Doron. Ben Laskowitz, our new Director of Ritual Engagement, will be leading classes on Torah trope. On July 18 and August 15, we will have our annual Shabbat at the Beach services and on August 1, we will have our annual Shabbat Barbecue. Of course, we will have our daily minyanim and weekly Shabbat services. All of these events are opportunities to enjoy and increase our feeling of community.

Join us as we continue to build relationships together. I look forward to seeing you over the summer.



My Dear Friends,


I've never been able to say goodbye with any measure of grace or ease, and I doubt this note will break that pattern.

The stunning necklace will keep this Sisterhood close to my heart, and the distinctive Tree of Life sculpture will take a position of honor in our new home.






