Celebrating a Bar or Bat Mitzvah- It's Never Too late!

There is a story told in the Talmud of the great Rabbi Akiva, who did not begin his learning until he was 40 years old—a ripe old age in the rabbinic period. It is said that:

Rabbi Akiva was a shepherd of Ben Kalba Sabua. The latter's daughter seeing how modest and noble [the shepherd] was, said to him, 'Were I to be betrothed to you, would you go away to [study at] an academy?' 'Yes', he replied. She was then secretly betrothed to him and sent him away. When her father heard [what she had done] he drove her from his house and forbade her by a vow to have any benefit from his estate. [R. Akiva] departed, and spent twelve years at the academy. When he returned home he brought with him twelve thousand disciples. [While in his hometown] he heard an old man saying to her, 'How long will you lead the life of a living widowhood?' 'If he would listen to me,' she replied, 'he would spend [in study] another twelve years'. Said [Rabbi Akiva]: 'It is then with her consent that I am acting' and he departed again and spent another twelve years at the academy. When he finally returned he brought with him twentyfour thousand disciples. His wife heard [of his arrival] and went out to meet him, when her neighbors said to her, 'Borrow some respectable clothes and put them on', but she replied: A righteous man regards the life of his beast. On approaching him she fell upon her face and kissed his feet. His attendants were about to thrust her aside, when [Rabbi Akiva] cried to them, 'Leave her alone, mine and yours are hers'. Her father, on hearing that a great man had come to the town, said, 'I shall go to him; perchance he will invalidate my vow', When he came to him [Rabbi Akiva] asked, 'Would you have made your vow if you had known that he was a great man?' '[Had he known]' the other replied, 'even one chapter or even one single halachah (matter of law) I would not have made the vow'. He then said to him, 'I am the man'. The other fell upon his face and kissed his feet and also gave him half of his wealth. Babylonian Talmud Ketubot 62b-63a

The lesson is simple. It is never too late to learn. This is a central principle in what it means to be a student of Torah. Even one of our greatest scholars and teachers was a second-career student! If you were not blessed to have rigorous, thoughtful, and serious Jewish education early on in life, there is always time to try again and to bring the wisdom and depth of Judaism into your life today.

This brings me to the topic of those who never had a chance to celebrate a bar or bat mitzvah, or paid little attention during the process. This year, I will be teaching an adult bnei mitzvah class to all who wish to spend some serious time engaged in study—culminating in the celebration of this study with an adult bnei mitzvah around the Festival of Shavuot. The curriculum will consist of topics including, but not limited to, God, Jewish prayer, ritual, lifecycle, holidays, Jewish values and Jewish history, Hebrew reading, as well as learning to chant Torah and Haftorah. Details and a schedule of dates will be forthcoming in the coming months, but I encourage you to consider this unique opportunity. While you may not end up as scholarly as Rabbi Akiva, the wisdom, depth, beauty, and relevance that you will uncover or re-discover about your heritage will be well worth the effort!

A SENSE OF BELONGING

As I stood among 50 others at a recent shiva minyan, I was struck by a sense of community that I had not felt before. Working in a synagogue for more than 20 years (10 here and 10 elsewhere) and belonging to a synagogue in my own youth has never put community in this exact context.

Yet here I was at a home, filled with Jews standing shoulder to shoulder reciting the blessings of our people. And these people – many I knew, others I didn't – all came together for this family. To show respect for the deceased and support for the living. To come together, as our rabbi so often says, as a holy community, to be one.

As I looked around the room, I did a quick count in my head... some were from heritage Congregation B'nai Sholom, others from heritage Temple Beth El, others from heritage Temple Beth Torah – all of us now Congregation Torat El, and still others from our neighbor, Temple Beth Miriam. No rabbis present... we were on our own, lay leaders of every generation.

Every shiva notice we send from the office announces the sad news of a loved one's passing. But it also affords us the opportunity to be a part of something so much bigger than the grief. When family, friends and neighbors come together for shiva, we are, in effect, demonstrating to the world that despite the difficulties in life, we remain strong and united.

This scenario probably plays out every evening in living rooms across our area. I just happened to be at this particular home on this particular night, and had a sense of belonging in a way I hope for all of you in our CTE family.


