

From The Rabbi's Study...

Honoring The Past And Looking Toward **Our Future**



As I write these words, surrounded by boxes,

bubble wrap & packing tape, I am filled with excitement about joining our new Torat El family. It has been nearly five months since Jane-Rachel and I first visited Congregation Torat El, but the warmth and kindness of the people that we met that weekend, and the tremendous potential that we saw for building upon the past and creating an incredible future remain with us as we prepare to arrive in our new community.

The timing of my transition is occurring at an interesting moment in the Jewish calendar. Shortly before I arrive, we will all commemorate Tisha B'av, a day designated for mourning the destruction of the Temples and many other terrible moments of Jewish history. On Tisha B'Av we are to spend the day reflecting on what we as a people have lost as a part of understanding where we have come from and where we are going.

The Talmud is clear, however, that too much mourning is not healthy (Baba Batra, 60b). We are encouraged to remember the First and Second Temples as they were, but then we must begin to look forward. This emphasis on looking forward is why on Tisha B'av we often hear the story of Rabbi Yochanan ben Zakkai who famously snuck out of Jerusalem to establish the city of Yavneh. In the midst of destruction, Yochanan Ben Zakkai's forethought and bravery forever changed the nature of Judaism from a Temple-centered religion to one based on living a life of Torah.

As we transition out of the month of Av into the month of Elul, we launch fully into the theme of looking forward. Elul is understood to be the quintessential Jewish month of renewal and rededication, the month that reminds us that change is not only possible, it has the potential to be transformative.

There are some nice parallels we can draw between this season and the current state of Congregation Torat El. Understandably, many members of our community have experienced a period of mourning over the loss of Temple Beth Torah and Temple Beth El. That is only natural as all loss is difficult, painful, and takes time to process. As I enter into the Torat El family, I recognize this loss, and hope to build upon the healing work that has already begun by listening to your stories, individually and collectively, and working together to honor them as a part of the history of Congregation Torat El.

But at the same time, the rabbis were correct to point out that too much mourning can be harmful. Like Rabbi Yochanan before us, we must realize the great transformative potential that exists in times of transition. We must seize this moment to focus on building and sustaining a vibrant, dynamic, relevant, purposeful and holy community.

As the month of Elul approaches, we recreate and rededicate ourselves to our core beliefs and values. So too will we spend the coming years working together to connect with the core beliefs, practices, and values that make up Congregation Torat El.

The task in front of us is incredibly exciting and potentially transformative. But just like the self-introspection involved in preparing for the High Holidays, it will take an incredible amount of work.

I know that we are all up to the task as we seek to make this transition from the memory of what was, to the celebration of what is and what we will create together. I am confident that working in partnership, our congregation and the greater community will be transformed as the story of Torat El continues to unfold.

Upon my arrival there will be a number of meetings set up for us to begin getting to know one another. If you cannot make one of those meetings, please feel free to stop by, call, or e-mail me to introduce yourself. Jane-Rachel and I are looking forward to meeting as many people as possible when we arrive in our new home. I am humbled, honored, and thrilled to have the opportunity to join your community as Torat El's first rabbi, and I am eager to begin the work of creating kehillah kedosha, holy community, together.

CANTOR'S NOTES

All God's critters have a place in the choir; Some sing lower and some sing higher. Some sing out loud on a telephone wire. Some just clap their hands or paws or anything they got."

That's the refrain of a song by Bill Staines. It describes, as eloquently as anything from the psalms, my feeling about the need that we, God's critters, have for music and that God has for our song. Imagine, if you would, a synagogue service with no song. We would mutter in Hebrew or in English. We would read responsively or silently. We might even listen to an instrument, a guitar or an organ. Without human voices, without song, our prayers are incomplete.

Notice that the lyrics don't say anything about the quality of the voices; it says we all have one. There may be soloists, but we can all make up the choir. The art of singing is in the doing, not in the contemplating, not in the analyzing. When we sing, we add to the perfection of the whole. And it is worth noting that singing is both an art form and a physical endeavor — you use your whole body, not just the two little rubber bands in your throat.

"Kol ha-neshama tehallel Yah! Halleluyah! Everything that breathes sings praise to God! Halleluyah! Recently one of my students asked me, "Cantor Lane, what were you before you were a cantor?" I rattled off the "Hillel" version of my resume (on one foot): "Actress, storyteller, PR assistant, arts-in-education administrator, arts-in-education evaluator, literacy training director, youth volunteer director, student cantor, student rabbi, cantor."

"Cantor Lane, what are you going to be next?" What a good question. Of course, no one can be absolutely sure of the future. If we could, insurance companies would go out of business. We only can be sure that the world is changing. It was true for our ancestors, and it remains true for us. "Change," as Chief Justice Oliver Wendell Holmes wrote, "is the law of life. And the life of the law." Nothing stays the same. It's good to remember that.

I was so bowled over by the turnout and the beauty of the service on June 12th that I wanted to thank everyone for all your kindnesses over the years. And I wanted to let you in on a secret. The quotation that was chosen for my beautiful lithograph is especially meaningful to me. It comes from the story of the prophet Elijah; not the cuddley, Passover-guest Elijah, but the firebrand, danger-seeking young Elijah, the one who put the prophets of Ba'al to the sword. When he flees into the wilderness, seeking — no, **demanding** God's protection, God tells him to stand in the cleft of the mountain. Then a rushing wind roars by, then earthquake, then fire. But God is not in any of these monumental forces of nature. "Then after the fire, a still small voice was heard." (I Kings 19:12)

It's a great story, and I've always loved it because of a trick of the calendar. This section is part of the *haftarah* for Parsha Pinchas, but it's almost never read on that Shabbat. Because of the vaguaries of the Hebrew calendar, and the need to get in three "*haftarot* of rebuke" before Tisha B'Av, this *haftara* is almost always passed over, and instead we read the next one, the *haftarah* for the next parsha. And Parsha Pinchas is my birthday *parsha*. So, when I was Bat Mitzvah, I didn't get the chance to read the *haftara* that was designated. Since then I have studied and loved this story, and everytime the calendar permits, I have taken the opportunity to chant it. No one on the committee that chose that verse could have known how much it means to me!

For all of you, you who have been my students and teachers for the past five years, I have a prayer: May each of you discover the pleasures of change. May each soul find his or her own voice. May the still, small voice, the sound of God speaking in the depths of your heart, move you to praise. *Kol ha-neshamah tehallel Yah!*

Halleluyah!

Don't Let This Gift Certificate Expire

Have you ever been given a gift certificate or a coupon that you hold onto for so long that by the time you remember to use it, you find it has expired? And, just your luck, it happens right after the expiration date! Perhaps you're standing in line about to pay for the towels with that discount coupon, or about to get into the zoo or the movies using those passes that you have been holding onto forever—only to realize that they expired just last month!

A similar phenomenon happens each year with the month of Elul. Each year, our tradition gives us an incredible gift certificate redeemable for an entire month of reflecting upon our successes and challenges as individuals and focusing on what we can do to bring more meaning, purpose, and holiness into our daily lives. But this special one-month offer comes to an end at the High Holidays of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. The challenge is not letting these days slip by, not letting our gift expire.

In his wonderful book entitled, <u>Days of Awe</u>, S.Y. Agnon tells the following story from Rabbi Hayyim of Zans to illustrate the point:

There was once a poor countrywoman who had many children. They were always begging for food, but she had none to give them. One day she found an egg.

She called her children and said: "Children, children we've nothing to worry about any more; I've found an egg. And, being a provident woman, I'll not eat the egg, but shall ask my neighbor for permission to set it under her setting hen, until a chick is hatched. For I am a provident woman! And we'll not eat the chick, but will set her on eggs, and the eggs will hatch into chickens. And the chickens in their turn will hatch many eggs, and we'll have many chickens and many eggs. But I'm a provident woman, I am! I'll not eat the chickens and not eat the eggs, but shall sell them and buy me a heifer. And I'll not eat the heifer, but shall raise it to a cow, and not eat the cow until it calves. For I'm a provident woman! And I'll sell the cows and the calves and buy a field, and we'll have fields and cows and calves, and we won't need anything anymore!

The countrywoman was speaking in this fashion and playing with the egg, when it fell out of her hands and broke.

Said our master, "That is how we are. When the Holy Days arrive, every person resolves to do Teshuvah, thinking in his heart, I'll do this and I'll do that.' But the days slip by in mere deliberation, and thought doesn't lead to action..."

So how can we avoid missing this golden opportunity? How can we avoid a situation where we are standing in Synagogue at the end of Yom Kippur, listening to the shofar blast, only to realize that we missed out on this extraordinary offer? Our gift certificate has expired! Our egg has broken!

The solution is simple, though the process can be challenging. Despite our busy lives and overloaded schedules, we *must* make the time during these coming days and weeks ahead to take the process of Elul seriously. It is in that spirit that I would like to share with you the following questions about the past year as one way to help you get started:

What brought me the most joy this year?
What brought me the most pain?
What do I regret not doing this year?
Who did I hurt, and how can I make up for what I have done?
Who do I need to forgive and how can I go about forgiving them?
What are the most important relationships in my life and how can I nurture them in the coming year?
What was a Jewish high point for me this year? What was a Jewish low point?
What was my relationship with God like this year?
How did Judaism affect my life this year? Am I satisfied with Judaism's role in my life?
What are my goals in life and what I am I doing to achieve them?
Where do I see myself in five years, ten years, or twenty years?
If I could change one thing about myself, what would it be?

I invite you to take these questions seriously, creating some time in the coming days to sit down with a pen and paper and actually answer them. Bring them with you to synagogue to remind you of what you are trying to accomplish during these Yamim Noraim, Awesome Days. Engaging in this process of *teshuvah*, literally turning towards yourself, your fellow human beings, and God, is the key to bringing holiness, and wholeness into your life. If it is done honestly, this process will give you deep insight into who you are, where you have been during this past year, and where you would like to be going.

Shanah Tovah U'metukah. May each of you have a good and sweet New Year.

CONGREGATION TORAT EL RITUAL COMMITTEE

The High Holy days are fast approaching. The first day of Rosh Hashanah is Thursday, September 9th, the 2nd day is September 10th, and Yom Kippur is on Shabbat, September 18th. The Congregation Torat El Ritual Committee has been meeting over the past few months to discuss our plans to best meet the needs of our congregants for the High Holy Days of 5771. Our plans are quickly moving forward at this time. Some of the items we've dealt with are as follows:

- 1. All honors will be assigned in alphabetical order utilizing our membership list starting with A. Those of you offered an honor will be contacted via a personal phone call from a member of the committee. If, for one reason or another, you are unable to accept the offered honor, please discuss the situation with the person calling you. An alternate honor will be offered if available.
- 2. A limited number of reserved seats will be sold on a first come, first served basis. Watch your mail for additional information on cost, location and reservation procedures. No reservations or monies will be accepted prior to the mailing of the information.
- 3. High Holy Day services will be held at our Monmouth Road location.
- 4. All Memorial Boards currently in the Main Sanctuary and the Furie Chapel at the Roseld Ave site will be displayed at the Monmouth Road location in time for the High Holy Days.
- 5. We expect a very large crowd for services and ask your cooperation in holding seats. Please do not hold seats that might not be taken.
- 6. Since we will be setting up more seats in the Social Hall than in previous years, some seats will not have a direct line of site view of the Bimah. To allow everyone to see the service we will be looking into the possibility of having video monitors installed showing the Bimah from a camera installed in the Sanctuary. The video will not be recorded and the camera will not be operated (zoom, or panning of the Bimah). By not having a person controlling the camera, we will be observing the appropriate religious tenets; the video feed is considered in the same spirit as the use of the sound system, air conditioning, or lights. These are all devices used to enhance our religious experience, allowing everyone to participate fully.


The Yizkor book is being retitled "The Book of Life & Remembrance". Again, watch your mail for information on including the names of your loved ones you wish to remember.
