Come On In, The Water Is Great!



It's that time of year again — summer on the Jersey Shore: a time to relax, enjoy the beautiful neighborhood in which we are all so blessed to live, and perhaps take a few moments to reflect on this past year as we sit on the beach and take in some sun. It is often during the summer that I am able to find a few precious moments to take a break from the busy pace of our synagogue calendar year in order to gain a bit of perspective on the year that has passed and consider some of the exciting opportunities that we have planned for the coming year. This summer, I would like to invite each of you to partner with me in this type of thinking — taking a few moments to review this past year in our synagogue and consider your relationship and sense of connection to your Congregation Torat El family. What programs did you attend this past year? What classes,

services, lectures, holiday celebrations, or synagogue outings did you attend this year? Which ones did you hope to attend until "life got in the way," as it tends to do? What programs, activities, or innovations did you see at other synagogues that you would like us to consider implementing in our community? And perhaps most importantly, how might you like to be involved this coming year, as we enter our tenth year as Congregation Torat El?

As I take a few moments to reflect back on this year, here are SOME of the highlights that immediately come to mind.

- ♦Our Meet The Author series continued going strong, as we welcomed a variety of authors into our community throughout the year.
- •Our adult education opportunities continued as we studied ethical implications of the weekly Torah portion, learned about the history of modern Israel through poetry, music, and media, and made time to learn how we might strengthen our character and nourish our soul through the study of Mussar.
- ◆In conjunction with the Monmouth County Mental Health Association, and a number of our members, we held an informative and engaging series on the importance of talking about mental health and supporting all who are struggling with this issue.
- •We were blessed to hear powerful stories from children of Holocaust survivors in an incredible discussion about the importance of memory, and how we might use the power of memory to curb the forces of ant-Semitism that continue through today.
- •Our Sisterhood, Men's Club and Hazak groups continued to create a wide offering of social and educational programs for our members to enjoy from baking Hamantaschen (over 5,000 of them) with all ages and stages of the congregation, to flipping and frying delicious latkes, and hosting a wonderful steak meal in the Sukkah, to taking a trip into NYC to see the new Holocaust exhibit at the Museum of Jewish Heritage.
- ♦ We celebrated the life and legacy of Martin Luther King, Jr. with the greater community during our annual spirited and inspirational commemoration.
- ♦ We held a weekly beginners Hebrew class, taught by one of our members, to help all who struggle with Hebrew, and those who are simply interested in working on their Hebrew skills.
- ♦ We had a lively and hilarious comedy night around Purim when we gathered together to share an evening of laughter and fun.
- ♦ We gathered together for countless bnei mitzvah, various anniversary celebrations, and proudly watched as our Rabbinic Intern, Warner Ferratier became a rabbi. (And, on a personal note, I was privileged to officiate at his wedding to his husband Luis the day after ordination!)
- ♦ We gathered to support one another during times of loss, coming to one another's home for shiva minyanim, bringing food, ritual resources, and most importantly our presence for one another.
- •We gathered each Shabbat, to take a break from the hectic week, pray together, learn together, and celebrate each week with our wonderful religious school students who add even more life, laughter, and spirit to our weekly Shabbat celebrations. And we thank and acknowledge those who "sponsored" 15 beautiful Kiddush Luncheons in honor of their special occasions.

These are just a few of the highlights from this past year. As I think back on all of our successes, there is much more that I could list and it is clear that we have much to be proud of as a congregation. As we enter into "summer mode," I invite you to look for a number of additional events this summer as well. Read this bulletin carefully and look out for emails detailing some new summer programming. And as you take a few moments to relax on the beach, ask yourself how you might like to become more involved as the New Year comes around. "Come on in, (as we say), the water is great!" We would love to have you join us as we swim into a new season together.

We Are Going to be Lucky by Leo Miller (940.54 Mi). A first generation Jewish American couple separated by World War II, Lenny and Diana Miller vowed to write to each other daily after Lenny enlisted in 1943. Lenny's crucial missions as an Army scout and Diana's work in the Brooklyn Navy Yard are the backgrounds in their daily correspondence, including discussions about democracy, politics, and economic hardships. Beautifully written.



<u>The Land of Truth: Talmud Tales, Timeless Teachings</u> by renowned scholar Jeffrey L. Rubenstein (296.19Ru), retells and explicates Talmud stories for the modern reader. Full of fascinating insights.

<u>Auschwitz Not long ago. Not far away</u> is edited by Robert Jan van Pelt (940.54 Pe) and is an extraordinary catalog of the current exhibit in New York City at the Museum of Jewish Heritage — a Living Memorial to the Holocaust. This book is a collection of the first-ever traveling exhibit about Auschwitz where 1.1 million people were killed. It is a combination of photographs, stories, and historical background and "is an essential volume for everyone who is interested in history and its lessons." Exhibit will be in the Museum until January 3 and features 700 original objects and 400 photographs.






