From The Rabbi's Study

Another Year, Another Opportunity



You might be thinking to yourself: *Is it time for an article about the upcoming High Holidays already- It's only July?!* While that might be true, it is important to remember that this year Hanukkah and Thanksgiving occur at the same time, and Rosh Hashanah is only two days after labor day.

We often describe the High Holidays as arriving either "early or late," but the truth is that these holidays fall on the same date each year. Rosh Hashanah always falls on the first and second day of the Hebrew Month of Tishrei, followed by Yom Kippur on the tenth, Sukkot on the fifteenth, and Shemini/Atzeret/Simchat Torah on the twenty second and twenty third. The more important question is not one of timing, but one of preparedness. *The holidays will arrive on time. Will you be ready?*

By now you know that each year I enjoy giving you some questions to think about to prepare you for the spiritual work of the upcoming holidays. And it is work. Just like any discipline, you will only get something out of your High Holiday experience (and your Judaism in general) if you are willing to put something into it. So whether you are at the beach, or sitting by the pool, at work, or at home this summer, I encourage you to carve out a set amount of time each week to think about the following questions.

1. What were your goals for this past year and did you achieve them? How did you spend your time? (Go back through your phone, and paper calendar to check how you actually spent your time.)
2. What were your financial priorities this past year and were they in line with your values? (Go back through your checkbook, online records, etc....)
3. What relationship in your life needs work today and how might you begin to address that challenge?
4. Have any close friends or relatives in your life died this past year and what do you wish you could tell them right now?
5. How much time did you make for your Judaism this past year and what was the effect on your spiritual life? Where do you stand with God today and what do you want to share with God on these upcoming holidays?
6. What blessings occurred in your life this year and who did you thank for these blessings? What did you do for those who are less fortunate than you during this past year?

It is my hope that these questions will begin to get you in the right frame of mind as the New Year begins. When you have answered all of these questions- go back and look at your answers. And then, based on your answers, ask yourself one more question: *What will I do differently this year?*

Jane-Rachel and I wish you all a *Shanah Tovah U'metukah*. May you have a sweet New Year and may you be inscribed in the Book of Life.

I look forward to seeing you soon!

President's Message

Summer is a time to relax and regroup. Before we know it the High Holy Days will be here. The approach of the High Holy Days provides an opportunity for us to reflect on where we have been, who we are, and where we are going. The concept of reflection applies to us as individuals as we try to stay true to ourselves, our values, and our beliefs. That concept is not limited to our individual reflection but also to us as a community.

As Congregation Torat El enters its fourth year, great strides have been made to create a new Kehillah Kedoshah, a holy community. Our Congregation has just completed a major effort to reflect on our identity, values, opportunities, and challenges. We established goals that are specific and verifiable. Having done so, we now have a set of priorities to fulfill our congregation's mission as a "Community Building Relationships".

Our recently adopted Strategic Plan includes a detailed analysis of our strengths and weaknesses in the context of the changing paradigms facing all of Congregational Judaism. The strategic planning process confirmed what many of us had already suspected and what many of the leading authorities had already identified -- if congregations are to continue into the future, they must adapt to a world in which their members have virtually unlimited options to explore their Judaism and develop relationships. The model of a successful synagogue is changing and we must adapt to remain viable.

The key to building and maintaining a sustainable congregation in the 21st century is to expand our "points of entry" for our relationships with Judaism and with our community. To succeed, Congregation Torat El needs to provide multiple opportunities in varied locations and formats so that each congregant can find and explore the paths that work best for them. We must be willing and able to welcome people where they are -- spiritually, intellectually, and physically. Programs must be tailored in a way that fosters our ability to build relationships -- as set forth in our Mission Statement -- "relationships with God, with Judaism and with each other". Our new Strategic Plan provides a focus for our next steps forward. Please take the time to review the plan on our website in the coming weeks.

Understanding the direction we must take is only the first step. We are now moving forward to achieve the goals we have set. One of the first tasks is to review how our staffing structure can meet our needs while still working within our budget. Our Staffing Steering Committee, led by Vice-President Michelle Winters, has identified a template for our staffing structure to be put in place after Cantor Siegel retires next summer after his long and wonderful tenure with us. One key element of that template is the creation of three new positions:

(1) a full-time Assistant Rabbi/Educator who will focus on education at all age levels (from our Religious School to Family Education to Adult Education) while supporting Rabbi Schonbrun to meet our congregation's pastoral and prayer service needs;

(2) a Director of Synagogue Engagement (which can be a full-time or 3/4-time position) who will focus on volunteerism and invigorating our programs and our outreach and in-reach efforts; and

(3) a part-time Communications Director who will be tasked with improving our visual and virtual footprints.

As we identify the particular individuals for these positions, we will rearrange our current staffing responsibilities to make certain we continue to provide the range of services and programs our Congregation currently enjoys. In that context, I want to extend a personal thanks to Cantor Siegel and our Educational Director Ben Laskowitz for their continued support as we assess our staffing needs and plans.

In the days and weeks to come, I will continue to work with our staff and our lay leadership to keep our Congregation informed of our efforts. This summer we will be forming a search committee for the Assistant Rabbi/Educator role followed later by a search for a Director of Synagogue Engagement this winter. We have a fantastic staff led by Rabbi Schonbrun, Cantor Siegel, our Executive Director Pam Cardullo, and our Education Director Ben Laskowitz. Our lay leadership, starting with our committees and leading to our Board of Trustees, is comprised of wonderful individuals who continue to commit their hearts and souls (and many hours) to the health and future of our Congregation. Working together, we have tremendous potential as we move forward into the New Year and then into the future.

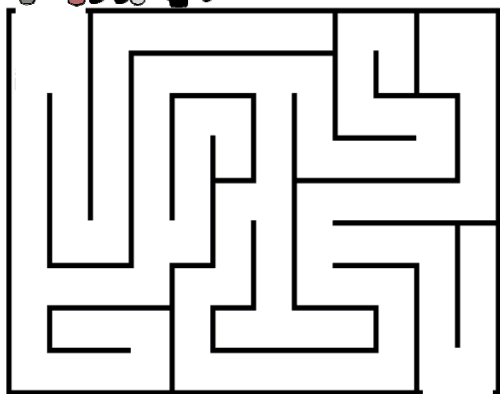
