

# Building Relationships, Learning As A Community

Clergy transitions can be incredibly difficult, but when done well, they can also be very meaningful and important in the life of a sacred community. In a few days we will spend the morning celebrating and honoring Cantor Bruce and Anne Siegel for all that they have brought to our congregation over these past 14 years. For those who are unable to attend, below is the letter that I wrote to Cantor Siegel for inclusion in the ad journal/tribute book upon his retirement. I will be making separate remarks on the morning of the brunch.





#### Bruce,

It is hard to know where to begin thanking you for all that you have brought into the life of our congregation, and for the friendship, support, and kindness that you have shown me and our family during these past four years. In thinking about a particular piece of text that would give meaning to this moment in your life and in the life of our congregation, I repeatedly found myself back at *parshat Beshalach* (Exodus 15) and the Song of the Sea. Looking through the words and hearing your chanting of our most ancient Torah melody, I found two lessons appropriate to this moment and to you as a Hazan, a teacher, a student of Torah, and a lover of grammar!

In looking at the very first phrase in the song *Az Yashir Moshe*, "Then Moses and the Israelites sang," the commentators are troubled by what exactly the word "then" is modifying, and how the literal meaning of the phrase ("Then Moses *will* sing") makes any sense. The Hassidic Rabbi David Kotzk, taught that our text is phrased in such a way because the angels wanted to be the first ones to sing songs of praise to God after the Israelites crossed through the sea. God told the angels to *wait and let Israel sing first because human beings are only able to praise when they are inspired*. Bruce, you have inspired our congregation to sing praises to God for these past 14 years under your leadership as our Hazan. Whether on the High Holidays, at bnei mitzvah, on a regular Shabbat, or through your teaching, and pastoral care, you have continually helped us to discover and praise Adonai through your leadership and example.

The Mekhiltah also points out that throughout the Hebrew Bible, the word "then" can sometimes refer to the past and sometimes refer to the future. In other words, our text teaches that song can only be brought into our life when we are able to look back at our past, even as we envision our future. Bruce, as you look back on your years at Congregation Torat El, please know that you have brought so much richness and music into the lives of Torat El family, and know that all of us here wish you and Anne a bright, meaningful, (and relaxing) future!

On a personal note, Jane-Rachel, Aviva, Gavriel, Leora and I will always cherish the meals, magic tricks, and memories of the past few years. I cannot thank you enough for your advice and generosity during this time.

*Hazak, Hazak, v'nithazek-* may you continue to grow from strength to strength, knowing that all of us have been strengthened thanks to your presence in our lives!



# A Message From Andrew Robins, CTE President

Milestones -- a time to take stock

By the time you read this I will be marking some milestones – I will be beginning my second year as your President, passing another birthday, moving our two youngest back from their respective colleges, and marking the ninth year since my father's passing. For me these are all significant milestones and like most milestones, each presents an opportunity to reflect and take stock. We report regularly to the Congregation and publicize our plans to meet those goals. Second, when we make a change it is for a reason that is tied to our Strategic Plan and our values. Policy is developed through discussion as to how best meet our goals consistent with our values. Third, we work to encourage engagement. We consistently strive to increase each congregant's participation in our Congregation's work. Committees are open to new members, we continue to increase opportunities for input and discussion, and our leadership is available for your feedback, suggestions, and inquiries.

Our world is evolving and the needs of our people are changing. We must change if we are to continue to sustain our Congregation. But true to the fundamental precepts of Conservative Judaism, we work hard to change when change is truly needed and consistent with our goals and not for the sake of change itself.

So, where are we? We are on the way to achieving our goals. Each week, each month, you can see some of the fruits of our collective labors. Participation is on the rise in virtually every facet of our Congregation -- attendance in services, participation in youth programming and education, support of our congregants during difficult times, adult education, outreach to the unaffiliated, and engagement in our committees and programs. The main ingredient in all of our work is for each of us to do what we can to strengthen our connections -- our relationships. Your engagement is the key. Come and participate. If you have ideas, share them with us. We are here. Our leadership and our staff will continue to work hard to reach out to you -- but you do not need to wait for us to come to you. Torat El is our Congregation and all of us are needed to make it work and move forward.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, our Clergy, and our staff, we are looking forward to seeing you, working with you, and fostering relationships.

the inspiration for two books: The Fault in Our Stars by John Green, now being turned into a movie, and her own scrapbook-like biography of Esther, including her drawings, handwritten notes, a letter from one of her doctors, stories from her family, and diary entries. I talked to Esther's mother, Lori Earl, and told her that I wanted to do something to help raise money for other kids and to help keep the memory of Esther alive. I sold green and white bracelets that say "This Star Won't Go Out" across them. Being a part of something like this has been extraordinary and the opportunity to help other people in need is absolutely amazing. I loved every minute of helping this foundation and I certainly do not see myself stopping anytime soon.

# Sisterhood Year End Wrap Up

As we complete our Co-Presidency of CTE Sisterhood we would like to thank the dedicated and hardworking women of our organization. Because these very special women always step up to the plate and volunteer we would like you to know what they have provided for CTE this year.

In September we began our year with our new and very successful fundraiser of sending **Apples and Honey**. October brought many of our women volunteering on Mitzvah Day to help clean up at Camp Oakhurst. Our speaker for our Paid Up Brunch focused on breast cancer awareness and the following week some of our CTE Sisterhood members participated in the Breast Cancer Walk in Point Pleasant. As the weather began to change in November we prepared for our annual Rummage Sale. This is our biggest fundraiser which requires many hours of preparation and work by the committee. Then there are the many volunteers during the two-day sale that allow it to run smoothly. Within six days of the sale we were helping to prepare and serve food at the CTE Hanukkah Party. In December we held our **Torah Fund Supper** which benefits the Jewish Theological Seminary. Even though January brought us extremely cold temperatures outside, our women attended a **Luncheon Program** with interesting speakers. This past February our volunteers provided the congregation with a wonderful and delicious homemade **Shabbat Dinner** which was preceded by our Women's Shabbat Service. March approached quickly and our annual Hamantaschen Bake-A-Thon was upon us. With all of our volunteers, more than 3200 hamantaschen were baked in just less than five hours!! Along with the hamantaschen, more than 275 **Shalach Manot** packages were packaged and delivered to our congregants by our Sisterhood volunteers. You could also find these goodies at the Megillah Reading and Purim Carnival. Finally to complete the celebration of Purim, Sisterhood and Men's Club teamed up and hosted a very entertaining Murder Mystery Evening event. Once our Purim activities were completed, our day-long Mah Jongg Tournament took place. In April we had an **Evening Program** with a speaker and of course celebrated Passover with our popular Women's Seder. At the end of May we will be handing over the reins of running CTE Sisterhood to a new president and her board at our **Installation Dinner**.
