HEAD TO THE BEACH... AND WRITE A LETTER



In my basement I have a box filled with notes and letters from years gone by. I have thank you notes, birthday cards, and various letters written to me over the years. I have letters written to me by my mother z"l, and my siblings when I was a young child spending my summer at Camp Ramah in CA. I have letters written by my grandparents to my family members back home during a trip to Japan over 50 years ago. I even have letters written from my grandfather, to my father, long before I was born. Every so often I like to go down to the basement and look at these letters, hold them, read them, and honor the memories and values which they so powerfully bring to my soul. This is also true in my office where I have a large box of letters written to me by congregants over the years. Nestled atop my books, these letters are something that I treasure greatly.

It doesn't seem to me that people write letters very often these days. And while our communication is quite vast, and instantaneous – from email, to texting, tweeting, snap chatting, or posting on Instagram and Facebook – in truth these communications are not quite the same. The care, thought, and weight behind a hand-written letter does not usually translate to the virtual ways in which we regularly communicate today. A medium of communication that is incredible, and instantaneous on the one hand, yet so seemingly temporary and intangible on the other.

This past year I read a wonderful little book about the importance of writing letters by Rabbi Elana Zaiman entitled The Forever Letter. In it, she reminds the reader of the ancient Jewish practice of writing ethical wills – letters in which the author tries to communicate his or her values, and life wisdom to friends or members of his or her family. Throughout Jewish history we have examples of individuals who wanted to communicate their values to those in the next generation and accomplished this through the writing of "ethical wills." But writing a letter to friends, family, and loved ones is not simply about ensuring that your legacy lives on. It is also beneficial in other ways. Rabbi Zaiman explains that there are other benefits to our writing as well – including, but not limited to, learning to express in writing what we cannot speak, coming to understand ourselves and our relationships in a deeper way, making ourselves known, asking for forgiveness, clarifying our values, or living with greater intention (see introduction).

The summer is almost upon us. You may have some downtime to head to the beach, sit outside on the porch, or head to the boardwalk just to relax. As you take time to unwind from the year, relax, and begin to look forward to the New Year that will be upon us in September, I want to encourage you to consider taking time to write a letter. Who would you like to write to? What do you want to say? What do you need to say? Do you want to thank someone? Apologize to someone? Explain yourself to someone? Do you want to share a story with someone, your beliefs and values with someone, or a memory with someone? Do you want to write to your children, your grandchildren, your siblings, a long lost friend, your life partner? Take some time. Get a pen and a few pieces of paper and begin to write. One caveat -- I would avoid writing something that is hurtful. That is a larger topic than this article can cover here, but I would advise that the intention of this letter be to bring something new and positive to yourself and to the recipient of the letter.

If done well, I am confident that writing one, or multiple letters will be something that brings both you and the recipient much pleasure, meaning and joy as you create something on paper that will last for many generations to come. There is a reason that our tradition moved very early on from being an oral to a written tradition. We wanted to make sure that the wisdom of our sages lasted throughout the generations. Your wisdom is no less important. So take some time and begin composing. You owe it to yourself. You owe it to the recipient. And you owe it to the generations that will follow and want to know more about who you were and what you were all about. Write the letter. You will be glad that you did.

GLANCING BACKWARD AND LOOKING AHEAD BY WARNER FERRATIER, RABBINIC INTERN

It was almost exactly a year ago when I first interviewed with Rabbi Schonbrun to be his rabbinic intern and mentee. I knew from the moment the skype session was over that this was a community I wanted to be a part of. Congregation Torat El is a large enough community to have a lot of different things happening, small enough that people know each other, and far enough from Manhattan to avoid the pretensions that some big-city synagogues fall prey to. Rabbi Schonbrun was enthusiastic about hosting an intern, was open to my vision for the internship, but also full of ideas for how the experience could be good both for my own growth and for the Torat El community.

A year later, I am happy to say that Torat El and Rabbi Schonbrun have more than fulfilled my hopes for the internship experience. From the moment I set foot in the building, I have been made to feel like a long-time member of the community rather than a part-time intern. Whether I spend the day working in the synagogue office preparing to teach on Shabbat, or out making visits and attending meetings with Rabbi Schonbrun, everyone here has been welcoming and inviting. I am incredibly grateful for the openness community members, lay leaders, and staff members have shown in allowing me to be present and to observe and participate in the inner life of Congregation Torat El.

In my initial conversation with Rabbi Schonbrun, I said that one of my goals was to gain exposure to the parts of the rabbinate which I wouldn't learn in the classroom at the Jewish Theological Seminary. He more than delivered on my request! He made a point of including me in meetings with staff, with board members, with committees, and with individual congregants. He took me with him to observe life-cycle events, gave me opportunities to speak and teach, put me in touch with Ben Laskowitz so that I would have plenty of opportunities to brush up on Torah reading and service leading. I've been able to be a guest in the Ganon classroom, working with some of our youngest students. I've particularly enjoyed my opportunities to get to know community members at Shabbat lunch study sessions.

Through the entire experience I had the opportunity not only to observe and participate, but also to receive feedback and to practice self-reflection, drawing on the collective wisdom of the many wonderful people I have encountered from all parts of the community.

I was very excited, therefore, when I was offered the opportunity to continue growing into my rabbinic role next year at Torat El. While I will continue participating in Shabbat services on a monthly basis, my role during the week will change. Whereas this year, much of my work has been behind the scenes, next year, my role will be much more visible.

During the course of the year, I will be helping Congregation Torat El's efforts to make the world a better place by facilitating opportunities for involvement in Social Action. I hope to speak with those who are already involved in social action projects to find ways that the Torat El community can be supportive. I'd like to help build upon the successes of other programs, and get our teen and young adult members involved in Tikkun Olam. Plans are in the works for a kick-off event during Sukkot, so be on the lookout for more information!

Additionally, I will be working on programming for many of the holidays which don't always get as much attention. I'd like to build on the excellent foundation which already exists to make observances like Purim, Yom Hashoah, Yom Ha'atzmaut, and Lag b'Omer meaningful, engaging, and where appropriate, fun.

Additionally, as opportunities arise, I hope to be able to put my years of experience as a high school history teacher to use supplementing the many different types of learning offered at Torat El.

Of course, none of the things that I will be doing will be possible without a group of enthusiastic volunteers and participants. While I will be starting to reach out to people, don't be afraid to contact me -- I'd love to hear from you. I'm always available by e-mail (except for Shabbat and Yom Tov!) I can be reached at WarnerF@torat-el.org, and the office staff knows how to reach me if you'd like to set up a more personal conversation.

I'm very grateful for the year that I've spent here, and am eagerly anticipating the year to come. Thank you for allowing me to be part of the Torat El family!

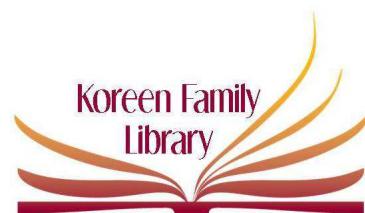
I Shall Not Hate by Izzeldin Abuelaish, (610.9AB), is a riveting story of a Palestinian doctor who witnesses the deaths of his three daughters by Israeli tank shells but who, instead of seeking revenge, continues to call for the people of the region to come together to communicate in respect and peace. The physician's hope is that his daughters will be "the last sacrifice on the road between Palestinians and Israelis."

Calmer Waters: The Caregiver's Journey Through Alzheimer's and Dementia by Barbara Cohn, (362.19Co), is authored by a professional writer who spent a decade caring for her husband who died of Alzheimer's disease at 69. She offers a spiritual and holistic guide as well as tools and techniques to help caregivers.

What Israel Means to Me by Alan Dershowitz, (940De), discusses the world's disproportionate love-hate attitude toward Israel. It should come as no surprise that tiny Israel attracts enormous attention from the world and this book discusses how the world views Israel.

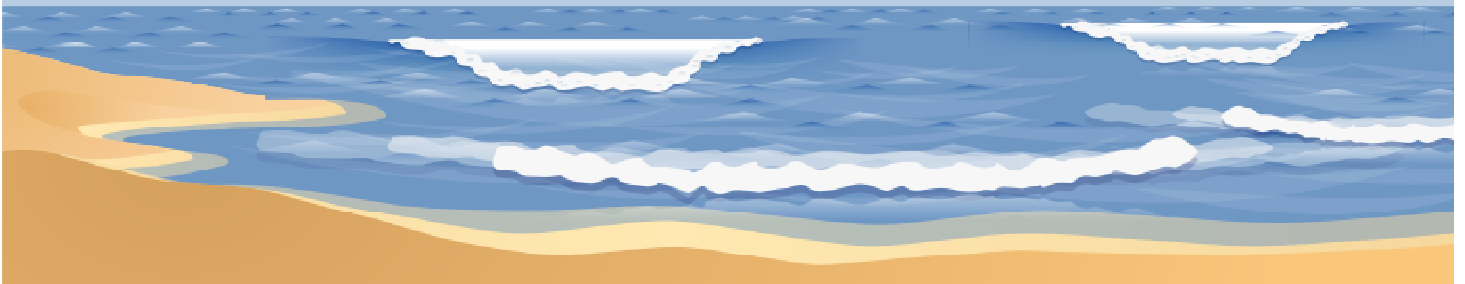

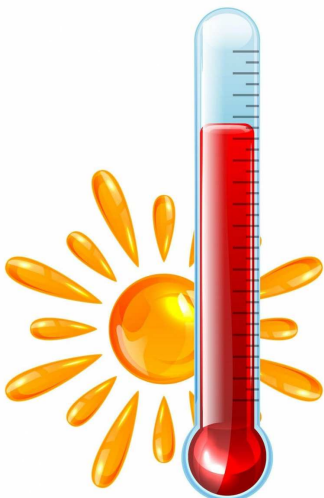

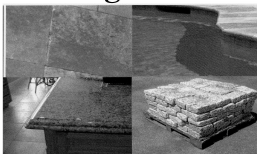
