

From The Rabbi's Study...

What Connects The Jewish People In The 21st Century?

A Seder Conversation

story of how our people came to be. But what exactly does it mean to be a people as well as a religion?

From the very beginning, it has been clear that Jews are both a people, as well as followers of a religion. This idea of being a Jewish people is rooted in the story of Passover. It was Pharaoh who coined the phrase *am bnei yisrael*, "the Israelite People" to describe us in the beginning of Exodus (Exodus 1:9). And one of the most famous lines in the narrative of the Exodus is Moses' repeated demand to Pharaoh: "Let My *People* Go." Every year we, as a people, are to gather together in our communities and celebrate the Festival of Passover, re-telling the

This is a question that underlies much of what is happening in the American Jewish community today. Previous generations of Jews have not generally had to think so much about this question. For centuries many Jews across the world felt very much a part of a people who were very connected to other Jews, both in their community and across the world. The past few generations of Jews around the world have done amazing things for the Jewish people such as establishing the State of Israel, ensuring that Holocaust education and awareness is everywhere you look, freeing most of the Jews around the world, and ridding much of the Western World of anti-Semitism (just to name a few!). Yet all of this success comes with a great challenge as many of the Jews in North America today do not feel that same sense of urgency connecting them to their fellow Jews across the world.

In recent history, as some of the examples above demonstrate, we have seen that our sense of peoplehood is often connected to crisis. But how can we foster a sense of peoplehood that is not solely linked to crisis? It is true that there are certainly crises that face the Jewish people. Israel continues to face existential threats and there is, unfortunately, still much anti-Semitism in our world. Nevertheless, for many of the younger generation of Jews in North America today, it seems that these issues *alone* are not enough to make them feel that deep sense of connection to the Jewish people that their parents and grandparents have felt. And if all of this were not enough, add to these challenges the notion that we are living in a country that prides itself on individualism. This is particularly true for our younger generation of Jews who often value their individual Jewish experience, but struggle with the importance of belonging to a local, national, and international Jewish community.

There are no simple answers to these challenges, but as Passover is a holiday that centers around peoplehood, and places a supreme value on asking questions, I invite you to share your thoughts on this topic, across the generations, at your Passover table.

- 1. Why does being connected to a people matter in the first place?
- 2. What does it mean to you to say that you are a part of the Jewish people?
- 3. When in your life have you most felt a part of the Jewish people?
- 4. Does being a part of a people mean that one Jew has a claim on another?
- 5. Does being a part of a people mean that one Jew is responsible for another?
- 6. Who do you include when you think of the Jewish people and who do you exclude. Explain.
- 7. What connection, if any, do you have with Jews living in other states in North America? With Jews living in Israel? Does this connection change if their outlook on Judaism is vastly different than yours? Explain. Do you believe that there are a set of values that all Jews in North America could agree upon?

May this dialogue help each of us continue to discover what it means to be a part of this amazing people, and may our identity as a people which, began in Egypt, continue to grow stronger for generations to come. *Hag Kasher V'Sameach*,



Siyyum Bechorim

Calling All First Born (Men and Women) ~ Monday, March 25th at 8:00am

According to Jewish tradition, the first born son of a mother or father is required to fast on the day before Passover as an expression of thanks for the deliverance of the first born Israelites who were spared from the Tenth plague. One midrash teaches that both women and men were affected by this plague, and the Shulchan Arukh offers an opinion that women who are first born should fast as well. It is in that spirit that we also encourage first born females to join us for our siyyum festivities. However, individuals who are obligated to fast are exempt from fasting if they have the opportunity to participate in a **seudat mitzvah**, a festive meal that follows the performance of certain mitzvoth. Therefore, it has become customary for synagogues, on the day before Passover, to make a **siyyum**, a public completion of a unit of study, which is followed by a **seudat mitzvah**, thus exempting the first born participants from their obligation to fast. The siyyum will be preceded by the morning minyan and followed by a feast with lots of delicious chametz. Study and feast is held in memory of Esther and Ed Deitelbaum and is sponsored by their family. All are welcome to join us even if you are not a first born.

Sale of Chametz

During the week of Pesach, it is forbidden for any Jew to own chametz. To avoid the unnecessary financial hardship that could result from requiring Jews to dispose of all items that are chametz, it is tradition to sell items of chametz to non-Jews for the week of Pesach. If you would like to sell your chametz to insure that you abide by the Jewish law of not owning any chametz during the week of Pesach, please fill out the form below and return it to the Temple on or before end of day Friday, March 22nd.




