#### Coming Out Of Hiding By Standing Up and Sticking Out



In a few weeks we will once again celebrate the joyous festival of Purim. From delivering *Shalach Manot*, to Megillah readings, to comedy night, to our yearly carnival followed by a fun concert for our youth, much of our focus this year will be on bringing joy and laughter to all ages in our community. To anyone who has celebrated Purim before, this will not come as a surprise. After all, isn't Purim the festival of joy and laughter, the festival of silliness and merry making? Well, yes and no. Because while Purim certainly *is* all about these things, it also has a

more serious side, that moves beyond dressing up in costume, spinning our graggers, and eating way too many hamantaschen after the Megillah reading! Because Purim also comes to remind us of the importance of standing up for our values and our beliefs, even in our deepest moments of fear.

Let's take a moment to review the story of Purim, which celebrates the victory of an assimilated Diaspora Jewish community over the wicked Haman. The story begins with Queen Vashti's refusal to dance before a drunken King Ahashverosh at a royal banquet, which in turn sets the stage for Esther to be chosen as Queen. Shortly thereafter, King Ahashverosh appoints Haman as grand vizier and all of the king's courtiers kneel and bow before Haman. When Mordechai refuses to bow down, Haman becomes so enraged that he plots to destroy Mordechai and all of the Jews throughout the kingdom. Fortunately, Esther and Mordecai devise a plan to save the Jews. Esther comes before the king, wines and dines him, reveals that she is Jewish, and pleads for her people. At the end, the tables are turned, Haman is hanged, and the Jewish people in the kingdom of Shushan are saved from his evil plot and live happily ever after.

Esther is the real hero of this story. Her name literally means "hidden," because at first she preferred to stay "hidden" amongst the assimilated Jews of Shushan. But Mordechai convinced her that despite her fear of standing out, despite the risks of coming before the king without being summoned, Esther had to stand up for her people. The story of Esther is the story of courage and a willingness to stand up in the more challenging moments of life.

Do not imagine that you, of all the Jews, will escape with your life by being in the king's palace. On the contrary; if you keep silent in this crisis, relief and deliverance will come to the Jews from another quarter, while you and your father's house will perish. And who knows, perhaps you have attained to royal position for just such a crisis. (Esther 4:13-14)

Esther's story is an important reminder for each of us in our daily lives. There are times when we may feel afraid, nervous, or concerned in a personal, professional, or communal setting. There are times where we would rather just "sit it out," or "hide in the background," because we convince ourselves that a particular issue or situation will not directly affect us in any way. But Esther reminds us that there are moments in life when we dare not remain hidden in our comfortable palaces in life whose false sense of security is just that. There are moments when we have to stand up for our beliefs, stand up for our values, and take risks to ensure that as Jews, and as human beings, we are standing on the right side of any given issue. Like Esther, who fasted, used polite language and had a well thought out plan before she went before the king, we too must always remember to do this in a considered, thoughtful and graceful way.

May each of us have the strength to face those fearful moments in our lives, by stepping up, standing out, and courageously bringing the light of our souls and our Jewish values into those darker moments of our society and of our lives.



#### FROM THE DESK OF THE TEMPLE PRESIDENT

During the first couple of weeks of the new presidency, there has been a flurry of activity. Regardless of whether you agree or disagree with the content of any of the numerous Executive Orders that have been adopted, a legitimate question exists as to the process of *how* those Orders were adopted. It is clear that our new president, a CEO in business, is applying the same decision-making process he used in the private sector to his governing a pluralistic country with multiple stakeholders and competing interests. Unfortunately, leading a country, or a temple for that matter, is different than running a company as an autocrat.

For example, when the lay leadership here at Congregation Torat El wants to change an existing practice or policy or adopt a new one, we have to determine if the change is in line with our governing documents – the Constitution and By-Laws. We also must review if the policy is in conformance with our religious teachings and ensure that it complies with any Halachic requirements. Finally, and perhaps most importantly, we must work to get buy-in and understanding from you, the congregants as a whole (including various sub-groups each of which have their own interests and agendas). If you do not believe in, understand and support the new policy, then what good is it? Even if the goal is laudable, the outcome will be negative if the community does not work toward achieving that end.

Let me give you a concrete example. Recently, the temple was approached and asked to allow Jewish funerals to take place in our sanctuary. Coincidentally, this unsolicited request came from multiple sources at the same time. While no official policy exists prohibiting such a use of our building, there has been an unwritten policy that only past presidents, clergy and other "big machers" could have funerals in the Temple.

Given the opportunity that literally fell into our lap, we reviewed the situation. Nationally, synagogues are going out of the box to explore ways to use their assets, increase sources of revenue and expand their reach in the community. Locally, Congregation Torat El strives to be an open and inclusive congregation, welcoming all equally. Monetary issues, as always, are a consideration in the on-going operation of the synagogue with ever-increasing expenses and limited means of raising funds and generating revenue. Halachic considerations were reviewed. The Board was consulted to gauge its feelings on the matter. Finally, the past presidents were consulted regarding their feelings and input on this potential policy change.

After conducting a thorough review of all of the foregoing, we have decided to open up the temple to funerals, for a fee. To that end, we will be entering into an agreement with a local funeral home so that we can control what and when things happen in our building. More information will be forthcoming in that regard so that all members of our community – presidents, members and non-members – can avail themselves of our facility in times of need. In the meantime, we are hopeful that given the thoughtful process we have employed in making this decision that there will at the least be an understanding as to why we are making this change, if not total agreement with the change.



# Siyyum Bechorim Calling All First Born (*Men and Women*) Monday, April 10th at 8:00am

According to Jewish tradition, the first born son of a mother or father is required to fast on the day before Passover as an expression of thanks for the deliverance of the first born Israelites who were spared from the Tenth plague. However, individuals who are obligated to fast are exempt from fasting if they have the opportunity to participate in a **seudat mitzvah**, a festive meal that follows the performance of certain mitzvoth. Therefore, it has become customary for synagogues, on the day before Passover, to make a siyyum, a public completion unit of study, which is followed by a seudat mitzvah, thus exempting the first born participants from their obligation to fast. The siyyum will be preceded by the morning minyan and followed by a feast with lots of delicious chametz. Study and feast are held in memory of Esther and Ed Deitelbaum and are sponsored by their family. All are welcome to join us even if you are not a first born.

# Sale of Chametz

During the week of Pesach, it is forbidden for any Jew to own chametz. To avoid the unnecessary financial hardship that could result from requiring Jews to dispose of all items that are chametz, it is tradition to sell items of chametz to non-Jews for the week of Pesach. If you would like to sell your chametz to ensure that you abide by the Jewish law of not owning any chametz during the week of Pesach, please fill out the form below and return it to the Temple on or before end of day **Thursday, April 6, 2017.**
