LISTENING THROUGH THE NOISE

Each person was given two ears and one tongue so that one may listen more than speak. (Hasdai Ibn Crescas, 14th/15th century, Spain)

A story is told about a young girl who comes home from Hebrew school, eager to show her mother a drawing that she had done in class. As the girl walks into the house, her mother is washing the dishes. "Mommy, guess what?" she squeals, waving the drawing. Without looking up, her mother responds, "What?" "Guess what?" repeats the little girl. Again the mother asks, "What?" "Mommy, you're not listening." Still not shifting her focus from the dishes, she says, "Sweetie, yes, I am." "But Mommy, you're not listening with your eyes." (as shared by Rabbi Dan Moskowitz)

What does it mean to truly listen? These days, with the distraction of smart phones lurking around every corner we are lucky if we manage to get someone else's "half-attention," let alone complete attention with actual eye contact. As a society, while we are often physically present with one another, we are not always fully in each other's presence. It seems that there is always something around to distract us from the dings and buzzes of our phones and our watches/ fitbits, to the music playing in the background of a restaurant, to the TV screen or ipads that seem to be available everywhere from airports to our local malls. We can easily begin to understand why it is difficult for so many of us (myself included) to learn to "listen with our eyes," when our eyes (and ears) are constantly being pulled in multiple directions. How to listen fully, without distraction. This is the challenge. In Hebrew, when we want someone to pay attention we say "sim lev," literally, "put your heart into it." How often do we listen with our hearts – despite the noise that is constantly around us? A wonderful example of the importance of this type of listening can be found in the upcoming holiday of Purim. Complete with noise makers, yelling, and an often rowdy service where we are supposed to be listening to the Megillah reading, Purim is a useful frame in which to look at the challenges of listening amidst distraction.

One of the four mitzvot of Purim surrounds the obligation to "hear" the Megillah being read. The Shulchan Arukh (code of

One of the four *mitzvot* of Purim surrounds the obligation to "hear" the Megillah being read. The *Shulchan Arukh* (code of Jewish law), explains that:

We should cancel Torah study in order to hear the reading of the Megillah. All the more so for the rest of the *mitzvot of the Torah because all of them are pushed aside before (in favor of) the reading of the Megillah.* There is nothing for which the mitzvah of hearing the reading of the Megillah is overridden, except for the burial of a dead person who does not have anyone to bury him/her (according to its need) 687:2

Indeed when the custom of drowning out Haman's name first began in the twelfth century, it was originally met with a good degree of opposition over fears that one could not possibly hear the Megillah through such noise. As we know, popular custom won out, and we were left with a holiday that emphasizes the importance of "listening," despite the fact that we are sometimes surrounded by outside "noise."

When was the last time that you truly felt that someone listened to you? How did you feel? How did the person let you know that you "mattered?" When do *you* listen fully, and when are you only "partially present?" What are the distractions that hinder you from being fully present? Is it your phone during a meeting? Is it your mind, that is racing with your "to do" list, and hindering your presence with the person who you are with? Is it your lack of comfort with eye contact, or the way that you are always "on the go," and have trouble slowing down long enough to truly listen? Is it arrogance, because you feel that what you have to say is extremely important, or you have already "heard this" before?

I cannot claim that any of this is easy. In truth, I find that while I have learned how to listen more effectively throughout my rabbinate, this is something that I struggle with as well. Active listening, especially when distractions abound, takes practice, discipline, and a calming of the mind. And even when I "hear" what someone else is saying, the truth is that I am not always listening (just ask my family)!

Nevertheless, as Dr. Rachel Naomi Remen, author of Kitchen Table Wisdom, explains, we must challenge ourselves to do better:

Perhaps the most important thing that we ever give each other is our attention. And especially, if it's given from the heart. When people are talking, there's no need to do anything but receive them. Just take them in. Listen to what they are saying. Care about it. Most times caring about it is even more important than understanding it...

This simple thing has not been that easy to learn. It certainly went against everything I had been taught since I was very young. I thought people listened only because they were too timid to speak or did not know the answer. A loving silence often has far more power to heal and to connect than the most well intentioned words.

The Hebrew word *Megilah*, literally means "scroll," but is also connected to the word meaning that which is "revealed" or "uncovered." May each of us be blessed with the wisdom to practice the sacred task of listening throughout our daily lives. In our homes, in our places of work, and in our everyday interactions large and small, may we actively work to understand that true wisdom can only be "revealed" and "uncovered" if we are willing to listen with an open and generous heart – despite the noise of the everyday *groggers* that surrounds us.

B'hatzlacha, good luck! And Hag Purim Sameach – May you have a joyous, and happy Purim!

The Tatooist of Auschwitz by Heather Morris (FMo) is currently on The New York Times best sellers list of books. The novel begins in April 1942 when Lale Eisenberg becomes prisoner 32407 in Auschwitz, Birkenau. Since he can speak many languages, he is put to work as a tattooist, tasked with permanently marking each prisoner with a five-digit number. He falls in love with Gita, one of the women he is tatooing, and eventually they escape in 1945, separate, meet again and settle and marry in Australia. In



spite of the circumstances, <u>The Tatooist of Auschwitz</u> is a testament to the endurance of love and humanity under the darkest possible conditions.

<u>Eternal Life</u> by Dara Horn (FHo) is the story of Rachel and Elazar, young lovers at the time of the Second Temple, who become literally immortal. Two thousand years later, they are still alive, having outlived many husbands, wives and children, unable to die, constantly inventing new identities and guarding their secrets. We recommend everyone to check out our copy of this fascinating new book.

<u>A Queen in Jerusalem</u> by Tami Shem-Tov (JSh) is a lovely children's book that arrived just in time for Purim. It is about Malka who needs a Queen Esther costume for Purim, but her mother does not have time to make one. Portraits of two beloved icons -- Sholom Aleichem and Theodore Bikel -- are woven together in this enchanting documentary. The two men have much in common: wit, wisdom and talent, all shot through with deep humanity and Yiddishkeit.

Theodore Bikel's career spanned more than 150 screen roles (including an Oscar-nominated turn in The Defiant Ones) and countless stage and musical productions, was also the foremost interpreter of Sholom Aleichem's work. The film, "Theodore Bikel: In the Shoes of Sholom Aleichem," combines Bikel's charismatic storytelling and masterful performances with a broader exploration of Aleichem's remarkable life and work.






