CULTIVATING A LOVE OF ISRAEL...BY LIGHTING SHABBAT CANDLES!



In just a few weeks, on Wednesday evening, May 11th through Thursday, May 12th, we will be celebrating *Yom Ha-Atzmaut* – Israel's Independence Day. As many of you know, I recently returned from the AIPAC (American Israel Public Affairs Committee) policy conference, where I joined with 18,000 individuals from around the country to demonstrate bipartisan support for Israel and a strong and vibrant Israel/U.S. relationship. Of the many sessions that I attended and speeches that I heard, there is one in particular that stands out in my mind as we approach Israel's 68th year. All of the clergy in attendance, representing multiple denominations, were invited to a panel discussion

featuring Jeffrey Goldberg, a national correspondent for The Atlantic, and Bret Stephens, the Deputy Editor of The Wall Street Journal. The topic of the discussion was the relationship between Israel and the U.S., and also focused on the relationship between American and Israeli Jews.

As he was remarking about the strong correlation in various research surveys between love of Israel and one's sense of Jewish identity, Goldberg wondered aloud why the largest gathering of Jews in the U.S. is about politics and not about Judaism. Goldberg was criticizing the trend of Jewish identity being solely connected to the issue of Israel (or the Holocaust), and explaining that while these issues were both critical to Jewish identity and necessary, they were not sufficient. The challenge that he presented to us was the notion that Jews today, in particular young Jews, need to first care about being Jewish before they can come to understand why they should care about Israel at all. Part of the challenge that young Jews face on college campuses, for example, when faced with issues of the BDS movement and other anti-Zionist rhetoric, is that they simply lack the identity and the knowledge to combat this hateful rhetoric and activity. And this lack of knowledge, Goldberg claimed, can be directly tied to their lack of Jewish connection in general. Claiming that "there has been a generational failure to explain to kids why Israel needs to exist," Goldberg reminded the audience that today's generation of young Jews did not grow up with The War of Independence, The War of '67, or the raid on Entebbe. This lack of Jewish national pride makes connection to Israel challenging enough, but coupled with a general lack of involvement in their Judaism, the connection is likely to be surface, at best.

Goldberg was challenging those of us in the room involved in educating America's next generation of Jews to remember that our relationship to Israel should not just be based around politics. Claiming that "the hyper politicization of Israel is not good for Israel, or the American connection to Israel," Goldberg encouraged us to create *ahavat Yisrael*, a love of Israel, in our youth by encouraging our youth to study Hebrew, come to synagogue, go to Jewish summer camp, and regularly engage in Jewish rituals. If we want to create a stronger connection to Israel for college kids on campus, Goldberg chided, we should ask them how often they light Shabbat candles (and no, he is not "Orthodox")! In other words, one's love of Israel should be something that is "a-political," but rather *derivative of one's Jewish experience*.

As I walked out of the session I felt both inspired, and anxious -- because my sense is that Goldberg's critique is right on the mark. We are living in a time when many younger Jews in America, and even some of their parents, have little to no connection to Israel. And many of those same Jews have a connection to their Judaism that is based more on culture and less on ritual, Jewish values, and Jewish practices. Don't get me wrong... ideally one's Jewish identity needs all of these things to be complete, but how many of us have shared *our love of Judaism* with our children and grandchildren? How many of us have given them a context for why love of Israel is important, that beyond issues of anti-Semitism alone (though that is certainly important), Jewish innovation, and Israel being the only Democracy in the Middle East? As we prepare to celebrate the miracle and blessing of Israel's 68th year, as we continue to pray for a peace that seems ever allusive, in an Israel that is wonderful, yet extremely complicated, how many of us understand why we should love Israel in the first place? And if we have a deep love of Israel, how many of us have worked to pass on that love, in a non-political way, to our children and grandchildren by teaching them, through our example, to be connected to their Judaism?

Let this, then, be our challenge to ourselves as we look to combat the apathy, and forces of anti-Israel sentiment that face our children and grandchildren in the 21st century. Let us remember that the antidote to this lack of connection, feeling, and knowledge has been with us the whole time in the wisdom, beauty, power and profound meaning that comes along with living an active, committed and involved Jewish life. Instead of worrying about what will happen to our children and grandchildren's connection to Israel, let us instead work to ensure that *their love of Judaism remains strong*. Support the Jewish education of your children and grandchildren, bring them to synagogue, spend Jewish holidays together, light Shabbat candles together -- their love, connection and commitment to *Eretz Yisrael*, will inevitably follow.

It's a mitzvah to help those who want to say Kaddish and may even give you some peace and perspective, *every once in awhile*.


