UNDERSTANDING REVELATION- ENGAGING A TORAH OF FEAR OR LOVE?



We are just a few weeks away from celebrating the Festival of Shavuot. Literally meaning "weeks," the festival of Shavuot gets its name from the instruction in the Torah that we are to count "seven weeks (Shavuot)" from the beginning of the grain crop on until the end of that harvest. In Israel the spring harvest begins during the Passover season, and in the biblical period people would bring an offering of thanksgiving, as well as their new crop, to Jerusalem during this time of year to be eaten as a sign of appreciation and thanksgiving for God's beneficence. The agricultural aspects of this holiday are commemorated today by the counting of the Omer, a biblical measurement of grain that was to represent a portion of the crop that was brought daily during the 49 days between Passover and Shavuot. By the rabbinic period, with the Temple no longer standing, Shavuot became

associated with the giving of the Torah – an event that traditionally occurred during this time of year as well. From that point on, the giving and receiving of Torah became the primary focus of this pilgrimage Festival.

Ancient *midrashim* (rabbinic parables) abound about the moment that our ancestors stood at Mount Sinai to receive the Torah. Interestingly, there are two *midrashim* that stand in exact opposition to one another when it comes to the description of the revelation on Mount Sinai. The Torah describes how Moses "led the people out of the camp towards God, and they took their places *be-tachteet ha-har*, at the foot of the mountain (Exodus 19:17)." Noting that the literal translation of *be-tachteet* is "under,"

Rabbi Avdimi bar Hama bar Hasa said: the Jewish people actually stood beneath the mountain, and the verse teaches that the Holy One, Blessed be He, overturned the mountain above the Jews like a tub, and said to them: If you accept the Torah, excellent, and if not, there will be your burial. **Babylonian Talmud, Shabbat 88a**

This somewhat disturbing midrash imagines that God coerced the children of Israel into accepting the Torah, literally threatening them with their lives if they failed to accept this way of life.

Fortunately, another midrash imagines the scene entirely differently. In Moses's poetic rendering of the scene found towards the end of Deuteronomy we read that "The Lord came from Mount Sinai (Deut. 33:2)."

Rabbi Jose taught:.. "The Lord came from Sinai" (Deut. 33:2), to receive Israel *as a bridegroom comes forth go meet the bride*... Scripture indicates that the mount was pulled up from its place and the people came near and stood under it, as it is said: "And you came near and stood *under the mountain* (Deuteronomy 4:11)."

Here we have the idea that when the children of Israel gathered "under the mountain" of Sinai, they did so with Sinai acting more like a wedding canopy, a *hupah*, than a threatening mound of earth hanging over their head. Here we have the idea that revelation was a moment of sacred connection between God and the children of Israel, as they stood under the wedding canopy and entered into a marriage by signing a metaphorical wedding contract (ketubah), in the shape of the Torah/Ten Commandments.

This all brings us to the following question. How do we understand our Judaism? How do we view our tradition? Is it something that we feel "forced," or even "guilted" into engaging with? Or is it something that we come to voluntarily – with excitement, nervousness, and a full heart, much as young lovers come together on their wedding day? Do we accept living a life of Torah out of fear, out of love, or out of some combination of the two? Understanding our motivation to engage with, or disengage with, Torah is important because it can help us be more authentic and sincere in our approach to our Judaism. So on this Shavuot, take a moment to consider your relationship to Torah as a whole. Are you Jewish out of fear? Are you Jewish out of love? And what might these various motivations come to teach you about how you can deepen your connection to a tradition that continues to reveal significant, meaningful, and sacred truths that are as old as the first revelation on Mount Sinai.
