From The Rabbi's Study...

Giving Thanks Each Day

I love thanksgiving. On this quintessential American holiday, we gather with friends and family to celebrate and give thanks for the gifts of our lives. As we eat to our hearts content, stuffing ourselves with turkey, yams, stuffing, cranberry sauce, and other traditional favorites, we are reminded that for the most part, our lives are as full and delightful as the food in our stomachs. Yes, life has its struggles and some days are better than others, but most of us live daily lives that are filled with blessing.



My one problem with Thanksgiving is that it only comes once a year. As Americans, we spend the last Thursday in November giving thanks for the goodness in our lives. As Jews we should remember that this is not enough. As Jews we are taught that thanksgiving is a daily obligation. This idea is most clearly expressed in the daily liturgy. Traditionally, the first words out of a Jews mouth each morning are:

Modeh (M.)/Modah(F.) Ani L'fanekha, Melekh Chai V'kayam, She'hekhezartah bi Nishmati Be'chemlah-Rabah Emunatekha

I am thankful to you, living, enduring King, for restoring my soul to me in compassion. You are faithful beyond measure.

When we wake up each morning our instincts might tell us to smack the alarm clock and roll over for a few more minutes of precious sleep. But our tradition has something else in mind. We are to wake up grateful for the opportunity that we have been given to face a new day—and we are to thank God for this daily miracle. And Judaism does not stop there. There are a whole host of berakhot that are traditionally said upon waking up each morning as another way of taking a moment to be thankful for that which we might otherwise take for granted. Today, our Shabbat and weekday services often begin with these berakhot; but their original place was in the home. The following are a list of some of these berakhot and when they are said.

Barukh Atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melekh Ha'olam; Praised are You, Adonai, Ruler of the Universe:

Who enables the rooster to distinguish between night and day (upon waking up and hearing our modern day "alarm clock")

Gives sight to the blind (upon opening our eyes)

Who clothes the naked (upon putting on our clothes)

Who releases the bound (upon stretching and sitting up in bed)

Who raises the downtrodden (upon getting out of bed)

Who provides for all my needs (upon tying our shoes)

Who guides man on his path (upon taking our first steps in the morning)

Who strengthens the people Israel with courage (upon tying our belts)

Who crowns the people Israel with glory (upon putting a hat or scarf upon our heads) Babylonian Talmud 60b

How many of us remember to be thankful for the ability to sit up, open our eyes and get out of bed each day? How many of us take a moment to be thankful for the gift of having clothes to put on each day, a belt to put around our waste, and even shoe laces with which to tie our shoes? I would venture to guess that most of us struggle with remembering to give thanks for such seemingly trivial things in our daily lives. And that is precisely the point. These berakhot remind us that many things that we take for granted in life are really miracles, and many things which seem insignificant are really rather extraordinary. Judaism reminds us that we must take time each day to be thankful for these gifts in our lives. Thanksgiving does not just come once a year—it comes every day.

As you recover from your travels, and your Thanksgiving feast I would like to encourage you to begin incorporating these lessons of thanksgiving into your daily lives. When you wake up each morning try reciting the words of the Modeh Ani or some of the morning berakhot. I can promise you that starting your day in this way has a very subtle, but profound impact on the rest of your day. The words can be found on pages two and ten of Siddur Sim Shalom, and I am happy to e-mail anyone the Hebrew, translation, and transliteration of these prayers. Additionally, I would encourage each of you to set aside a few minutes, each day to thank God for something in your lives. As you saw from the morning berakhot it does not have to be anything "profound," but I would encourage you to be specific. Taking a few moments out of each day to give thanks for the goodness of our lives brings increased meaning and holiness to our daily existence and ensures that our thanksgiving celebration is an ongoing event.

Once again, amid all the good that life doles out on a daily basis, I was greeted this past week by news of the passing of two founders of our community.

Sam Adler, a nonagenarian, and Joe Cook, past president of Temple Beth Torah, were 2 universally loved and respected gentlemen who passed away in October.

Sam and Joe were bright, soft spoken, and unassuming. At services, Sam always had something nice to say. Joe, as a person who understood what it's like to be a congregation president, always had great advice, but gave it only when asked and always with a calm and gentle voice that comes with the wisdom of life experience.

Sam and Joe were regular attendees at Shabbat services. You would see them arriving at the same time each week, not too early but not too late. They sat in the same seats in our sanctuary, and either *davened* or focused on what was going on with attentiveness and respect for a tradition that was bigger than they were.

Both Sam and Joe were positive minded gentlemen who lived life the right way- with God, family, and community as their priorities. Life's problems and challenges never altered their kind and gentle demeanors. Both were role models for me as great congregants. Most notably, Sam's and Joe's devotion, vision, and leadership made it possible for all of us to serve the Almighty today.

I am certain that when Tom Brokaw wrote about The Greatest Generation, he was clearly writing about people like Sam Adler and Joe Cook. They don't make people like this any more and my heart aches that these 2 giants are gone.

I will miss Sam and Joe very much and my heart goes out to their families. At the same time, I wonder who will fill their shoes both inside and outside our synagogue. The passing of Sam and Joe is a call to those of us fortunate enough to be children of the Greatest Generation to step up and emulate their greatness.

As we reflect on Sam Adler, Joe Cook, and members of the Greatest Generation who have touched us—or continue to touch us—let's look carefully at their lives and strive to be a bit greater. If we can give just a little more of ourselves to our family, our friends, our Kehilah Kedoshah, and to the Almighty, perhaps we can make the world better like they did.

Congregation Torat El mourns the loss of these two great men and extends its heart to Sam's daughter and son-in-law, Richard and Barbara Boden, Joe's wife, Annette, his son, Miles, and all the grandchildren of these wonderful men. It is my heartfelt hope that you will carry their legacy with pride and that those of us who knew them will be inspired by the lessons their well-lived lives have to offer us.



The Jewish Experience in America, a classic 5 volume set, edited with introductions by Abraham J. Karp, on the shelf at Roseld Avenue, call # 973 Ka

These articles from the American Jewish Historical Society's *Publications-Quarterly* chronicle the history of Jews in America.

Volume 1 begins in 1654, the "Colonial Period," when 23 men, women and young people arrived in the town of New Amsterdam, establishing the first Jewish community in what is now the United States after having been forced to leave Recife, Brazil, when that city was recaptured by the Portuguese from the Dutch.

Volume 2 explores the "Early Republic" during the first half of the 1800's in which American Jewish population swelled from fewer than 2,000 to some 50,000 in the first wave of immigration during the pioneer days.

Volume 3 focuses on the "Emerging Community" during the middle-late 1800's with continued immigration, increasing Jewish American population to 150,000 during the days of the Old South and Civil War.

Volume 4 continues analysis of the great "Era of Immigration" with the challenges and opportunities for American Jews as the nineteenth century turned into the early twentieth.

Volume 5 concludes with a final look at Jews becoming "At Home in America" with emerging cultural patterns in American Jewish life in the twentieth century.






