From The Rabbi's Study...

In a few weeks we will celebrate the holiday of Thanksgiving. In most American circles, Thanksgiving centers around family, football, and food. Most of us reading this article are blessed each year to sit around tables filled with delicious foods to eat. In fact, I'm sure most of us feel quite stuffed by the end of our thanksgiving meal, a festival when we celebrate the gifts of bounty in our lives and "no one diets."

Jewish tradition teaches us that food in particular is not something that we should take for granted. We are taught to say *berakhot* before and after we eat, precisely to remind us that having enough to eat is a blessing that is, unfortunately, not shared by everyone in this world. And when we celebrate with food and drink, we are taught to use that celebration as a reminder to help those who are less fortunate. To quote Maimonides:

....While one eats and drinks himself, it is his duty to feed the stranger, the orphan, the widow, and other poor and unfortunate people, for he who locks the doors to his courtyard and eats and drinks with his wife and family without giving anything to eat and drink to the poor and the bitter in soul—his meal is not a rejoicing in a divine commandment, but a rejoicing in his own stomach (Mishneh Torah, Laws of Festivals, 6:18)

That is why I want to call your attention to an important campaign organized by the American Jewish World Service (AJWS), called: ***Reverse Hunger: Ending the Global Food Crisis.*** AJWS



has asked Jewish communities across the world to take action beginning on "Global Hunger Shabbat," November 4-5, and to continue through the Thanksgiving holiday. On that Shabbat I will be speaking about global hunger, and as of this writing we are exploring small ways in which our community can participate in this important work. Please check your e-mail for details on Torat El's planned involvement, and I encourage you to explore the AJWS website (ajws.org) for further information on global hunger and how you can get involved.

Global Hunger is an overwhelming problem but our tradition teaches that while we are not obligated to solve the entire problem, neither are we free to ignore it (Avot 2:21). One small step: as we prepare to feast at our Thanksgiving tables, I suggest you pass this beautiful prayer from AJWS. May this prayer inspire you to take action so that your Thanksgiving celebration is not without purpose.
