Who Will Tell Your Story?



Last spring I was privileged to see the Broadway hit show *Hamilton* by Lin-Manuel Miranda. For those who have not seen the show or listened to the lyrics, it is an upbeat, hip-hop retrospective on the life of Alexander Hamilton and his tremendous influence on the founding of our nation. Prior to seeing the play, I did not really know that much about Hamilton. I knew that he had something to do with the national banking system in this country, and that he was shot by Aaron Burr. To say that I had little to no understanding of who Hamilton was, what he stood

for, or the tremendous influence that he had on this country, is putting it nicely. Between the play, and reading the 800-page book on which it was based by Ron Chernow, I learned a tremendous amount about Hamilton's life and his influence on our democracy and way of life as Americans. Toward the end of the musical, there is a song entitled *Who Lives Who Dies, Who Tells Your Story?* The song captures one of the overarching take-aways from the musical asking the audience member to consider just how our life stories get told, who writes them, and what lessons they might pass on to the next generation. Hamilton is a great example as I imagine that, prior to watching the show, many people do not know very much about this Founding Father. Though he was incredibly prolific, writing, for example, 51 out of the 85 Federalist papers promoting the ratification of the Constitution, most of us hear Alexander Hamilton and simply think, "Aaron Burr."

But as Jews, we should know better, because as Jews, we are continually taught that our stories should matter and should be passed on *I'dor va'dor*, from generation to generation. Each week, we read the story of our people in the Torah in an attempt to learn life lessons from those who started this tradition thousands of years ago. Eli Wiesel once remarked that our very purpose for living is centered around story-telling, when he remarked that God created man because God likes stories. Unfortunately, many people simply don't make the time to write down their stories for the next generation. "My children aren't interested," they say. "Who has the time?" they think. "I don't have anything that interesting to share," they imagine. "Who writes anything down anymore anyway?" they quip. But as we come out of this High Holy Days season of reflection and renewal centered around our own Books of Life, we are challenged to ask ourselves just exactly how it is that we want to be remembered. Because if there is one thing that I learned from watching *Hamilton*, it is this: The way in which we are remembered depends, in large part, on the amount of material that we have shared with others, and who is left to share our story with the next generation once we are gone.

To that end: Do your children and grandchildren know what your childhood was like? Do they know who your favorite relatives were? Do they understand where your family comes from or know the classic family stories? Do they know your engagement story, what it was like when they were younger, who you first voted for, or how you got your first job? Do they know where you were when Kennedy was shot, what life was like for you during the years of MLK and LBJ, or where you were on 9/11? Do they know your favorite movie or what book most influenced you in your life? Do they know what you believe about Judaism, about God, and about the Jewish community? Do they know what you have learned from life and what is most important to you in this world? Do they know what life has taught you?

As Jews, we have the great privilege and responsibility of ensuring that those who will follow us on this earth have a sense of where they come from, in order to better understand where they are, and where they are going. But in order to do this well, we have to make the time to write down our stories. We have to take the time to share with future generations what we feel is important about our lives, and our world. Of course this is easier said than done. But that should not stop us. Fortunately, Lin-Manuel Miranda rescued Hamilton's story for the world to see. But most of us do not have someone else who will rescue our story for us. We are the only ones who can tell our stories in our own voices.

So how do we get started? To learn more about this, and begin working on sharing your story with others, please consider joining me for my upcoming class entitled "L'dor Va'dor: Sharing Our Values From Generation to Generation," beginning on Wednesday, November 16th at 7:30pm. We will explore some Jewish ethical wills that have been written throughout history and begin working on crafting our own stories as well. *Please note we have postponed the class by one week.* I look forward to learning with you and sharing in your story!

Lunch 'n Learn - Journey Through The Torah



Join us for this wonderful opportunity to learn from great scholars, from our own Rabbi Schonbrun, and from one another as we engage in thinking about the Jewish values that underlie one of the most politically sensitive and difficult issues facing the Jewish people and the international community.
