# SEVENTY YEARS LATER



November 29, 1947. That was the day, seventy years ago this year, when the United Nations (resolution 181) fulfilled the promise of the Balfour Declaration and recognized *the Jewish people's right to a national home in their ancient homeland*. In May of 1948 that homeland would declare independence as the State of Israel. For those who are interested in history, the vote was 33 in favor, 13 against, and 10 abstentions (see Google for details!).

Seventy, in Judaism, is a significant number. The rabbis in Pirkei Avot (5:21) refer to seventy as indicative of having lived a full, mature, and wise life. When a person turns 83 in the Jewish tradition, there is a custom of having a second bar or bat mitzvah because they have lived a full life since their bar or bat mitzvah at age 13. In the Haggadah we read that Rabbi Elazar ben Azariyah was like "a man of age 70" when he finally reached a certain level of knowledge and understanding about the Exodus. And lastly, our tradition teaches that there are seventy faces to the Torah – a number demonstrating the richness, complexity and depth that comes from learning and living out our heritage. Maturity, wisdom, knowledge, complexity, a time for celebration and a time for taking stock, are all values that come along with the number seventy in the Jewish tradition.


I find myself considering all of this as I reflect back on where Israel has been and where she is headed seventy years into her existence. The successes and miracles of the modern state of Israel are incredible. A safe haven for Jews around the world, the only democracy in the Middle East that promotes rights and freedoms to so many regardless of religion, gender, or sexual orientation. A leader in technological advancement, medical advances, environmental advances, and the first to rush in to help others in times of need (be they refugees fleeing war-torn Syria, or victims of hurricanes, earthquakes, or other natural disasters around the world) -- we should be filled with pride over all that Israel has established in her short 70 years of existence. It is, in some senses, a modern miracle. At the same time, 70 years into the experiment that is Zionism, Israel is a complicated place as we reach this milestone. Peace between Israel and the Palestinians seems ever allusive. We read news of corruption by Israel's leaders and government too often. As more and more Jews immigrate to Israel from all over the world, issues of race, class, and background remain a challenge as Israel figures out how to create a society that values Jews from a wide range of backgrounds. And issues of religion and state continue to cause tensions both in Israel, and between Israel and North America as Jewish who look like you and me are unable to express their Judaism freely in many instances (egalitarian prayer, marriage, divorce, conversion, kashrut status of restaurants, issues surrounding public Shabbat observance, etc.) As I have said before, Israel is the only democracy in which Jews are not guaranteed freedom of religious expression.

And so, as Israel enters into this time for both celebration and reflection, I want to simply invite all of us to take a moment to pause and consider our own relationship to our second home, the state of Israel. How informed are we about the Jewish homeland? How many of us have a good grasp on the history of the State of Israel, or on how we come to be where we are today in terms of the Palestinians, the territories, the settlements, and the peace treaties with some of Israel's neighbors? How many of the college students here today feel equipped to answer criticisms leveled at the state of Israel, rampant on college campuses across the country? How many of us understand why, or how, Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Egypt and Israel are now aligned against Iran, Syria, Hezbollah and Hamas? How many of us know the differences between AIPAC and J Street beyond what we read in the news? How many of us can name five different organizations that support Israel, and how many of us give financial support to these organizations? How many of us have a **true** understanding (again, not just based on our favorite news station or media outlet) of the relationship between Israel and the United States? On a more personal level, how many of us have visited Israel? How many of us are currently planning a trip? What was the last Israel-themed book we read, film we saw, or restaurant we ate in which featured Israeli cuisine?

A comment about our Torat El community when it comes to Israel engagement. As Israel prepares to turn 70, we as a community should be doing more to strengthen our bond with our miraculous and complicated Jewish state. As Israel turns 70, we should pledge to do more to help her go from strength to strength. There are programs to be implemented, book clubs to be started, lectures and film series to be scheduled, Israeli food to be enjoyed, scholarships for our youth to be started, and trips to Israel to be planned. If you are interested in adding to our Israel programming, or have any new ideas for programming, please contact me directly.

One concrete place to start -- **please consider joining us on Wednesday December 13 at 7:30PM** as we welcome Rabbi Jeremy Papas who will discuss the work of AIPAC and the topic of "What's next for the Israel-U.S. Relationship?" Additionally, consider joining the Congregation Torat El delegation for Policy Conference in Washington D.C., March 2-5, 2018. Again, e-mail me directly for more information.

Seventy years after the U.N. made the establishment of the State of Israel possible, I know that all of us are proud to say *Am Yisrael Chai*, the people of Israel, the State of Israel still lives and is strong. As we enter into the next 70 years, my prayer is that they are years of engagement and interaction for us, and peace and security for the region. May Israel go from strength to strength, and may our individual and collective Jewish identity be enriched and strengthened by our interactions with our Jewish homeland.
