From The Rabbi's Study...

Sing, Dance, and Celebrate!

The holidays are in full swing. This is the time of year when we are invited to focus on the joy that Judaism brings into our lives.

After the serious work of introspection and self-renewal of the High Holidays comes the joyous celebration of Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret, and Simchat Torah. We build Sukkot and celebrate with our family and our friends. This joyous time is actually called *zman simchateynu*, the festival of our joy. According to the rabbis, this time of year is so special to God, that God wants us to continue our celebration even longer by celebrating an additional day of gathering (Shemini Atzeret). And when the season is finally “over,” we continue the celebration with Simchat Torah, a separate holiday that is all about the “simcha”, the joy of living a Jewish life, a life dedicated to Torah.

Simchat Torah has an interesting history stemming from the two different traditions regarding the reading of the Torah from the rabbinic time period. In Israel, the Torah was read through in three and a half years, while in Babylonia it was read through in its entirety every year. By the tenth century, the Babylonian tradition became dominant in the Diaspora community, the holiday of Simchat Torah, the time when we conclude the reading of the Torah and start again, was born.

If you have never experienced the joy and revelry of Simchat Torah- you are missing out. As Rabbi Nina Beth Cardin writes:

To be given a Torah to hold is to be given a license to dance. The first time one holds the Torah is often a moment of elation as well as a rite of adulthood, like being given the keys to the family car....Supportive and encouraging the congregation dances—with abandonment and love, with joy and energy. Jews dance in the synagogue and in the halls, on the lawn and on the streets. (The Tapestry of Jewish Time, 91).

I have fond memories growing up of singing, clapping, and dancing with the Torah while waving toy flags and eating popcorn and candy apples at my synagogue in San Diego. I did not yet appreciate the meaning behind what we were doing, but I understood the joy and power of the moment. As I grew older and danced in the streets of St. Louis, Jerusalem, and NY during college and rabbinical school, I came to understand and appreciate the value of this holiday as a time to celebrate our history, achievements, values, traditions, and dedication to life-long learning.

But Simchat Torah is only joyous if it is shared with others. The dance is only complete if everyone participates. To that end, I would like to invite you to join us on **Thursday night, October 20th at 6:30 PM** and **Friday morning October 21 at 9:00am** for services. Our evening service will be filled with song and dance and delicious treats and our morning service will feature a “Torah roll” where we unroll the entire Torah so that it can be seen up close from end to end. If you are interested, the Cantor and I will even help you find your bar or bat mitzvah portion! Bring your family, your friends, and people from the community as we celebrate this wonderful occasion together. Our tradition teaches in Proverbs 3:18 that *etz hayim hi l'machazikim bah-* the Torah is a life to those who grab hold of it. Join us and grab hold of the Torah as we bring in the New Year with song and dance .

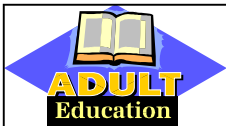

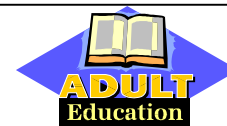

Building Update

Hopefully, most of you have had the opportunity to see the many changes that our spiritual home has gone through these past few months. We would like to take this opportunity to describe some of the projects that have been completed, advise you as to ongoing projects, and to acknowledge and thank some of the many people who have contributed their time and effort to help modernize and beautify our building.

The merging of Temple Beth Torah and Temple Beth El was not only two congregations of 600 families joining as one, but combining two buildings into one. Considering the age of both buildings, it was understood that whichever one we were to occupy would need a considerable amount of work. Once we were sure about which building Congregation Torat El would make its home, plans began to develop to update the building and combine the many artifacts and donated items. Committees were formed to develop a format for these tasks and prioritize the projects. Many hours, many meetings, and many discussions went into making the vision of Torat El a reality. Many of these discussions centered upon the tangible needs of our congregation, and many of the discussions centered on the emotional needs of our congregants. Much thought went into trying to preserve the history of our three heritage congregations while establishing Torat El as our future. The committee decided that other than the Memorial Boards in the main sanctuary, the only plaques and dedicated items in the lobby, Founders Hall, Chapel and hallway leading to the offices, would be those of Congregation Torat El. We are sure many of you have noticed that there are no dedications from Beth El, Beth Torah, or B'Nai Sholom in these areas. This may have upset or angered some of you and for that we are truly sorry. We now have a Room of Memories to honor some of the many donated and dedicated items from all three heritage congregations. It was not possible to display all of the many items and we apologize if your special item or dedicated plaque is not among those that have a place in that room. None of the dedication plaques have been destroyed, no torah covers or bimah coverings were discarded. All donated and dedicated items not displayed will be archived and held for possible future use or display.

Our projects include the modernization of our restrooms, the updates to our offices, chapel and library, the new signage welcoming all of us to Congregation Torat El, the installation of ceramic tiles in the office and school wings, the Room of Memories, a new youth lounge, and the updates to our technology needs. The three Trees of Life were combined into one and that is an ongoing project with leaves and boulders available for dedication for simchas and memorials, and the Beth Torah endowment has been renamed and dedicated to Congregation Torat El. Some continuing projects include the modernization of our kitchen and Bride's Room, landscaping, and cleaning of the façade of our building.

Each step of the way brought new challenges from leaking roofs, antiquated electric systems, termite damages, age, and decay. Through the efforts of Coastal Development, these problems and many more were disposed of and we thank Mark Haber for all of his hard work and dedication. We would also like to thank Mark Horowitz and the 2010 Hebrew School Graduation Class for our welcoming signage, Sandy and Warren Epstein for organizing the many pictures that were in our hallway into scrap books that are displayed in the library, Anne Siegel for her vision of and devotion to our library, Neil Weitzenkorn and the entire Ritual Committee of their help and input, our office and custodial staff, Joanne, Vickie, and Jacob, Rabbi Schonbrun, Cantor Siegel, Sisterhood and Men's Club for their support, and most of all Pam, who not only spent hundreds of hours helping Frank paint the office area and school wing, but was totally involved in every aspect of all the projects including organizing the move from Roseld Avenue to Monmouth Road.

As we build our new congregation, we will count on the strength and commitment of our clergy, our lay leadership, and every one of you. Torat El needs your emotional and financial support to not only survive but to thrive so that we will be here for your children, grandchildren, and many future generations.
