# From The Rabbi's Study...

#### Don't Forget To Vote- It's A Mitzvah!

When I was growing up, our local voting station was in the garage of the house next door. I have fond memories of walking with my mother to Mrs. Sweeny's house each time there was an election. I especially liked getting a sticker to show everyone that my family had voted that day! But somehow this excitement about voting diminished as I grew older, and throughout my early voting years, I became somewhat apathetic about voting. It was not until my years in Rabbinical School that I began to realize the error of my ways, recognizing that as both Jews and Americans we have the responsibility and the privilege to take this opportunity seriously. That is why each of us must make the time to vote in the November 6th election.

While we might not normally think of voting as a Jewish issue, concern and involvement with our government is a long standing Jewish value. The Mishnah in Pirkei Avot, 3:3 teaches us to:

Pray for the welfare of the government, for were it not for fear of it, people would swallow each other alive.

In line with this Mishnah, on Shabbat it has become a tradition in our community to take a few moments to recite a Prayer for our Country based on the words of Rabbi Louis Ginzberg, one of the greatest Talmudists and legal minds of our movement and of Judaism in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. But praying for the welfare of our government is not enough.

As Jews, we must actively take part in allowing our voices to be heard when it comes to the formation of our government. Judaism places significant value on being an active member of the greater community. The sage Hillel put it best when he taught: "Do not separate yourself from the community (Avot 2:5)." As Jews, in all parts of our lives, we prioritize community, from when we eat, to when we pray, and when we study.

Being a part of the community does not mean losing our individuality. Even Hillel was aware that we should constantly strive to strike a balance between our individual concerns and the concerns of the greater community. This is made clear by another teaching from Pirkei Avot:

If I am not for myself, who will be for me? But if I am only for myself-what am I? And if not now, when? (Avot 1:14).

While we must vote taking our own interests into concern, we must also remember that we are voting based on what we feel is best for our country as a whole. Additionally, we must try not to allow pessimism, or excuses like "my vote doesn't really count anyway," or "this election will be determined by a handful of states and NJ isn't one of them," or "I don't like either of the candidates," to get in our way of doing the right thing and voting in this election. We must add our voices to the broader community, and, as Hillel reminds us, "If not now, when?"

How each of us votes is an extremely personal matter, but as with all things in life we should strive to incorporate our Jewish values into this decision. Does the candidate we are choosing stand for the Jewish values of tikkun olam, healing our world, and bringing tzedakah, righteousness into our world? In general, are the candidates' stances on national and international issues, ranging from Israel to the environment, to education, aligned with Jewish values? People on either side of the aisle can disagree about policy, but Jewish values should lie at the center of the discussion.

Lastly, especially as we are coming out of the High Holiday season, let us remember to use our words, our texts, our posts and our blog comments with care. This political season has seen a lack of respect, civility, and honor for "the other" throughout. As Jews who value respectful civil discourse, and who cherish the notion that there may indeed be more than one way to look at any given issue, let us each strive to act accordingly as we lead up to, and past, this important election.

Many of our grandparents and great grandparents could not have dreamed of the opportunity to participate in setting the direction of the society in which they lived. Let us, who have this privilege and responsibility, take this obligation and opportunity seriously.
