



EMBRACING IMPERFECTION



When I was in rabbinical school I always enjoyed celebrating Sukkot at the Jewish Theological Seminary. A few weeks prior to the holiday, JTS would start putting up two sukkot that were large enough to fit 150 guests each! These sukkot took weeks to put together, were beautifully decorated, had retractable canvas roofs in case it rained, and were so sturdy that they could weather a major storm. They were almost "perfect," in part, because they were used for a major fundraiser during the weeklong holiday.

But looking back on it, the structures themselves were a bit too sturdy, a bit too durable, a bit too "perfect." Sukkot are supposed to be rickety; they are supposed to be simple. Traditionally put together immediately after Yom Kippur, with only a few days to get the job done, we are to build a structure that can have four, three, or even $2\frac{1}{2}$ walls! There should be some natural covering on top that once grew in the earth, but is no longer attached to the ground. And there must be more shade than sunlight when the skakh, covering, is on the roof. That's it. It doesn't have to be fancy. It doesn't even have to be sturdy. I can remember building one of my first sukkot and watching as it precariously leaned to one side. Thinking that it might fall over when we were eating in it that night, we tied a rope from the roof of the sukkah to a nearby tree to balance things out a bit. It wasn't pretty. It wasn't perfect. But it worked. It was good enough.

Good enough is one of the lessons of Sukkot. Those of us who strive for perfection, who want things to go a specific way in life, who insist that there is often one "correct" way to do things in order to ensure that they are done "perfectly," who work hard in school or at work to make things "perfect," often do ourselves a disservice. We are striving for a goal that is often unattainable, and generally unhealthy. Sukkot comes to remind us that life is not perfect. We cannot control every detail in life. Perfection is not even something that God asks of us in this world. Notice that when God created the world in the story of Genesis, God continually said that God's creation was "good." God even said that creation was good twice on the third day. But the text never uses the word "perfect" to describe God's creation. The story of Genesis, and the mitzvah of building our sukkot come to remind us that perfection should not be our goal in life.

As Rabbi Bonnie Koppel writes:

The mitzvah of the sukkah is just to sit there, to sit there and take it in. To sit there and realize that the sukkah is no home that we would want to live in on a permanent basis, yet, for one week, we call it good enough. Directly following all that effort during the Days of Awe focusing on the perfection of our souls, we are forced to contemplate, to surround ourselves, to just sit with imperfection.

Good enough is a hard concept. (On Sukkot)...Everything eventually fades, and while we try to keep these things alive and beautiful as long as possible, we recognize that nothing in life lasts forever... No matter how beautiful and perfect our etrog is, it will wither and lose its fragrance. Sukkot and perfection

All of this is not to say that we cannot strive for excellence in all that we do in life. But excellence is not the same as "perfection." Sukkot reminds us that we should strive to put forth our best effort in life while understanding that this is often "good enough." Sukkot reminds us to have more reasonable expectations and standards of ourselves and others. It reminds us that there is no such thing as true "perfection" in life.

Society does not do us any favors when it comes to internalizing this message. From TV to social media, to advertisements, we are sent messages that imply that there are "perfect" families, "perfect" marriages, "perfect" children, "perfect" careers, "perfect" skin, hair, clothing, etc... But as we sit in our rickety sukkot, just days after beginning a new year filled with hope, possibility, and a sense of renewal, we are taught to remember that life does not come in a neat, perfect, gift-wrapped package. Life is messy, complicated, and often imperfect. Our relationships take work, and this year (as happened last year), things will likely not always go exactly as planned. We will encounter disappointments, we will experience a lack of control; things will not go perfectly. And that will be okay. Because a healthy and well-balanced life, a life in which we value all that is sacred in this world, is one in which we learn to work with, and value, the imperfections that life throws our way each and every day.

May all of us be blessed to dwell in a *sukat shalom* throughout this coming year. May we learn to live in a state of peace, wholeness, and serenity, as we learn to accept a life of imperfection.

2017-2018 RABBI SCHONBRUN'S COURSE OFFERINGS


The Ethical Life: Jewish Values in an Age of Choice; A course in Jewish Ethics from the Jewish Theological Seminary






