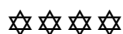

MEASURING AND MANAGING SACRED TIME

A couple of years ago I had an incredible opportunity to participate in a week-long leadership seminar through the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University. The program was designed to give Jewish leaders increased skills and knowledge in areas such as values-based leadership, financial management, fundraising, marketing, conflict resolution, creating mission-driven organizations. I have been thinking about one lecture in particular over the past few days as I begin making that transition towards the High Holy Day season. In this lecture, an internationally acclaimed CEO was trying to explain to us the simplicity behind effective time management. He opened his lecture by asking us to explain the significance of the number 168. After numerous failed attempts in a classroom filled with fairly intelligent people, many of whom had multiple advanced degrees, we gave up:

"Simple, he said: 24x7 is 168 and that is how many hours you have in a week. The question is, how do you use them?"

Immediately, I started calculating: 24 hours for Shabbat, 49 hours of sleep a week, over 40 hours on an average synagogue week, an average of 40 hours with my children each week that leaves me 14 hours to do everything else. Let's add back 12 Shabbat hours that are spent at the synagogue and sleeping which brings us to 26 hours. Subtract six hours of late night TV each week to unwind and I have 20 hours left. If I manage to exercise three times a week, that's 17 hours left. Minus grocery shopping, that's 14 hours left. All of this in a week that is not really all that busy. Not bad. But what happens with the hours that I have left and why do I seem to never have *"enough time?"* Where does all that "extra" time go?

Although I seem to have some time that is unaccounted for, I was actually fairly pleased with this

exercise because there was not a major discrepancy between how much time I spend at work and how much time I spend with my family each week. Yes, life as a pulpit rabbi is very busy, but I make sure to carve in some time in the late afternoon/early evening to see my wife and my children, eat dinner with them, and then return to the synagogue for a nightly meeting, class, etc. But I still have some questions for myself: Where does spending more quality time with my wife come in? Where does talking with my family who is out of town come in? What about reading a book for pleasure? Finding time to volunteer? Making time for Torah study that is not connected to teaching for a class?

Looking back on that lecture, and my thoughts that followed, I realize that this is exactly the type of exercise that each of us should engage in as Rosh Hashanah approaches. Similar to Shabbat, Rosh Hashanah is a holiday which asks us to focus on whether or not we are using our time wisely. Every Shabbat, our tradition asks us to reflect back on our week as we spend one day trying to focus on the more important things in life; family, community, Torah, and God. Each Rosh Hashanah, our tradition similarly asks us to look back on our year to see how we managed our time. Did we use our time for sacred purposes? What relationships did we nurture and what relationships did we ignore? What were our priorities this past year? Did our self proclaimed priorities match up with the way in which we spent our time each week?

As Rosh Hashanah approaches, I invite you to try this exercise. Start with 168 and go from there. What does an average week look like for you? Do you have any time that is unaccounted for (If so, it was probably spent on social media!)? What do you want to add into your schedule? What do you want to take out? Have you made enough time for yourself? Who and what needs more time from you this year?

What can you do this coming year to remember one of the central messages of these High Holy Days? Every hour in our life is indeed sacred and should not be taken for granted.

Wishing you and your family a *Shanah Tovah* *u'metuakah*, a good and sweet new year.

matter of course, essentially a matter of survival. But we live in America and we are blessed with countless freedoms. We live in a time when an unlimited amount of information is available at our fingertips. Why then choose to be part of our Congregation Torat El community?

Because, as Eleanor Roosevelt pointed out, the choices we make shape our lives and shape ourselves. What we choose to do impacts who we are, how we are seen, and the direction of our lives. So at this time of spiritual reflection and renewal, I ask that you each consider that your choice to be a part of our Congregation Torat El community not only shapes our congregation and the community around us - it helps define who you are.

Your choice to be here at Congregation Torat El shapes who you are, as a person, as a neighbor, as a Jew, and as a part of our "Community Building Relationships". Through our collective efforts, each day members of our community are helped, brought peace and comfort, and are moved to action and to greater enlightenment. Let us all continue the work to keep creating "community" and in so doing continue to enrich our lives. Mindful of the impacts of our choices, let us all move forward together.

HAZAK'S Camp Annual Week of Learning

As usual, the lecture topics were varied and uniformly interesting. We heard from Rabbi Barry Eckstein about Hillel, Yocahanan ben Zakkai, and Rebbe Akiva. The legends of midrash were explored with Dr. Michael Kaplowitz. Gloria Goldreich led a study of Saul Bellow using his provocative book "Mr. Sammler's Planet" Sheldon Horowitz is always entertaining explaining famous "Jewish" trials (Leopold & Loeb, Rosenbergs & Pollard).

There were two music topics: Randal Woodfield talked about Oscar Hammerstein II, the man and music. Dr. Ira Epstein explored music in Israel - tracing the history of Hatikvah. Chaim Lauer kept our attention as he explored the history and sociology of names. He talked about the origins of Bubbe Meises. Al Kustanowitz's, Creator of Jewish Humor Central, topics were Klezmer Comedy and Yiddishe Nachas and Israel is a Funny Country - a look at their TV commercials.

Audio visual aids were used very effectively.

The Hudson Valley Resort was previously the Granite Hotel. The hotel offered many activities. There were indoor and outdoor pools, tennis courts and golf was available as well. The hotel staff led yoga and other fitness activities, bingo, arts and crafts, Dancercise, ballroom dancing, Tai Chi, etc.

The setting is beautiful. While the living quarters are not new, the management kept our surroundings clean and comfortable. We had what we would call dorm food -- many starches were offered at each meal. Everything was edible.

Adding to our enjoyment were the other groups who used this venue. About halfway through our stay between 400 and 500 energetic American Korean Presbyterians took over many lecture venues. They set up classes for youngsters. They had many visual aids all throughout the hotel.

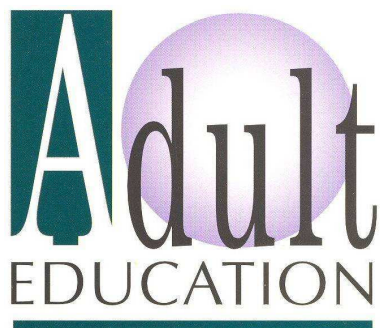

Hazzan Pomerantz-Boro of Congregation Beth El in Voorhees, New Jersey, has performed nationally and internationally, including, at the invitation of the U.S. Embassy, before a standing room only audience at the Museum of Tolerance in Vilna, Lithuania. She was featured in ABC's special, "At Evening I Seek You", and on the *Showtime* documentary, "An American Tapestry."

Among her many appearances, she has performed with the Los Angeles Jewish Symphony and the San Diego Symphony Orchestra. After one concert, *The Washington Post* reported that her "voice has all the earthiness and intensity of the finest folk singers" and was "the highlight of the evening."

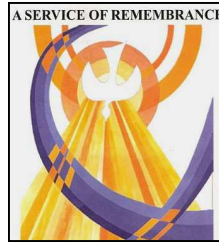

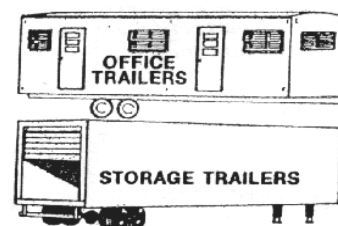
