Sukkot: Celebrating That Which Unites Us

Shanah Tovah! By the time that you read this we will be on the cusp of celebrating the new year of 5780. In the coming days we will be privileged to spend time together in prayer, reflection and song as we engage in the process of *cheshbon hanefesh*, self-introspection, and *teshuvah*, "turning" towards one another, and God, in the hopes of beginning the new year with a clean slate.

While these *yamim noraim*, days of awe, are among the most well known in our calendar, as we begin this season together I want to invite you to take a moment to consider the following holiday that sometimes gets lost in the shadow of Yom Kippur. The festival of Sukkot, celebrated just five days after Yom Kippur, is a week-long festival marking both the children of Israel's journey through the desert, and the biblical Temple festival of ingathering prior to the beginning of winter. Sukkot is a festival of welcoming, as evidenced by the mitzvah to host one another for meals in our Sukkot. And the Sukkot themselves are a reminder (coming out of the 'mortality' of Yom Kippur) that life is so very precious and fragile and that life can sometimes feel very tenuous, like the structure of the Sukkah itself. But this year, there is another theme of Sukkot that has caught my attention – the theme of unity.

Unlike almost any of our other holidays, Sukkot has a 'universal' dimension, reminding us of our connection to one another as human beings, in addition to our connection to one another as Jews. In the Talmud, in tractate Sukkah (55b), we read that: *Rabbi Eleazar taught: "Why are seventy offerings brought on Sukkot? To remind us of the seventy nations of the world."* Rashi explains that these nations of the world are invoked, specifically on this holiday, because it was on Sukkot that the world was believed to be judged by God with regard to water (rain), something that affected everyone. In other words, Sukkot was understood to have a dimension recognizing that all of God's creatures, all of humanity, were "judged" and therefore connected, in some way. The sheer volume of sacrifices offered on this festival (greater than all other festivals) was a reminder that ours is not just an Israelite God, but a God for all humanity. We all belonged, and belong, to the same human family.

Sukkot also reminds us that as Jews, we are most successful when we remember that we are all a part of one people, with shared values, shared history, and a shared heritage. In a well-known midrash, we are taught that the four species are symbolic of this unity:

Just as the etrog has taste as well as fragrance, so there are Jews who have learning and good deeds. Just as the lulav has taste (dates) but not fragrance, so there are Jews who have learning but not good deeds. Just as the myrtle has fragrance but not taste, so there are Jews who have good deeds but not learning. Just as the willow has neither fragrance nor taste, so there are Jews who have neither good deeds nor learning. To fulfill the Mitzvah, all four species must be waved together. This means that all Jews are united in destiny and all Jews are needed, even those who neither know nor do. **Midrash Leviticus Rabbah 30:12**


This ancient text makes it clear that as Jews, we function best when we are united, when we remember that service of God, that bringing God's presence into our world, can take many forms. This text reminds us that there are all different types and stripes of Jews and we would do well to embrace the value of joining together to bring the wisdom and depth of Judaism into our lives and into our world.

We are living in divisive times, as members of the human family, and as members of the Jewish people. As we prepare to celebrate this festival of Sukkot, let us pledge to focus more on that which unites us, and less on that which divides us. Can we disagree as Jews, and as human beings? Certainly. But let us do so from a place which understands the importance of finding common cause, of banding together (like the four species), striving to make a positive difference in this world. This may sometimes make us feel nervous, it may sometimes make us feel vulnerable and uncomfortable, but let us strive to be open to one another, sitting together in fragile, sacred, space – just as we do when we gather to celebrate in our Sukkot.


High Holy Day Chair and Book Breakdown



Meet Susan Leicher, author of Acts of Assumption





In America, we are good at dividing ourselves into tribes – into "insiders" and "outsiders" – based on race, religion, and beliefs. *Acts of Assumption* is the story of two young women who are outsiders even in their outsider tribes. One is the mathematically-gifted daughter of an Orthodox Jewish family and the other is the street-smart daughter of a neglectful immigrant Latina mother. Their meeting, under unusual circumstances, and their struggles with the cultural bonds of their respective communities, is a vivid story of faith, love, and family.

Ms. Leicher grew up in a Jewish and Latina family in the Bronx which gave her a keen eye for the prejudices, beauty, and spirituality of each culture. She holds two degrees from Harvard and has devoted her work life to social justice causes. *Acts of Assumption* is her debut novel.






