It Takes A Village



A story is told of a rabbi who was in charge of planning a wedding for a small village in Poland. The townspeople were poor, and the rabbi was concerned that there would not be enough food and wine to celebrate with the entire village. Fortunately, he had a plan – at least for the wine.

In preparation for the wedding, the rabbi asked the mayor to construct a huge barrel in the middle of the town square with a ladder leading to the top. Next, the rabbi asked every member of the community to come with one small pail filled with wine to contribute to the barrel over the next month. That way, when the big day came, the bride and groom could be celebrated reciting the wedding blessings over the wine, and ensuring that there was enough left over for the celebration to follow.

For an entire month, villagers from all over came to contribute to the project. As the day of the wedding approached, everyone was excited and filled with anticipation for the big moment. Finally the wedding arrived. "Mazal tov," everyone exclaimed as the music was playing and the happy couple was beginning to prepare their lives together. As the rabbi went to open the spigot, the entire village fell silent.

As the liquid started to pour out, everyone gasped. There was nothing... but water.

Each villager hung his or her head in shame as they realized that for weeks, each villager had thought that he or she could get away with pouring a pail of water in the barrel instead of a pail of wine. Each villager had expected that someone else would bring the wine and everything would be fine. But in the end, they were all left with water.

My friends, we have so much to be proud of as a community concerning the ways that we are here for one another. From caring for our members with calls and occasional food when they come home from the hospital, to showing up for one another at shiva houses, to celebrating with one another in times of joy – we are often there for each other. There are wonderful programs happening each and every day in our building and we have much of which to be proud. But lately, there is one area in particular where I have noticed that we are bringing too much water, and not enough wine.

Our daily minyan. 8am Monday-Friday, 8:30am Sunday, and 7pm Monday-Thursday.

For the first time in the nearly ten years that I have been here, this week we had an entire week without a morning minyan. And our evening minyan struggles more often than not these days to get to ten people. It is true that many of our "regulars" for morning minyan have been out of town. It is true that we are one of the few Conservative congregations to maintain a daily minyan twice a day. But it is also true that we have over 1,000 individuals above bar or bat mitzvah age in this congregation. Surely, we can find a few more than the 10-15 which show up each and every day to make sure that there is a minyan for anyone who needs to say Kaddish.

I know the challenges quite well. I know that people are working. I know that everyone's life is very busy. **But I also know that when it is a priority for people to do so, they show up.**

If you have ever shown up to services and been short of a minyan, please consider helping to make a minyan for someone else and bringing a friend. If you have ever shown up and been the tenth – thank you, and please consider doing that again and bringing a friend. If you are willing to be in our "What'sApp" group (search for CTE Minyan), we will sign you up to receive messages when we need a minyan. I am asking each of you today to do something concrete – **pick one minyan a month to try to attend and put it on your calendar**. If you show up and we are short, please don't be discouraged. Next month, bring a few more people to ensure that this doesn't happen again. Mornings take 30-45 minutes, and evenings take 15-25 minutes. In addition to helping those who need to say Mourner's Kaddish for a loved one, you might just discover that taking a few minutes of quiet reflection, prayer, and fellowship with other members of our community will also do your spiritual life some good.

The end of the story traditionally goes like this: *The villagers were distraught. The rabbi sent them all back to try again. The next time, the village had a wedding the likes of which no one had ever seen. It was filled with joy, laughter, love – and plenty of wine!*

As we continue to try to fill our barrel with wine, I thank you all for your consideration.



YEAR-END TAX REMINDER

Pay Commitment, other obligations or Capital Campaign donations with Appreciated Securities

You can contribute appreciated securities (stocks or mutual funds) held more than one year and obtain a Federal income tax deduction for the fair market value on the date of the donation. The advantage of doing this is that you avoid tax on the appreciation. For example, assume you purchased a stock several years ago for \$1,000 and the value today is \$2,500. By donating the stock you obtain a tax deduction for \$2,500 no different if you wrote a check to CTE for \$2,500. If you first sell the stock then you will realize a long-term capital gain of \$1,500, incurring Federal as well as New Jersey income tax on the gain, as high as 33% combined absent any capital losses that would offset the gain.

Pay Commitment, other obligations or Capital Campaign donations with transfer of funds from your IRA

If you have attained the age of $70\frac{1}{2}$, you have the ability to transfer up to \$100,000 annually out of an IRA to charitable organizations, so called Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD). This strategy works well for taxpayers who cannot itemize deductions for Federal income tax purposes due to the increases in the standard deduction along with the limit on deducting state income + real estate taxes. For 2019 the standard deduction for a single individual is \$12,200 and increases to \$13,850 if age 65 or older. For joint filers the standard deduction for 2019 is \$24,400 plus an additional \$1,300 for a spouse age 65 or older. If both spouses have attained age 65 the standard deduction is \$27,000. A QCD is not reportable as income nor is a charitable contribution claimed for Federal income tax purposes. If a donor is unable to itemize their deductions and is required to receive distributions from their IRA due to having attained the age of $70\frac{1}{2}$, the IRA distributions will generally be taxable with no tax deduction obtained for making charitable contributions. Using a QCD results in the IRA distribution not being subject to Federal income tax.

As always, please discuss with your personal tax adviser to see what works best for you!



Sisterhood Torah Fund Program featuring Rabbi Sally J. Priesand, first female Rabbi to be ordained in America

Rabbi Priesand received ordination in 1972 from Hebrew Union College -Jewish Institute of Religion in Cincinnati. She served from 1981 to 2006 as Rabbi of Monmouth Reform Temple in Tinton Falls and retired as Rabbi Emerita.


