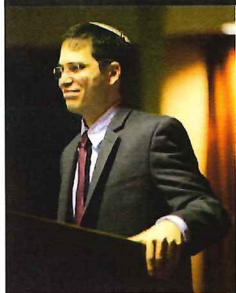

BREATHE – IT'S GOOD FOR YOU



Anyone who knows me knows that I am generally someone who is in a state of constant motion. While I can certainly “sit still,” and have no problem focusing on given tasks for extended periods of time, I have come to understand and accept that I am wired in such a way that my natural state is “on the move.” I am the person who likes seeing how much they can accomplish in a given period of time, the one who tends to keep going until I am finished with a given task, the one who has trouble sometimes stopping, slowing down, and just taking a breath. That is likely why I have taken up “running,” in recent years – the perfect activity for someone who is usually “on the go.” Of course, this is not always a good thing. Making time to pause, stop, “smell the roses,” and be more mindful in life is an essential part of cultivating a healthy emotional, physical, and spiritual well-being. That is likely one of the reasons that nearly three decades ago I began taking the practice of Shabbat and Jewish holiday observance more seriously. While slowing down did not (and still does not) come easy to me, I understood that learning to “slow down,” and even “stop (lit. *shabbat*),” would likely be good for me.

In recent years I have taken an interest in pushing myself to learn how to “slow down” a bit more. That might not always be observable to you (especially when I am speaking!), but I am working on it. It is with that goal in mind that last spring I applied, and recently was accepted to take part in a national, interdenominational Clergy Leadership Program offered through the Institute for Jewish Spirituality (<https://www.jewishspirituality.org/>). IJS is an organization that seeks to *“reclaim texts and practices from contemplative Jewish traditions, including mindfulness, meditation, yoga, singing, prayer, and working with middot (attributes/character traits), to align our behaviors with our innermost values.”* Offering courses for lay people and clergy, this organization seeks to help Jews engage their body and soul in Jewish practices grounded in mindfulness in order to help us create Jewish communities that are “vibrant, resilient, and wise,” and help us to “navigate and address the brokenness and complex challenges of our world.”

You will be hearing more about this organization as I learn more in the coming 18 months. I will be taking some online courses, and participating in four conferences over the next two years and am hopeful that this learning will deepen my personal and professional growth as a Jew and a rabbi. And of course, I will look forward to sharing my learning with all of you in the years to come.

One small example as I begin this new journey. As a part of the course we have been asked to participate in an online learning program called “The Gift Of Awareness.” The program consists of short lectures by various teachers and rabbis about issues related to Jewish mindfulness and meditation. The other day, just before Yom Kippur, I took my second course in which I learned about the power of something so simple, we hardly stop to think about it.

Breathing.

Early one morning this past week, while everyone was still asleep, I found myself listening to a lecture and practicing taking deep breaths. “Breathe in...” and “Breathe out...” The teacher leading the session online was inviting us to realize how amazing that simple act can be. Evoking the text from Genesis where God breathes life into humanity, he was reminding us that in a very real way, God’s presence still does that for each of us as we breathe each and every day. We breathe out air, the trees filter our air by taking in the carbon dioxide and releasing oxygen for us to breathe – and the cycle continues. We could not breathe without the trees and plants around us each and every day. How many times a day do you consider that? I must confess, it is something that I rarely think about. In that moment I realized that in my haste to “get so much accomplished,” I rarely stopped to consider the blessings of my very breath. A gift that many of us, I imagine, take for granted every day.

And then, just this morning, as I was saying my early morning tefilot, I noticed a line that I have raced through thousands of times, and never considered. In one of our earliest tefilot, we thank God for the gift of our soul and praise God as the one who *“machazir n’shamot le’phragim metim,”* restores souls/breath, to lifeless bodies. It was right there, in our siddur, in front of me the whole time. *Thank you, Adonai, for allowing us to breathe each and every day. Thank you God for restoring our souls, our breath, each and every day through the magnificence of Your creation and the wonders of our world.*

It is with all of this in mind that I invite you to take a moment – right now. Stop what you are doing, get yourself in a comfortable position, and take in ten slow deep breaths. Close your eyes. Appreciate the very simple act of breathing. When you are finished, slowly open your eyes and continue on with your day.

We have so much to be grateful for. Our very existence is something that we should be grateful for. But first, we have to slow down, just enough, to realize the preciousness of each breath we are blessed to take. I must confess that I am still working on it. As I begin this journey of learning through the Institute of Jewish Spirituality, I invite you to join me. I look forward to sharing my learning with you in the months and years to come. I am “mindful” that there is much wisdom to learn and internalize as I continue along my own Jewish journey.

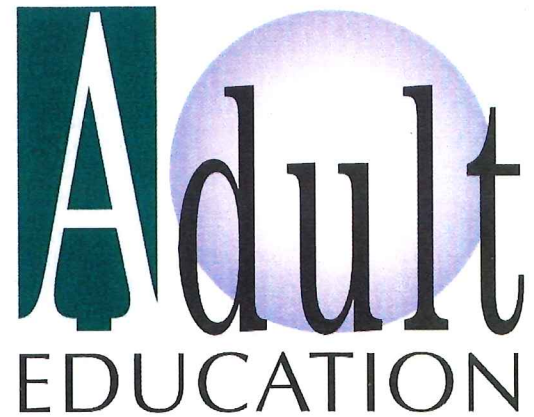

I had been asked to be present there as President of Congregation Torat El and I looked forward with anticipation and curiosity. Normally, I would have been home preparing for, or attending Break Fast with many of my friends.

So where do I begin? After a long day of fasting, I was surprised to see how many people returned for this service. The Book of Jonah was read beautifully by several of our students, followed by Neilah. It has been a tradition to invite the congregants up to the open Ark. I watched from the bima all those that stood in front of the Ark looking at the Torah's covered in white-either alone, as a couple, with their families and/or friends, to say a few words was moving. Whether they prayed, shed a few tears, blessed each other or stood in silence, the moment for each of them was so meaningful it touched my heart. Their love for Judaism and God was so apparent. At the end of the service the shofar was blown with one long blast. I stood there saying "How could I have never experienced this before."

I am looking forward to this service again next year — not because I am asked again to represent the synagogue as its President, but because I want on my own to end the holiday with this spiritual renewal.

For my Mitzvah Project, I am collecting toiletries to give to the Ronald McDonald House in New Brunswick. This started when we would collect hotel toiletries when we would travel for skating competitions. We would collect all that we could and give them to my dad because we knew he could use them on days when he was on call in the hospital and not home for the night. We would say, "We got you a gift, Dad!" and surprise him with the hotel shampoos, conditioners and soaps we received there. We collected so many toiletries that we had no room left in our linen closet! After some research on what we could do with them, we realized these were some of the most sought-after items to provide to families of sick children who were staying at the Ronald McDonald House. Since then, we have been collecting on a bigger scale to give them to those less fortunate so they too can have needed amenities. This helps alleviate worries for parents of sick children. For the homeless, they can help provide a leg up for searching for work, so any extra toiletries we receive over and above what the Ronald McDonald House can take on, we will be donating to a homeless shelter in Asbury Park.

I will put a bin out for you to place any unused toiletries (regular or hotel size) in the synagogue lobby for you to donate the next time you're in. Some examples of toiletries to donate are shampoo, conditioner, soaps, disposable razors, shaving cream, combs, deodorant, lotion, toothpaste, dental floss and toothbrushes. 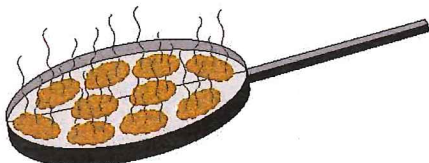

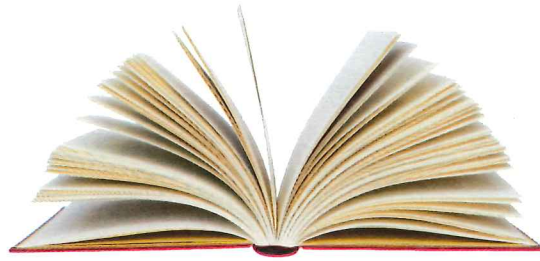

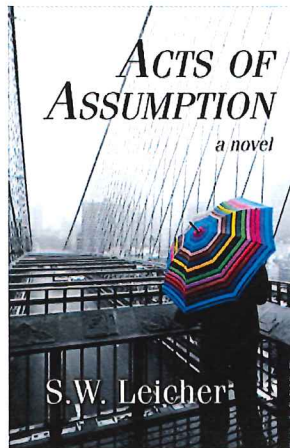

Meet Susan Leicher, author of *Acts of Assumption*



In America, we are good at dividing ourselves into tribes – into “insiders” and “outsiders” – based on race, religion, and beliefs. *Acts of Assumption* is the story of two young women who are outsiders even in their outsider tribes. One is the mathematically-gifted daughter of an Orthodox Jewish family and the other is the street-smart daughter of a neglectful immigrant Latina mother. Their meeting, under unusual circumstances, and their struggles with the cultural bonds of their respective communities, is a vivid story of faith, love, and family.

Ms. Leicher grew up in a Jewish and Latina family in the Bronx which gave her a keen eye for the prejudices, beauty, and spirituality of each culture. She holds two degrees from Harvard and has devoted her work life to social justice causes. *Acts of Assumption* is her debut novel.

YEAR END TAX REMINDER

Pay Commitment, other obligations or Capital Campaign donations with Appreciated Securities

You can contribute appreciated securities (stocks or mutual funds) held more than one year and obtain a Federal income tax deduction for the fair market value on the date of the donation. The advantage of doing this is that you avoid tax on the appreciation. For example, assume you purchased a stock several years ago for \$1,000 and the value today is \$2,500. By donating the stock you obtain a tax deduction for \$2,500 no different if you wrote a check to CTE for \$2,500. If you first sell the stock then you will realize a long-term capital gain of \$1,500, incurring Federal as well as New Jersey income tax on the gain, as high as 33% combined absent any capital losses that would offset the gain.

Pay Commitment, other obligations or Capital Campaign donations with transfer of funds from your IRA

If you have attained the age of 70½, you have the ability to transfer up to \$100,000 annually out of an IRA to charitable organizations, so called Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD). This strategy works well for taxpayers who cannot itemize deductions for Federal income tax purposes due to the increases in the standard deduction along with the limit on deducting state income + real estate taxes. For 2019 the standard deduction for a single individual is \$12,200 and increases to \$13,850 if age 65 or older. For joint filers the standard deduction for 2019 is \$24,400 plus an additional \$1,300 for a spouse age 65 or older. If both spouses have attained age 65 the standard deduction is \$27,000. A QCD is not reportable as income nor is a charitable contribution claimed for Federal income tax purposes. If a donor is unable to itemize their deductions and is required to receive distributions from their IRA due to having attained the age of 70½, the IRA distributions will generally be taxable with no tax deduction obtained for making charitable contributions. Using a QCD results in the IRA distribution not being subject to Federal income tax.

As always, please discuss with your personal tax adviser to see what works best for you!

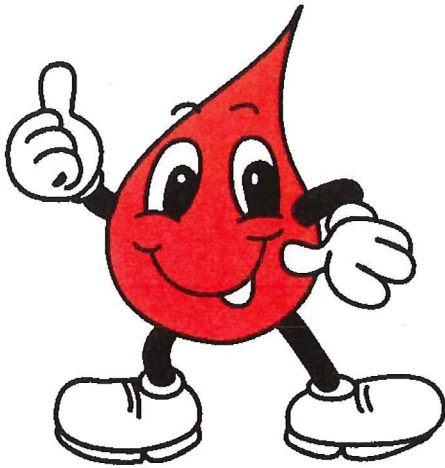

Entertaining, informative and inspirational.

Jacob's Cane: A Jewish Family's Journey from the Four Lands of Lithuania to the Ports of London and Baltimore by Elisa New (929.2 NE). This book is a well-written memoir of five generations of Professor New's family travelling from Lithuania, across Europe to America. The author is a professor of English at Harvard and the book is lyrically written and intensely researched. She blends the past and present into a beautifully written tapestry of the history of the Jews in the twentieth century.
