SHARING OUR JOY AS A COMMUNITY BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS



By the time that you read this article, Purim will almost be upon us. The month of Adar in which Purim falls is traditionally a time when we are supposed to increase our joy and laughter. As the Talmud teaches: *Mi Shenichnas Adar, Marbim be'simcha* (Babylonian Talmud, Taanit 29a), *when the month of Adar comes in, we are to increase our joy.* This is why we dress up on Purim, have a raucous Megillah reading and Purim Carnival, and come together to laugh each year around Purim through programs such as our Comedy Night. We hope that you will join us for the Purim festivities this year for some laughter on Saturday night, March 7, and traditional Purim fun on Monday night, March 9 and Tuesday morning, March 10!

Notice that the word for rejoice, *marbim,* is in the plural. We are meant to rejoice together. Our laughter is something to be shared, as the more that we share our joy with others, the more our joy is increased. Why? As Rabbi Abraham Twerski once taught: *When we share with others, their joy becomes ours.*

There is a story that comes to mind which is all about the importance of sharing our joy. It is a story called "Capturing the Moon" about the great wise men of Chelm, who always seem so foolish, but who usually leave us with a bit of wisdom at the end of their tale. In this particular story, the people of Chelm have decided that they love the moon so much, they must capture it. After all, when the moon shines brightly in the sky, all of Chelm is happy, but when it disappeared behind the clouds, everyone is in a gloomy mood. Working together day and night the wise men of Chelm come up with the plan. They will build a huge barrel of soup in the middle of the town square, and when they see the moon in the middle of the giant barrel of soup, they will sneak up on it and capture it by placing the cover on top of the barrel. The only problem with this plan is that the next evening, when the villagers go to gaze into the barrel of soup, hoping to be cheered up by the light of the moon, they discover that the moon is gone; it has somehow escaped! Looking up in the sky and seeing the moon high above, the people of Chelm cry: "Woe is us. Someone let out the moon!" For days they search the town, trying to find the culprit, only to discover that it is the last person they would ever suspect – the rabbi. "Why did you do such a thing?" the people asked the rabbi. To which the rabbi replies: "Because there are things that we enjoy while we have them, and there are other things that we enjoy only when we share them. Only when we share the moon, can we really enjoy its light. And so, I let the moon out so that the whole world can share it!" (Feinstein, Capturing the Moon)

The truly joyous things in life – from our celebration of Purim, to our celebration of birthdays, anniversaries, promotions at work, family milestones, are meant to be shared. We all know that our lives, much like the moon, wax and wane. We have good days, and we have bad days. Things can't be wonderful all of the time. But when they are wonderful, having a community with which to share the good things in our lives both increases our joy, and sustains us when the light of our lives is not shining so brightly. That is but one of the reasons that we share good news every week on Shabbat as we gather together as a community.


And yet, while we do a wonderful job sharing in our joy around Purim, and we strive to share good news each week on Shabbat, I want to challenge all of us to do a better job at sharing the light of our lives with one another on a more regular basis. In short, I want to invite us to work on sharing more of our "joys" in addition to our "oys." Our community is very good at knowing when someone dies through a Shiva e-notice, but we need to do a better job at sharing simchas with one another as well, as we celebrate the joy, life, and vibrancy in the life of our Congregation Torat El family. Did you have a new grandchild this year? Did someone in your family get engaged, married, or do you have an anniversary? And yes, we celebrate that relationship regardless of the faith or gender of your partner. Did you get a new job or did your child get into college? Back on Rosh Hashanah we shared some of these things passively on our "wall of happenings." Let's strive to do this in a more consistent and active way.

Here is what I would suggest: If you have a joyous occasion in your life that you would like to commemorate, I invite you to consider the following: join us on a Friday night, Shabbat morning, or weekday service, and let us know that you are coming, so that we can take a moment to recognize your simcha and thank God for all of the blessing and gratitude that you are feeling in your life. Call the office or send an e-mail so that we can include your simcha in our bulletin. If you are a lay leader, share your good news in a committee meeting, or if you are a congregant attending an event, share your good news with those who are sitting around you. If you have other suggestions of ways to share joyous news in and among our community, I would love to hear them. There is much light in our community to be shared. May all of us continue to laugh, celebrate, and give thanks with, and for, one another for many years to come!



Throughout the millennia, Jews have made their mark in politics and the arts. Here are five new books about famous Jews of the 20th century recently acquired by the CTE Koreen Library:

A State at Any Cost: The Life of David Ben-Gurion by Tom Segev, traces Ben-Gurion's journey from his humble birth in 1886 Poland, through his years as Prime Minister of Israel and onward. Another Israeli Prime Minister still dominating the news is profiled in *Bibi, the Turbulent Life and Times of Benjamin Netanyahu* by Anshel Pfeffer.



Crossing the ocean to the United States and turning to the arts, we read about one of the most prolific and beloved popular composers in *Irving Berlin, New York Genius* by James Kaplan. Berlin wrote over 1,500 tunes, including "God Bless America." Turning to the literary arts, *The Life of Saul Bellow, Love and Strife,1965-2005* by Zachary Leader, gives a thorough understanding of how Bellow earned multiple National Book Awards, the Pulitzer Prize, and the Nobel Prize.

The Library also has new inspirational biographies for younger readers. *The Book Rescuer* by Sue Macy, tells the story of Aaron Lansky, a mensch from Massachusetts, who deserves high praise for his work with The Yiddish Book Center. He nearly single-handedly saved 1.5 million Yiddish pieces of literature from oblivion!




