Adjusting To Our New Reality



Our youngest son looked at us the other day and whined in exasperation: "*Ugghh. Mommy and Daddy, each day just keeps going and going and going and never ends..."* Pretty perceptive for a kindergartner.

Our oldest child is hoping that somehow, on the 33rd day of the Omer, commemorating (in part) the great plague that was supposedly lifted against Rabbi Akiva's students thousands of years ago, our modern-day plague will somehow begin to abate. Since that is May 12th this year, she knows that this is wishful thinking.

As many of us sit in our homes day after day, adapting to this new reality, time seems to be moving forward, ever so slowly, in a bizarre and uncertain way. In some senses, at least on some days, we have indeed lost our bearing and one day does seem to roll into the next. Alas, it seems that there will be no "magic lifting of the plague," but rather we will all have to learn how to settle in and adjust to this new normal, at least for a while. Or course, some of this adjusting has already happened. Those who are working have had to adjust their work schedules, those who are retired have had to adjust their daily routines and planned trips and adventures in other ways, and those who still have to venture out into the real world out of necessity are doing so with a great deal of caution mixed in with varying degrees of fear. Those of us with children at home are learning to adjust to "virtual home school" alongside "virtual work," trying to throw in some time outside, family meals, and some semblance of normalcy and structure during these unprecedented times.

I have been thinking a great deal about the Talmudic maxim that *a person should always be as flexible as a reed and not as rigid as a cedar (BT Taanit, 20a).* The Talmud goes on to say that indeed the Torah, Tefilin and Mezuzot are written with a quill/reed because of the great importance that Judaism places on being adaptable and flexible. The context of that particular text has to do with forgiveness, but the lesson is applicable in a broader sense as well. These are days that truly demand a level of flexibility and adaptability to the "new normal" in which we find ourselves. Indeed, during this period of the counting of the Omer, the ancient measurement of barley (another flexible plant), this is exactly what our synagogue community, our family of families, has been trying to do as we move forward together during this difficult time.

Over the past few weeks alone, we have had services each morning and evening over Zoom; we have celebrated Shabbat, Passover services, Yizkor, and a Passover seder online; our lay leaders and staff have gathered virtually to conduct synagogue meetings; we have held classes, support groups, a Yom Hashoah program, and a Capital Campaign "thank you" to donors using a virtual platform. I have officiated over a few private funerals (including that of my own mother-in-law), and held shiva minyanim without the benefit of the physical presence of loved ones and community members. These are indeed very strange times.

But the thing about a reed is that its flexibility is its strength. I once read a teaching describing how a strong wind will uproot a rigid tree, but merely cause a reed to bend without actually snapping. In other words, if we can each work on being flexible, on adapting to the circumstances in which we find ourselves while keeping the Jewish value of health and safety at the forefront of our actions, we will have a better chance of bending, but not breaking.

As I write these words, nearly a month prior to Shavuot, I have no doubt that our Shavuot offerings will look different this year. Our usual practice of hosting many of you in our home for cheesecake and study will have to wait. Our Shavuot evening of study will continue, albeit differently, perhaps providing new and different opportunities. Programs such as Shabbat on the Beach, and even our High Holiday offerings, may have to be adjusted as we attempt to navigate our way safely through this global pandemic. Together, we will get through this, with care, forethought and flexibility, keeping our Jewish values at the center as we work to create a community that remains connected – at a safe distance.

We pray for healing for all those affected by this terrible virus. We give thanks to all who are putting their lives at risk, each day, in the service of those who are most vulnerable and struggling at this very moment. And we pray that all who have lost someone to COVID-19 somehow find comfort and consolation in the memories of their loved ones during these challenging times. Amen.

Newfield is uniquely qualified to discuss the Unorthodox series. As a young adult, he left his ultra-Orthodox community and set out to create a new life for himself. For his just-released book, *Degrees of Separation: Identity Formation While Leaving Ultra-Orthodox Judaism*, Newfield interviewed former members of the Lubavitch and Satmar ultra-Orthodox communities about their experiences leaving those sects and beginning new lives.
