STEPPING INSIDE



These days, depending on where we are going, how many people will be there, and what precautions have been taken, going inside can pose quite a risk. While we are thankfully on a downward trend in COVID-19 cases (as of this writing) in NJ, many states are seeing increases and we are far from out of the woods. Thankfully, summer is here and we are able to spend a bit more time carefully outside as we begin to venture out into a new normal, which is hazy at best.

But while we may not be able to go inside *public spaces* so easily, there is one “inside place” that this period of global pandemic might encourage us to go – and that is, inside ourselves.

Last week I studied a text with my *hevrutah*, study partner, in the clergy leadership program of the Institute for Jewish Spirituality. The text was from a book on leadership by Parker Palmer and was entitled, *Leading From Within*. The article begins by quoting Vaclav Havel, writer, dissident, and the last president of Czechoslovakia and first of the Czech Republic, in an address that he gave before Congress in 1990, in which he said that:

the salvation of this human world lies nowhere else than in the human heart, in the human power to reflect, in the human meekness and in human responsibility. Without a global revolution in the sphere of human consciousness nothing will change for the better in the sphere of our being as humans, and the catastrophe toward which this world is headed — be it ecological, social, demographic, or a general breakdown of civilization — will be unavoidable.

The article goes on to talk about the importance of “inner work” in the lives of leaders and is worth reading in its entirety. But for our purposes, I will skip to one image that Parker presents to illustrate the importance of inner work. He shares a story of a time when he went on an “Outward Bound” wilderness leadership program in which he was learning to scale down a cliff (and having a mid-life crisis)! He started out okay as he began to scale down the cliff filled with fear and dread. But at one point, he found himself in a dangerous predicament. He writes:

I was moving down that rock face, eyes on the heavens, making tiny, tiny movements with my feet but gaining confidence with every step (until)... there beneath my feet was a large hole opening up in the rock which meant that I was going to have to change directions. I froze. I have never been so paralyzed in my life, so full of physical fear... But then (the instructor) yelled up to me words that I will never forget, words that have been genuinely empowering me ever since. She said, “The motto of the Outward Bound Hurricane Island School is ‘If you can’t get out of it, get into it!’.... The answer is there is no way out of our inner lives, so we’d better get into them. In the downward, inward journey, the only way out is in and through....”

My friends, these remain challenging times “outside.” From fears related to COVID-19, to the racial tensions that have increased over these past months, to the political challenges in which this country finds itself, there is so much outside that we cannot control. But we can go inside (at least inside ourselves) to work on becoming the best version of ourselves that we can be. With more time at home, less travel, and less day-to-day demands for some, we can take time this summer to begin the work that usually leads up to the High Holidays, but in truth is a lifelong pursuit – the work of improving ourselves. This kind of work can be risky business. Taking an honest look at our lives, our shortcomings, our inner challenges, can be stressful. But as Parker correctly notes in the end of his article, when you boil down all faith traditions (including ours), they are saying one simple thing: Be Not Afraid. “*They don’t say you can’t have fear, because we all have fears, and leaders have fears aplenty. But they say you don’t have to be your fears, and you don’t have to create a world in which those fears dominate...*”

Be Not Afraid: Indeed those are the words with which we conclude the Adon Olam (*Adonai Li, v’lo eera*), *God is with me, I shall not fear.*) My friends, there is much fear all around, and we have a right to be concerned. But as we continue to make our way through these unprecedented times, let us do so with a reminder of that which we can control, of that space in which we can go inside ourselves, and then let us proceed accordingly.

What inner work do you need to be doing right now? What areas of your inner life need attention, and how might you begin turning inward, in a healthy, thoughtful, gentle, and caring way throughout the summer?

TEMPLE BETH EL CEMETERY

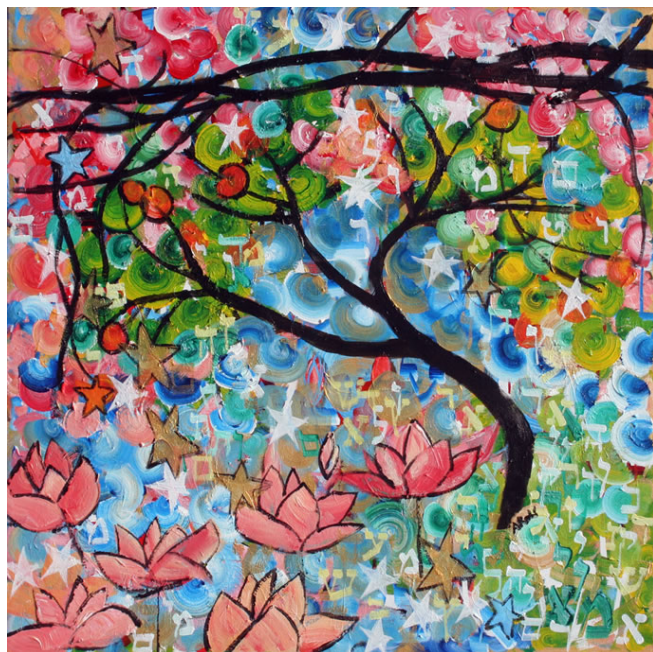

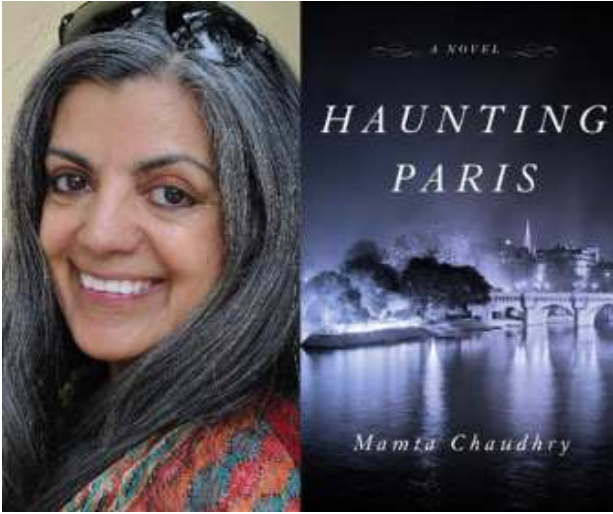
