THE MOST IMPORTANT MOMENT



The year was 2011 and the occasion was the second day of Rosh Hashanah. I delivered a sermon entitled: "Planning Less and Living More," all about how we might come to learn to "let go" somewhat of the many plans, outcomes, and desires that we all have in our lives, choosing instead to live our lives in the moment with an awareness of the gift that each day brings.

I spoke about the well-known Yiddish expression that *mann traoch, got lauch, human beings make plans and God laughs*. Who could have imagined how very true those lessons of living in the moment would prove to be to our world nearly ten years later as we continue to sit in the middle of a global pandemic and, on some days, become overwhelmed with fears and

anxieties that this period will "never end." The uncertainty, the worry, the anxiety about our future and the challenging nature of planning can get us "stuck." And if you are a planner (like me), this type of unknown future can be particularly challenging. "What will school look like in the fall?" those of us with children wonder. "What will my job look like in the coming months? Will I have a job?" we worry. "When is the next time that we will be able to visit our family, go on vacation, go shopping, go to a sporting event, get back to life?!" we ask one another. "What will our synagogue look like when we get back to 'normal;' What is 'normal?" we ask. And how is this "virtual" High Holiday experience that I received a letter about actually going to work?" (Don't worry, we are working on it and are going to do our best to make it a meaningful, multi-dimensional, comprehensive and spiritual experience)!

As I write these words it is perhaps fitting that I am in the middle of a week-long virtual "zoom retreat" with cantors and rabbis across the country and across denominations about creating a mindfulness practice. Through the study of mystical and Hasidic texts, and employing mindfulness practices of the body, soul, and mind – we are being taught how to be more present in our lives, more present in each moment as it arises. How might we learn to accept whatever is happening at a given moment; not necessarily to acquiesce to it, not necessarily to challenge it, but rather to understand it and then decide how best to proceed. In some ways my exploration of this neo Hasidic spiritual practice of mindfulness is a more sophisticated version of what I was trying to get at in that sermon ten years ago about learning to be present in our lives. And it most certainly has bearing on this moment in which we find ourselves.

For so many of us, making plans has come to a standstill. We simply do not know what the future will bring and can't even make a very good educated guess. Even when we do plan and look forward, many of us have come to recognize and appreciate in this time of COVID-19, just how much we make plans and "God laughs." We have come to understand just how much the universe simply does not always want to cooperate with our hopes and desires.

So what are we to do? How are we to respond? For that I turn to a story that I shared in that very same Rosh Hashanah sermon years ago. It is a story about a Hasidic rabbi who asked his students to describe the most important moment in history. The students responded with many suggestions, including the crossing of the Red Sea, the giving of Torah on Mount Sinai, and the conquest of Jerusalem. But none of them were correct. What was the most important moment in history? The most important moment, taught the rabbi, is right now (Feinstein, World of High Holidays, Vol.3).

Hayom, (today) we will say toward the end of our Rosh Hashanah service from across time and space as we gather virtually this year, holding one another together even as we dwell physically apart.

Today.

Today is the most important moment that we have. Today is the most important moment to cherish. Today is the moment that we are so blessed to have. Today is the day that we must strive to wake up to our lives and pay attention to the blessings that we have amidst life's challenges.

Like many other moments in our daily lives, there is no question that the ritual experience of these upcoming High Holidays will be strange and different, filled with loss, and filled with excitement at meeting the challenges of the moment. But let us remember that they will also be filled with a constant and wise truth; with a recognition taken from the Rosh Hashanah liturgy that *hayom harat olam*, today — the world was created, yet again. Today, we are blessed with another day, with a world that is open to us. Today we are blessed and challenged to be present with all that we have. Today, and every day, we are called on to appreciate the truth of our daily lives, of our existence, and remind ourselves that it is this very awareness that can and will help us make it through the challenge and blessing that we call life.

With blessings and wishes of health and safety for you and your loved ones as we prepare to begin a new year together.




