THIS IS THE YEAR TO BUILD A SUKKAH IN THE BACKYARD



As you read these words, we are a couple of weeks away from the Yamim Noraim, the Days of Awe. As I have written and shared with you in classes and weekly messages over these past few weeks, this Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur will surely be like no other. As we begin to re-examine our lives and work to improve ourselves during Rosh Hashanah, and face our mortality on Yom Kippur, this year the themes of these Days of Awe are all too real. How would we behave if we knew that today was our last day, asks Yom Kippur? What would we do, if we truly understood that each of us only has a very limited time in this world – we are to ask ourselves? Do we wake up each day committed to creating the best versions of ourselves that is possible – we are to

consider. The past six months of living through a global pandemic have raised these questions as well, and in some senses we have been living this High Holidays season for some time now.

Enter Sukkot. Sukkot is about rebuilding. Sukkot is about looking forward and re-entering into a world once we have faced our mistakes, worked on our flaws, and considered our mortality. There is a custom that the very first thing we are to do when Yom Kippur is over is put the first nail in our Sukkah — a sign that we are committed to rebuilding anew this year. But notice what we are building. A rickety, wobbly dwelling place whose structural soundness, if done "correctly," is questioned at least once! As I write these words I recall entering into a Sukkah once that was hastily put together by people with little experience in construction or engineering. When Jane-Rachel and I walked into the Sukkah to be the first ones to "check it out," it immediately collapsed in on us! Luckily, no one was hurt. But that's the thing about Sukkot. We purposely build structures that are fragile, that are not completely sturdy, and are subject to the elements, because life (as we certainly know) is sometimes that way.

But notice what we do next. We move into these fragile structures to study, to eat, and sometimes even to sleep!

As we re-enter the world after Yom Kippur, we do so with a recognition that life is so incredibly fragile. We do so with an understanding that no "shelter" can give us a 100% guaranteed protection from life's dangers, challenges, and disappointments. We can take all of the "right precautions" and there are still risks involved (sound familiar?). This is not to say that we should be cavalier about protecting ourselves from life's challenges; we should be smart and safe in life (wear your masks) – always choosing to protect human life that is so sacred. And yet, at the same time, each of us is being invited to recognize that there is an element of uncertainty in life as we go about "living" anyway. Yes, it's true that we might build our Sukkah, have bad weather, and then have to come back inside. Sometimes, you make a plan and then have to have a contingency plan (sound familiar?). And yet – we build, we set the table, we make our meals, and we venture outside hoping for the best each year. And yet our tradition asks us to hold onto our "faith" – our faith in life, our faith in ourselves, our faith in our community, and our faith in God, and enter out into that Sukkah.

So this year, if possible, I want to encourage you to build a Sukkah at home and "dwell" in that space in celebration, in defiance, and in deep appreciation for all of the blessings that you still have despite COVID-19. Build a Sukkah and either dwell in it with your family, or with anyone who has been in your "pod" and with whom you can safely gather. If you are unable to build a Sukkah, but someone who you have been around safely over these past few months has one – bring your mask, sit six feet apart (inside or even outside and somehow safely "taking turns" in the Sukkah) and celebrate the gift of this often underappreciated holiday. If you have questions, I am happy to speak with you, or you can search online for Sukkah kits and a variety of practical suggestions.

We are living in challenging times. We are living in a world that is ever so fragile. And yet if we are blessed to still be here, then we should take time to celebrate that blessing. Build the Sukkah.
