In Search Of The Light



We are a few weeks away from celebrating *Hag Ha-Urim*, The Festival of Lights, the festival of Hanukkah. *Mai Hanukkah*, our sages in the Talmud ask, what is Hanukkah all about? Where does the custom of lighting the *Hanukkiah* originate, as it is not mentioned in the Torah or the rest of the Tanakh (Hebrew Bible)? What flows from that question is the well-known story concerning the miracle of the oil that lasted for eight days, and a discussion of the ways to light the Hanukkah Menorah in our homes. It has always fascinated me that the main focus of Hanukkah, particularly in the Diaspora, has revolved around the ritual of lighting candles. Why did a holiday celebrating a military victory of the Maccabees over the Hasmoneans, and the

rededication of the Temple, turn into a home holiday focused on the lighting of lights? In part, this is because the seven-branched Menorah was a prominent part of Temple ritual. But I think there is something more going on here. Historically speaking, the odds were stacked against Judah and the Maccabees. By all logic, they should not have been able to defeat the mighty Assyrian army as they fought for their religious freedom. But despite the odds, despite the darkness that surrounded them, they survived and thrived and squeezed out the tiniest bit of oil and light that was physically and spiritually left over, to bring forth a light that would continue to shine for generations to come.

The *Hanukkiah* became such an important symbol because the light represents hope.

We, too, are living in a time where there is considerable darkness surrounding us. This festival will mark an almost complete cycle (Purim will be the final one) where we are celebrating our traditions wearing masks, and/or looking through screens, as we search desperately for small pockets of light to help us get from one day to the next, one week to the next, one month to the next. But the lesson of Hanukkah is that we only need a little bit of light to get us from one moment to the next. With one small cruse of oil, or one small *shamash*, helper candle, we can make things brighter. As the 10th-century Spanish philosopher Bahya Ibn Paquda taught: "A little truth overcomes much falsehood, as a little light dispels much darkness."

In a book of Hanukkah readings, I recently read a story of Rabbi Leo Beck, a 20th-century leader of Reform Judaism and the German Jewish community during World War II. The last duly elected and appointed leader of the German Jewish community, Beck had opportunities to leave Germany before the war, but when given the opportunity to get out of Germany immediately following Kristallnacht in 1939, Beck said: "*I will go, when I am the last Jew alive in Germany.*" Beck ended up in Theresienstadt, where he was known by the Nazis, and received direct threats on his life from Eichmann himself (among others, I am sure). When reflecting on his experience during the war, Beck once said: "*Whether one survived in a concentration camp, depended outwardly on circumstances: disease, torture, annihilation could destroy one's life. But whether one could survive inwardly depended on two other qualities: patience and imagination.*" He defined patience as "*the power of resilience that did not let the will to live give way*" and imagination as "*the vision that ever again and in spite of everything makes him see a future.*" (Baker, Freidlander, Leo Beck's Spiritual Resistance against the Nazi Regime).

Light is such a powerful and important symbol of Hanukkah because it reminds us that, in spite of everything, there is a future. And that future, if we have patience, and use our imagination, and dare to dream a bit, might even contain a great deal of light. We are all getting so tired of this pandemic. We don't feel like we have any patience left on some days and it is hard to use our imaginations. We see the hundreds of thousands of deaths, the millions of people struggling with COVID-19 around the world and we struggle. And that is because the darkness is real – as real as the darkness of war from the time of the Maccabees, to the Second World War, and beyond.

But this year, as we look at our Hanukkah lights, as we place them in our window sills for the world to see, let us take a few moments to focus on the lights. This year, let us sit, and stare into the flames, as we hold onto that which brings light in our lives today, and dare to hope for a future that is brighter. This year, let us remind ourselves, in the depths of our hearts and souls, to never give up hope in a future filled with a light that shines amidst the darkness.

One of Candy and Michael Friedman's favorite tourist destinations is the exotic Kingdom of Morocco.

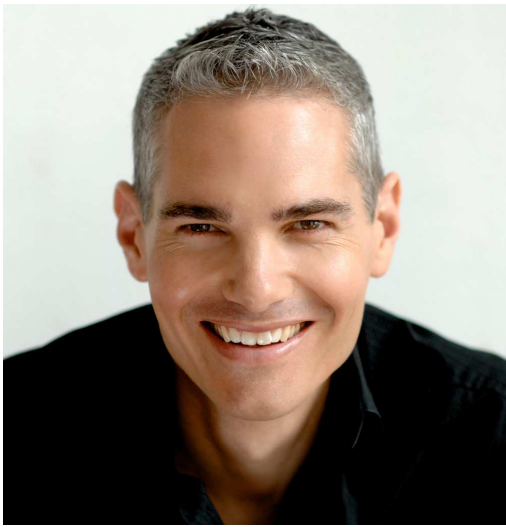

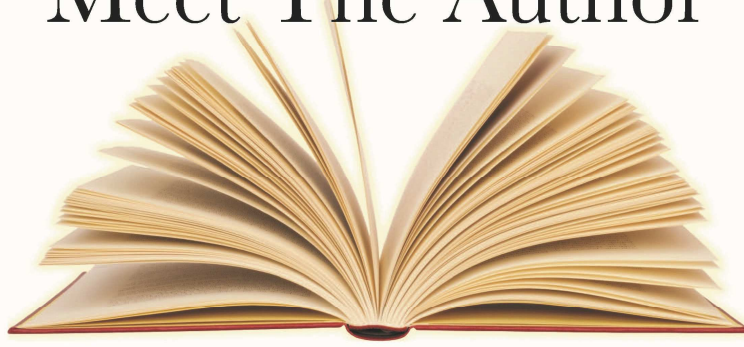

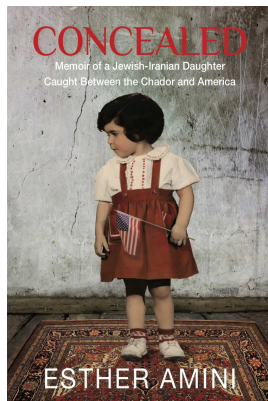

Meet Esther Amini, author of *Concealed*



Concealed is a memoir of a Jewish-Iranian daughter caught between Chador and American values. Esther Amini grew up in a Persian-Jewish household in Queens, the daughter of tradition-bound parents from Mashad, Iran's holiest city. She explores the little-known history of Mashad's underground Jews, the incident that steeled her mother's resolve to leave, and her parents' arduous journey to America, as well as the conflict she feels between her indebtedness to her parents and her desire for more self-determination than their traditions allow. Ms. Amini deftly weaves the themes of concealment and visibility in this moving view of culture and family.

Esther Amini is a writer, painter and psychotherapist. Her work has appeared in *Elle*, *Lilith*, *Tablet* and *The Jewish Week*. Her memoir evolved from an award by Aspen Word of an Emerging Writer Fellowship in 2016. Her works have also been performed by the Jewish Women's Theater in Los Angeles, where she was the Artist-in-Residence in 2019.
