



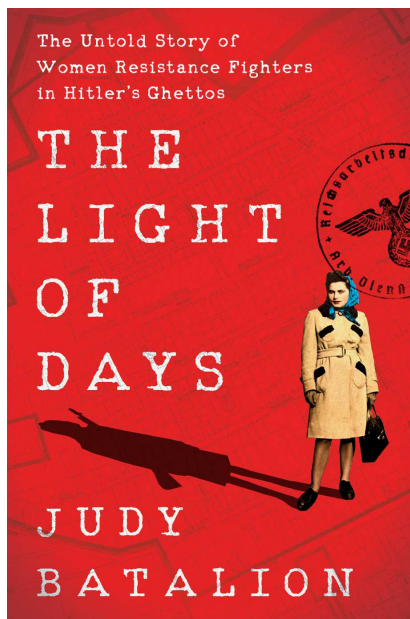

Meet Judy Batalion, author of *The Light of Days*



The Light of Days tells one of the most moving stories of WWII: witness to the destruction of their families and communities, a group of Jewish women in Poland, some of them just teenagers, transformed Jewish youth groups into resistance cells to fight the Nazis. These "ghetto girls" did whatever was necessary to achieve their goals, anything from blowing up train lines to bribing and enticing Nazi soldiers. This powerful and inspiring book has been optioned by Steven Spielberg for a major motion picture.

Judy Batalion was born and raised in Montreal and is fluent in Yiddish and Hebrew. She has written two previous books as well as pieces for magazines, *The New York Times* and *The Washington Post*.

Explaining, Exploring, and Embracing Our Jewish Identity



One of the most oft-quoted jokes at every Jewish holiday is “They tried to kill us; we won; let’s eat!” Even though the joke is both predictable and overused at this point, it almost always gets a chuckle. Why is that? Perhaps because underneath the joke, we understand its truth. We are a people who have suffered. From the days of Egypt, the destruction of the Temples, the crusades, the Spanish Inquisition, the pogroms, the Holocaust, terrorists in modern-day Israel, and modern-day anti-Zionism and anti-Semitism, we know what it means to face persecution as a people. And yet, we declare proudly, we are still here, let’s eat!

But there is a problem with this joke (I know, I know, it is just a joke). But what I mean is that the joke defines Judaism solely in terms of suffering. It defines our celebration, our moment of spiritual gathering, the collective wisdom and ritual of our people, through a lens of persecution alone. And the problem is that Judaism, as a way of life, as a spiritual discipline, as a source of wisdom, is much more than that.

Over these past few months I have been privileged to facilitate an online course of lectures put out by the Jewish Theological Seminary entitled: Beyond Dispute: Debates That Shaped Jewish Life. In one of our final lectures, we discussed this very challenge when it came to how we engage with the memory of the Shoah, the Holocaust. The question on the table was how much weight the memory of the Holocaust should have when it comes to our modern-day Jewish practice. On the one hand, the lecture quoted thinkers like the 20th-century Reform rabbi and German born philosopher, Emil Fackenheim, who emphasized that out of the ashes of Auschwitz came a 614th commandment – to survive as Jews, to remember those who perished, and never to despair of God, or the world as a place that can become filled with God’s presence. On the other hand, we studied thinkers like Rabbi Marc Gellman who writes: “I am Jewish because my mother is Jewish, and, more importantly, because I believe Judaism is loving, just, joyous, hopeful and true. I am not Jewish, and I did not teach my children or my students to be Jewish, just to spite Hitler.”

Let me be clear – no one is arguing that Holocaust education, and the responsibility that comes along with the memory of those lost, and all who have suffered and been victims of Jewish hatred across the ages is not something that we must take seriously. Of course we must, we do, and we will. All we have to do is look at the daily news, in our country and around the globe, in political parties left, right, and center, to see that anti-Semitism is alive and well. We dare not forget, even for a moment. And we must use our memory to combat hatred of Jews in particular, and all of God’s creatures who are persecuted more generally.

But should our Jewish identity be rooted solely in persecution? While this is, unfortunately, a necessary part of our identity, it is, in my opinion, not sufficient. Being Jewish is more than “they tried to kill us; we won; let’s eat.”

This month, as Jews around the world gather (likely virtually) to commemorate Yom Hashoah, Yom Hazikaron and Yom Ha Atzmaut, Holocaust remembrance day, Israel’s memorial day, and Israel’s independence day, I invite you to consider your own Jewish identity. Why are you Jewish? Why do you care? Why should your children and grandchildren care? What wisdom has Judaism given you in your life? What does Israel mean to you, with all of its accomplishments, and challenges? How much of your identity is defined by persecution, and how much of it is rooted in the wisdom and blessing of our people? What does the Jewish lifecycle, from a given day, to a given week, to a given year, mean to you? Do the stories of our people, or the texts of our tradition, play a role in your daily life? How much of your Jewish identity is shaped by your belief in God?

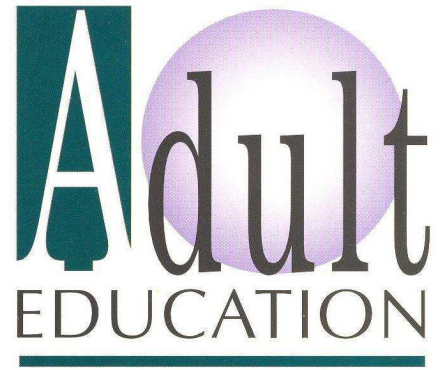
If you are not sure about the answer to any of these questions, if you are not sure what I mean about Jewish wisdom, the texts of our tradition, or your belief in God, feel free to reach out to me (rabbi@torat-el.org). I would love to hear from you and engage in this discussion with you.

The depth of the well that is Jewish life and living is much too deep to simply exist as a reaction to hatred and persecution. Yes they tried to kill us, yes we sometimes won, but no, that is not and cannot be the sole reason for embracing Jewish identity and the incredible role that Torah can play in our lives. As we approach this important time in our Jewish calendar, one in which we recall the memory of those lost in the Shoah, and celebrate the miracle that is the modern State of Israel, may we honor this moment in our calendar by considering these questions. May all of us be blessed to be students of this incredibly rich tradition, and may it continue to bring meaning, wisdom, purpose and the light of God’s presence into our lives, and into our world, for generations to come. As our sage Hillel once concluded, when responding to a convert about the essence of Judaism (as a discipline for human interaction) I invite you to now go and study. May your learning, and the wisdom of our tradition, bring blessing, joy and light into your soul.

TRADITION AND CHANGE: THE EVOLUTION OF JEWISH MUSIC

Dr. Marsha Bryan Edelman holds degrees in general music, Jewish music and Jewish history from Columbia University and the Jewish Theological Seminary. Author of "Discovering Jewish Music" (Jewish Publication Society, 2003), she has written extensively on the nature and history of Jewish music, and has been acclaimed across the US and Israel for the breadth and popular appeal of her presentations. An active musician, she also serves as Director of Education for the Zamir Choral Foundation, and teaches part time at the H.L. Miller Cantorial School at JTS.

Our discussion will include thoughts on what it was like growing up as the child of a survivor and how that affected one's world view and Jewish identity.

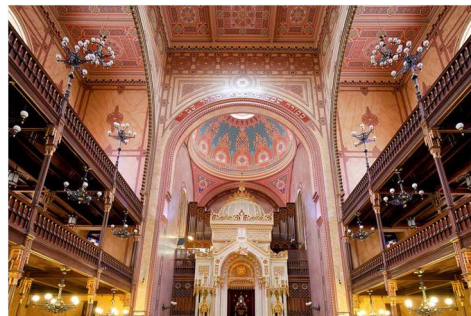

NEIGHBORHOOD FOOD DROP

Hunger in this Land of Plenty! Yes, there is hunger in our back yard. Sometimes it is even next door, but most of the time we don't know about it. We all know what it feels like when we are hungry because our dinner is late. Now imagine a child experiencing that hunger while waiting for lunch at school, every morning, because there was not enough food at home for breakfast! Imagine a senior citizen going to bed feeling that hunger because they couldn't afford a decent dinner. Imagine never knowing if you will be able to feed your family three proper meals a day, or feeling that hunger yourself because you gave your food to your family. "Food Insecurity" — the lack of enough food to lead a healthy and active life — exists in New Jersey, in Monmouth County, in Ocean Township, Eatontown, Long Branch, even in your neighborhood!

Pre-COVID, Fulfill (formerly the Food Bank of Monmouth and Ocean Counties) was serving 136,000 people, 50,000 of them children, per year. By April of 2020, it was reporting a 40% increase in demand, to over 200,000 people.

What can we as a synagogue, and you as a member, do in the face of the suffering of so many? One of the cornerstone obligations we have as Jews is to perform *gemilut hasadim*, acts of loving kindness. And what could be a greater act of loving kindness than helping to feed the hungry? And so, out of loving kindness, we are introducing Torat El's **"Neighborhood Food Drop."**

Starting after Passover, here is how it will work:

1. We have established a network of volunteers who will be accepting food donations in their neighborhoods on an ongoing basis. (See the list below.)
2. During the second full week of each month (4/11, 5/9, 6/13), Sundays thru Thursdays, you may drop off your food donation in the designated collection container that will be at each Neighborhood Food Drop location. (Please, no drop offs on Friday or Shabbat.)
3. Only canned and boxed foods should be donated. *Please, nothing refrigerated or frozen, and nothing with an expired "use by" date.*
4. At the end of each collection week, a volunteer will collect the donated food items and deliver them to Fulfill on behalf of Congregation Torat El.
