MY HEART IS IN THE EAST: REFLECTIONS ON THE RECENT FIGHTING IN ISRAEL



As I write these words, Israel has just entered into a ceasefire with Hamas. With thousands of rockets fired into Israel from Gaza over the past week and a half, riots throughout Israel between some of the Arab and Jewish Israeli population, sirens going off at all hours forcing Israelis to run for cover and/or sleep in a *miklat*, bomb shelter, the actions of this past week have been devastating and extremely disheartening.

I spoke at length about this latest round of fighting over one Shabbat morning last month, but wanted to add some brief observations to consider here as well. In addition to the violence, the loss of lives both of innocent Israelis and Palestinians, and the seemingly intractable situation that Israel finds itself in these days when it comes to the *matzav*

(literally 'situation') as it is known in Israel, the vitriol and ignorance on this side of the ocean and around the world was both frustrating and astounding.

Throughout the past couple of weeks, our oldest daughter has been paying close attention to the news. Between an old classmate who now lives in Israel, our old Israeli au pair, Yemi, who helped care for our kids and lives outside of Tel Aviv, elementary school teachers who are Israeli and instilled in her a sense of *ahavat yisrael* (love of Israel), other friends and family in Israel, not to mention her social media feeds, she has many points of connection to the situation. Glued to her phone when she was not in school, she found herself spending a lot of time on social media with people who were trying to vilify all Israelis, vilify all Palestinians, or claim to have a clear understanding of a conflict that has raged on for hundreds of thousands of years. She had many questions, showed a lot of empathy, and we did our best to remind her that Israel is often portrayed unfairly, and that there are also innocent Palestinian parents who are just as worried about their children this week as Israeli ones. We did our best to remind her that both of these things can be equally true and tried to teach her that anyone who claims to have a simple answer about the *matzav* does not have any clue as to the complicated picture that is the Israeli/Palestinian conflict, and that decisions leaders, of whatever type, do not always represent the will of all of the people that they claim to represent. We also spent a good deal of time debriefing and explaining the myriad "memes," tweets, and posts on social media that tend to show only one perspective and thrive on simplicity instead of nuance.

When it came to the anti-Semitism that is so clearly a part of this situation, we did our best to both reassure her, and remind her that unfortunately, anti-Semitism is precisely the thing that must inspire us to be both proud Jews, and human beings who speak out against hatred, intolerance, and bigotry of any kind. As she became aware of things like the Hamas charter that quite literally calls for the expulsion of Jews from Israel, to tactics of BDS that are rooted in anti-Semitism (whose co-founder Omar Barghouti has explicitly explained that he "opposes a Jewish state in any part of Palestine"), to the hate crimes around the United States this past week using anti-Israel sentiment to harass and cause bodily harm to random Jews walking the streets in New York and Los Angeles (among other incidents), we tried to be reassuring. But as Jews, and as parents, it is both frightening and disheartening to see what is going on around the globe, and here at home, when it comes to anti-Semitism that tries to be disguised as "simply anti-Israel."

None of this is simple. All of it is challenging. And so the question becomes, what are we, as American Jews, as parents, as grandparents to do about it? To this I have a few suggestions:

1. Get educated. If you don't feel that you have a good grasp of the situation in Israel, of the history, of the complexities of the situation, it's time to read up. I just finished a wonderful book by Noa Tishby entitled: *Israel, A Simple Guide to the Most Misunderstood Country on Earth*. Read it, and buy a copy for your children and grandchildren. It is a good place to start.

If you like to read Israel info online, check out everything from left, right and center (haaretz, jpost, timesofisrael, ynetnews).

Look for information in the mainstream American Jewish community – Federation, AIPAC, AJC (more centrist), FIDF, New Israel Fund (if you want a more progressive picture).

To combat anti-Israel sentiment on college campuses, check out standwithus.org (further right, but a good defense for college students, clear and helpful).

If you want to get into the complexities on the ground with organizations in Israel, there are so many to choose from. I have been reading posts from organizations such as "Encounter" and "The Hartman Institute" to name but two. Check them out.

- 2. Let your representatives know that you care and that you stand with Israel. That does not mean that you have to agree with all of Israel's policies, etc. But preserving the bipartisan American commitment to the State of Israel is so very important. AIPAC is a wonderful and important organization committed to this work.
- 3. Call, write, email, Facetime friends and family in Israel. Even if it has been a long time, now is the time to let them know that we are thinking about them and we care.
- 4. Don't be afraid to pray for peace, for better lives for innocent Israelis and Palestinians who just want to live normal lives, and for wise and thoughtful leaders who can help bring an ever-elusive peace to the Middle East.

My friends, these have been difficult times. But, like the Israel national anthem itself exclaims, we must have *tikvah*, we must have hope that a solution to these challenges will ultimately be found. May we reach the time when Israelis and Palestinians will live in peace; when Israel will be a place where mutual respect, tolerance and religious co-existence can be shown to thrive. May Israel continue to be an inspiration to the world in so many ways, a safe-haven for Jews everywhere, and a homeland to all Jews who wish to re-connect to their ancient roots. *Am Yisrael Chai*, I am confident, even in these times, that the people of Israel will continue to live on, will continue to survive, and will one day yet find peace with her neighbors.






