Tickets for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services were mailed Friday, August 27 to those of you who made ticket reservations. They should reflect the selections you made on the Reservation Form you submitted to the office. If you see an error, please call the temple office as soon as possible so that we can correct it. If you didn't order tickets and would like to attend services in person, please contact the office immediately. Our last day in the office prior Rosh Hashanah is Friday morning, September 3.

During these unprecedented times, we are continually trying to balance the safety of our congregation and staff with our desire to worship together.

To that end, please familiarize yourself with the policies and procedures below to minimize any inconvenience or confusion.

- ◇ Face coverings are required at all times in all areas of our building by everyone over the age of 3.
- ◇ As you approach the building, please wear your face covering and have your ticket and photo ID ready for inspection. No one will be admitted without a ticket. Our volunteers have been instructed to ask for ID from everyone, regardless of how well we know you.
- ◇ Please note that tickets must be presented at all Erev and other services. Make sure you bring the correct ticket with you.
- ◇ Once inside the building, please find your way to your selected seating section. There will be absolutely no lingering in the lobby before, during and after services.
- ◇ If you are sitting in the Founders' Hall, kindly sit in a cluster of seats that matches the number of people in your family. This will help eliminate unnecessary disturbances during the service.
- ◇ If you are attending the early session for Rosh Hashanah Day 1 and/or the early session for Yom Kippur, we ask that you promptly and safely exit the building and parking lot at the conclusion of the service so that we may prepare for the arrival of those who are attending the later session.

If you are planning to Livestream any of our services, you may pick up a prayer book and Book of Life in the temple office during regular business hours.

On behalf of the staff, Officers and Board of Trustees of Congregation Torat El, I wish you a safe and enjoyable Labor Day weekend, and look forward to greeting you during the High Holy Days.

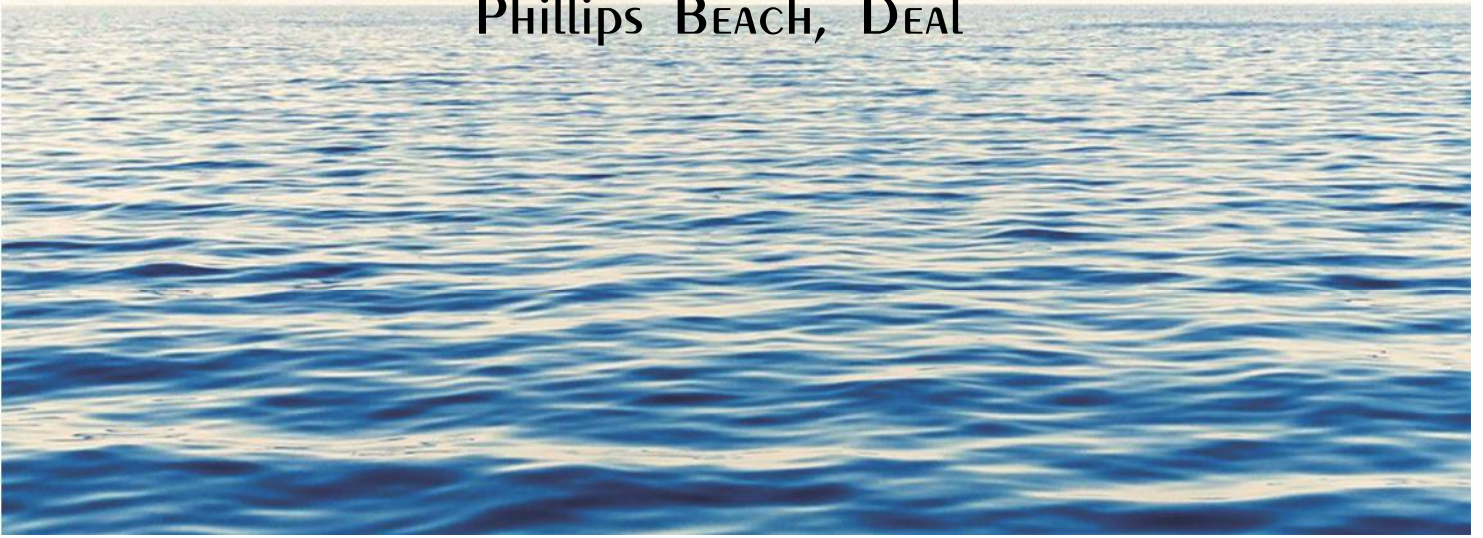

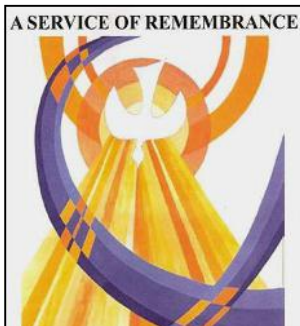

WANDERING INTO A NEW YEAR



You have heard me tell this story many times. The one, told by S.Y. Agnon about a man who found himself wandering about in a forest for several days, not knowing how to find the right way out. Suddenly he saw another man approaching him and his heart filled with joy! "Now I shall certainly find out which is the right way," he thought to himself. When they neared one another, he asked the man, "Can you tell me which is the right way out of the forest? I have been wandering around lost for several days!" The second man replied, "I do not know the way out either. And I too have been wandering about here for many, many days. But this I can tell you: do not take the way I have been taking for it will lead you astray. Let us, instead, look for a new way out together." (Adapted from, Agnon, *Days of Awe*, 22).

My friends, many of us are likely feeling exhausted, frustrated, and bewildered that we have been wondering about in a COVID-19 forest for nearly 18 months at this point. How can it be, we wonder, that we are still here? While we feel blessed to approach yet another Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur season together, many of us can't help but feel that the path on which we are currently wandering is eerily familiar. We thought we were one place in May, and now just four months later, we are back to questions about masks, vaccination status, new variants, indoor versus outdoor activities, various types of gathering, our synagogue programming for the year, etc. The month of Elul is usually a time filled with hope, joy, possibility and renewal, and yet, many of us are tired – mentally, spiritually, and emotionally worn out. What wisdom might this story, might this time of year offer us?

I once had a colleague share with me that the interesting thing about this story is that the two men don't ever seem to find their way out of the forest. God willing, we will eventually find our way past these pandemic times, but it is instructive to remember that perhaps the message is that **how** we walk amidst uncertainty is as important as any destination as we make our way through uncertain moments in the forest of life.

None of us can know what the future will bring. Just take a moment to think back to last Rosh Hashanah and ask yourself what happened in this past year that was unexpected. I am sure there were many things. As our High Holiday liturgy reminds us, none of us can know with certainty "who will live and who will die," who will be filled with more fortune, and who with less. Indeed, Deuteronomy teaches us that "the hidden things belong to God and the revealed belong to us." None of us can even know, with certainty, the consequences of our decisions or actions at any given moment of any given day. Indeed, we are often surprised, sometimes in positive ways and other times in negative ways, when the unexpected comes to pass. Our sages teach: *Eyze Hu Chacham*, who is wise? *Ha ro-eh et ha nolad*, the person who foresees the consequences of his or her actions," say our sages. (Taamid 32a). The inference here is that true wisdom and absolute clarity are hard, if not impossible, to come by. Most of us, are just not that wise.

But while we cannot predict the future, even as we grow weary about the present, we can control how we behave at any given moment of any given time. We can control whether or not we are the type of people that will, like the second man in the story, lend a hand to those in need. Think back to this past year. Who has reached out to you, and what has that support meant to you? As we enter into a new year, to whom might you offer a helping hand as we navigate these challenging times? Wandering about the forest of life, especially during challenging times, is infinitely less lonely and less frightening if there are others wandering alongside of us.

In the book of Joshua, after Moses has died and Joshua is commanded to lead the children of Israel into the unknown that is settling the Land of Israel, God instructs Joshua, *chazak ve-ematz*, "be strong and of good courage" and remember to observe faithfully all of the Torah that Moses commanded you... that you may be successful wherever you go (1:7). As we walk into this New Year, into the unknown that is eerily familiar, let us choose to walk forward with hope and courage, instead of fear and trepidation. Let us take the advice of Joshua, making sure to let the wisdom of Torah, of our faith, be our guide. As Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel once taught: *While it is important to feel anxiety, it is sinful to wallow in despair. This world, this society, can be redeemed. God has a stake in our moral predicament... The greatest heresy is despair, despair of men's power for goodness, men's power for love...*

May we move forward into this 5782 with hope, courage, compassion, and empathy – for ourselves, and for one another. From my family to yours, I pray that this year brings blessing, meaning, purpose, and good health to all. *L'Shanah Tovah*.

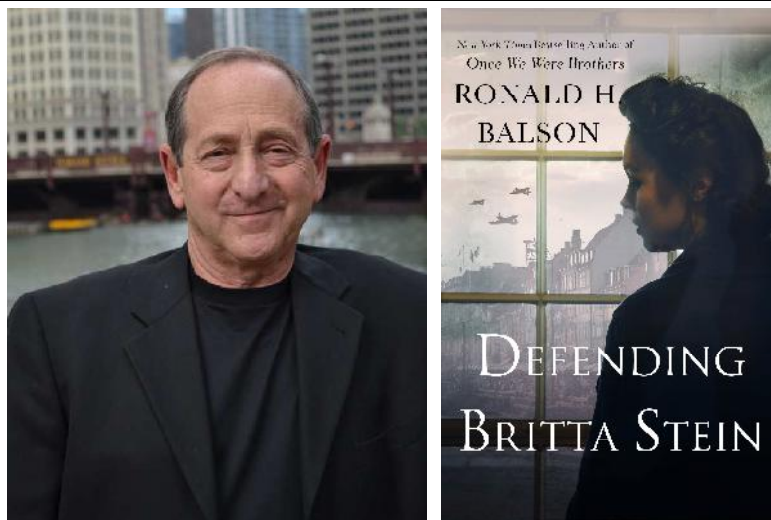

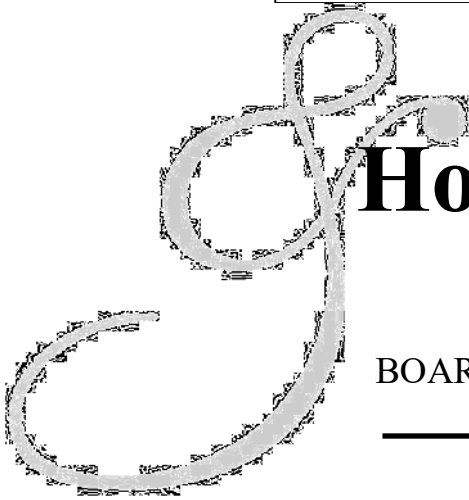

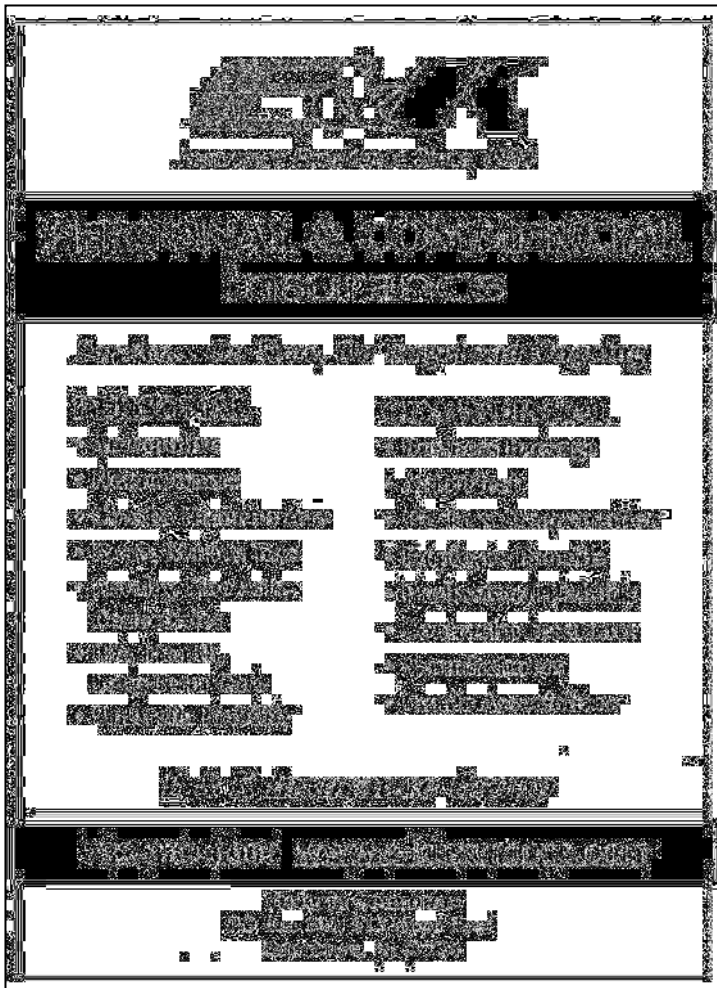
