REDISCOVERING OUR INNER LIGHT



Shalom my friends. I hope you and your families are all doing well as we find ourselves approaching Hanukkah. (Yes, it seems quite early this year)!

As many of you know, over the past couple of years through my work with the Institute of Jewish Spirituality in their Clergy Jewish Leadership Program, I have become exposed to a great deal of Hasidic and mystical texts and interpretations of Torah (spanning the 16th-19th century) as they relate to helping individuals cultivate and nurture their inner lives. And so it is that I found myself exploring a text from the Sefat Emet, Rabbi Yehudah Aryeh Leib (1847-1905 Poland) as it relates to Hanukkah. The text below is a bit complicated, but keep reading – I will do my best to explain, as I think it has something profound to offer. The topic

is Hanukkah candles and the way that they symbolically reflect the inner sacred light that can be found within each one of us. As the Sefat Emet Teaches:

It is written: A candle of Adoani is the soul of a person searching out all the belly's chambers (Proverbs 20:27)... We say each day "the soul You have placed within me is pure." This means that there is a certain pure place within each Jew, but it is indeed deeply hidden.

When the Temple was standing, it was clear that all life-energy came from God... But even now, after that dwelling place has been hidden, it can be found by searching with candles. The candles are the mitzvot; we need to seek within our hearts and souls in order to fulfill a mitzvah with all our strength. The word NeR (candle) stand for Nefesh Ruah ("soul" and "spirit"). To fulfil a mitzvah in this way we also make use of all our 248 limbs. These, combined with love and fear, together add up to the equivalent of the word NeR.. Then we are ready to find sanctuary, to come to the hidden point within. Especially at this season, when lights were miraculously lit for Israel even though they did not have enough oil, there remains light even now to help us, with the aid of these Hanukkah candles, to find that hidden light within. Hiding takes place mainly in the dark; we need the candles' light to seek and to find...

This happens by the power of the mitzvot that you do with all of your strength. They arouse the innerlife energy which is the pure point... By the power of inwardness we can find the hidden light within all our own inner chambers.

This is the meaning of the verse: "A person must always measure him/herself as though a holy being dwelt within his/her innards. Of a person who conducts him/herself in this way, it is written: Let them make Me a sanctuary and I will dwell within them." Truly within them!

Okay, so the *Sefat Emet* is a bit tricky here, but what I think he is trying to get us to understand is that each one of us has a divine spark, a divine light within us. The way to access that spark is by living a life of mitzvot, by working to make a difference in our own lives and in the lives of others. So far, so good. But more specifically, the Sefat Emet is inviting us to explore the specific mitzvah of Hanukkah candles by considering how we might use them to nurture our spiritual selves. Through my recent practice of mindfulness and meditation I have noticed that in order to pay attention, in order to notice what is happening within, and if we are lucky to glimpse the sacred, we have to stop, to slow down, to breathe and to reflect. It occurs to me that the Hanukkah candles afford us just that opportunity. This year, instead of quickly lighting the candles, singing blessings and songs, and moving on, we are being invited to try something different. This year, we are being asked to light the candles, and then stop to try to tap into our inner light by considering: what other mitzvot fill us with light? What other areas of our lives help us connect to the deepest part of our souls, to the sacred within? As we begin to experience more hours of darkness, what do we need to do to tap into that inner light, to re-charge ourselves, our relationships with others, and the way that we interact with the world?

God's presence, God's light fills the world. It is often hidden, but we are being taught that if we make the time, we might be able to catch a glimpse of that which is most sacred – the inner light of our souls, that sacred spark which helps to inform our sacred purpose.

With four kids and a dog, lighting Hanukkah candles in our house is not usually a quiet and contemplative experience. This year, after everyone has left the table, I think I will sit a while and try to notice – both the light that is shining outside, and the sacred light that might be discovered within. I invite you to join me.

Hag Urim Sameach, May this Hanukkah be filled with blessing, joy, and light.



A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT

What is the Engine of Our Congregation?

Our Congregation's growing strength is a result of our focus on engagement and welcoming.

We continue to strive to welcome everyone where they are and join them on their personal paths to a greater connection with our people, our faith and each other.

Similarly, we continue to foster engagement on as many levels as we can.

New members have told us how our focus on welcoming and engagement has attracted them to join our *Kehillah Kedosha* -- our holy community. Rabbi Schonbrun and our hard working staff do all they can to foster our approach. But the true engine that can keep us driving forward is our membership – each of us – all of you.

The focus of my remarks on this past Rosh Hashanah (reprinted in our October Bulletin) was on the importance of volunteerism.

We have many members who play important roles in our congregational life – members who volunteer for tasks. Some of the tasks large, but many small, but equally meaningful. Our members who help are our congregation's engine of action and engagement.

By way of a simple example, the process of setting up for our High Holidays, and then reverting to our set- up for the rest of the year, involves moving hundreds of our prayer books, moving hundreds of chairs, sorting through our tallitot for those in need of refurbishment, distributing honors and compiling our Book of Life and Remembrance. If left to a just handful of volunteers, these tasks would be overwhelming, but we have been fortunate to have scores involved so that the efforts become manageable and no less rewarding.

The same principle of spreading the work broadly applies to every aspect of our congregation's life and functions. While we have had many members contributing their time, creativity and insight, we are only tapping a small amount of our potential. If we had hundreds of volunteers, we would achieve so much more. We need each of you.

The amount of time you volunteer is, of course, your choice. You can help out occasionally for few minutes, dedicate a considerable block of time or a regular basis, or anything between. Your volunteering can involve fundamental tasks that require "extra hands" or you can provide a unique or critical set of skills as part of a more involved effort. You can help with the "day to day" or help add to our existing programming or provide new offerings. Again, the choice of how and when is yours. All that we ask is that you choose to help out in some way.

We will continue to reach out as best we can, but what would really help is if you reach back to us with your ideas or a simple "what can I do to help?" If we achieve a greater degree of volunteerism, our possibilities are limitless. Please take the time to consider what you are prepared to do and let us know.

ISRAEL CORNER

ISRAEL IN THE NEWS 9/26/21

Bipartisan efforts continue to support Israel overcoming some more vocal critics of Israel. Last month a small number of house members attempted to block 1 billion dollars for Israel's Iron Dome system from an emergency spending bill. As of the submission of this article, the funding is temporarily blocked by Senator Rand Paul (R-Ky) to force other changes to foreign aid. The full Senate is expected to pass the Legislation before you read this and President Biden has promised to immediate sign the bill into law.

The vote in the house was 420 in favor to 9 against, Bush, (D-Mo), Carson (D-Ind), Garcia (D-Ill), Grijalva (D-Az), Massie (R-Ky), Newman (D-Ill), Omar (D-Minn), Pressley (D-Mass), and Tlaib (D. Mich) voted against.




