SUPPORTING ALL OF OUR PRAYER OPTIONS



A few months ago, I attended a virtual session put on by the Rabbinical Assembly discussing the recent *teshuvot*, legal response written that would permit a virtual minyan under certain circumstances. Tracing the voices of our tradition back through the ages, and figuring out just how some of our ancient texts might speak to the strange times in which we have been living was a fascinating exercise. Ancient questions concerning whether or not one can join two groups into one if they can see each other, or what happens if someone is standing "outside" of a potential minyan, but not in the same space, were among the many different aspects of this topic discussed at length. But what was even more interesting to me than the technical, halakhic (legal) argumentation was the entire question of how our new entry into "virtual" space might affect our re-entry into physical space. On the one hand, as I have written, I am happy that we have the tools to enable members to participate in services via Livestream, and participate in weekday evening minyanim via Zoom. There is no question that both in terms of the pandemic, and in terms of those who are otherwise unable to make it to services, these tools have made our ritual experiences more accessible to many of you. As I said in my letter last spring, our evening minyan attendance is more consistent these days over Zoom than it was in person in recent years.

On the other hand, weekday Zoom minyanim, or joining from Livestream from home is not the same experience as coming to the synagogue in person. And even though I understand that we can only create a community from the place that we are at any given moment in time – still, I worry. I worry because while I believe virtual prayer is a useful tool, one that certainly has its place, it is also true that it is different from the "in person" prayer that has always been a staple of our community. When we join via Livestream, we are able to join with our synagogue family in spirit. When we join via Zoom, we are able to see one another, and pray "alone together." But joining in prayer and community, in person, enables a thicker and more complete spiritual, prayerful, and connecting experience. When we gather in person we can hear each other (even through our masks) and be strengthened by the song that we create together. When we gather in person we can comfort those who are grieving, offering a hug, a tissue, or sitting fully present with someone in silence. When we gather in person, we can see the reactions and hear the voices of each other as we share wonderful news each week of birthdays, anniversaries, weekly celebrations, graduations, etc. This is not to say that virtual gathering is a bad thing – far from it – but it is to remind all of us gathering in person, when we feel safe enough to do so, is an essential part of what it means to be a *kehillah kedosha*, a sacred community of relationships.


Recently, Friday night Kabbalat Shabbat and Maariv have been a bit of a struggle. For years our Shabbat morning service has seen a steady increase in attendance, while our Friday night service has been smaller and more intimate. But these days, we could use your help. Though it does not happen very often, there was one Friday night this past summer that I came to synagogue and we did not have a minyan. I looked up at the camera and offered my own prayers, alone in the sanctuary, not sure if anyone was watching (turns out that there was almost a minyan watching via Livestream!). Since we have been back in person, our morning minyan has had a reasonable attendance, but our entire community cannot, or at least should not, rely on the small, caring, and dedicated group of minyanaires that come most mornings. This is particularly true when it comes to the need to say Kaddish. Some people have thankfully found meaning in saying Kaddish each evening via Zoom. But there are others who come each morning, expecting a minyan and hoping to be able to remember their loved ones by reciting the traditional words of Kaddish.

This is where you come in. Please consider joining us, in person, for a Friday night service throughout the year. If everyone in this congregation volunteered to help make a minyan two times a year, I am sure we would never have a problem getting an in-person minyan on Friday night. The same thing is true for weekday mornings. And please remember that if we are unable to support our in-person minyan, there are certain prayers, such as the Mourner's Kaddish that will unfortunately not be available via Livestream. Both virtually and in person, it is critical that those gathered are able to both see and hear one another to constitute a minyan of ten individuals.

As I have said and written before, in order to continue our strong tradition of regular, in-person prayer, we need you. This is your community. This is your Shabbat experience, and your weekday minyan. Zoom and Livestream have enabled more of us to connect, and connect safely – and for that I am grateful. But, as we head into a new year, let us pledge to support our in-person prayer options as well. Please consider looking at your calendars, bring your family (and for now, your mask), pick a date, and please join us. Weekdays in person: Monday-Friday 8:00am; Sunday 8:30 am; Friday night 7:15pm; Shabbat morning 9:00am.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Shanah Tova...

On behalf of our lay leadership and our staff, we wish you a happy and healthy New Year.

On Rosh Hashanah I reported that Congregation Torat El is strong, stable and vibrant, even in light of the challenges the COVID pandemic continues to create.

Our attendance during our High Holy Days services, through the combination of in-person participation and viewing by Livestream, included practically every member. Our family of families continues to build relationships with each other, with our traditions, and with our people.

Eight years ago, I had the privilege to stand before you as your President. At that time, our congregation was at a cross-road. One path led to gracefully diminishing. The other path was to redouble our efforts to re-engage as a vibrant Conservative egalitarian *Kehillah Kedosha* – a holy community – here at the Jersey Shore.

Through your efforts, we have pursued that second path with dramatic effect.

The implementation of our Sustaining Membership dues model, coupled with our recent successful Capital Campaign, has provided us with financial stability. After years of deficits, I am very pleased to report that we are on track for a second straight year of a balanced budget with a small reserve for unexpected expenses. Your continued financial support will keep us moving into our future.

We have addressed all deferred maintenance while adding a robust security infrastructure and many other improvements to our building. The latest addition is our new Sukkah, patio and garden behind our Social Hall.

In the coming months, we will be making improvements to our Social Hall and replacing our collection of chairs that have long passed their useful lives.

Our expanding Early Learning Center provides a program that reflects our Jewish values for families with very young children.

Our programming, both live and virtual, has opened greater opportunities for experiential learning and strengthening connections with each other and the world around us.

Through the work of Ben Laskowitz and Rabbi Schonbrun, our ritual engagement continues to expand. With Ben's exceptional guidance, anyone can learn to help lead our services. If Ben can get someone like me, with limited musical and Hebrew skills to successfully chant from the Torah, none of you have an excuse not to try.

This past spring, we welcomed Rachel Weitzenkorn as our new Director of Youth Education and Engagement. In her first few months, she has initiated new programs to enhance the experiences of our younger members.

Our emphasis on being open and welcoming continues to attract new members. Even in the midst of the pandemic, we have continued to add new members to our community.

Over the past 18 months, many volunteers have stepped forward to keep our congregational life vibrant even when we stayed in our homes.

And we should all personally thank our wonderful staff – Rabbi, Pam, Lisa, Joanne, Ben, Rachel, Rich, and Jameson – for all they do. But we need more than their efforts to make this place be all it can be.

While we reflect on the tremendous progress we have made over the past years, let's now focus on the actions that will take us to even greater heights.

The most successful congregations have a high level of volunteerism. If we are to continue to thrive, we need more volunteer activity.

We know from experience, that when we support the activities we enjoy, we increase the benefits we receive. Our new Social Action and Israel Awareness committees were not initiated by your leadership or our staff, but by congregants working together. I know there are more ideas like these amongst our congregation.

There is a fundamental truth that the rewards of volunteering far exceed the effort. Efforts, large or small, create a sense of belonging, of caring and of connection.

We need to get better at matching our individual skill sets and interests with our congregation's needs. We are asking every member to step up when and how you can.

We will be reaching out to you, but it is far better if you reach out to us. Your lay leadership and our staff will continue to work to increase engagement, but to be successful, we need your participation.

As we welcome the New Year, work with us to find the right fit for you. We look forward to hearing from each of you.




