

HEAD TO THE BEACH... AND WRITE A LETTER



In my basement I have a box filled with notes and letters from years gone by. I have thank you notes, birthday cards, and various letters written to me over the years. I have letters written to me by my mother z"l, and my siblings when I was a young child spending my summer at Camp Ramah in California. I have letters written by my grandparents to my family members back home during a trip to Japan over 50 years ago. I even have letters written from my grandfather, to my father, long before I was born, and new-found letters from great-grandparents in Yiddish (which are still waiting to be translated)! Every so often I like to go down to the basement and look at these letters, hold them, read them, and honor the memories and values which they so powerfully bring to my soul.

This past year, while I was home with some rare downtime, I even spent some time going through many letters handwritten to me by many of you – my dear congregants – over the years. Organized, and saved in a special storage container, nestled atop one of my book shelves, these letters are among my greatest treasures. Not to mention the current project that I am slowly attempting of reading through the thousands of letters my father-in-law has transcribed of the experience his parents had during World War II. To say that they are a treasure, is an understatement.

It seems to me that people don't write letters very often these days. And while our communication is quite vast and instantaneous – from email, to texting, tweeting, snap-chatting, and posting on Instagram and Facebook, in truth these communications are not quite the same. I often ask my kids whether they think that the thousands of communications that they have electronically will be preserved in the future. They are not sure, and neither am I. But one thing that I do know is that the care, thought, and weight behind a handwritten letter can last more than a lifetime. Virtual communication is incredible and instantaneous, yet it seems somehow quite temporary and intangible when it comes to preservation for our future selves, or future generations.

A few years ago, I read a wonderful little book about the importance of writing letters by Rabbi Elana Zaiman entitled *The Forever Letter*. In it, she reminds the reader of the ancient Jewish practice of writing "ethical wills" – letters in which the author tries to communicate his or her values, and life wisdom to friends or members of his or her family. Throughout Jewish history, we have examples of individuals who wanted to communicate their values to those in the next generation and accomplished this through the writing of "ethical wills." But writing a letter to friends, family, and loved ones is not simply about ensuring that your legacy lives on. It is also beneficial in other ways. Rabbi Zaiman explains that there are other benefits to our writing as well – including, but not limited to, *learning to express in writing what we cannot speak, coming to understand ourselves and our relationships in a deeper way, making ourselves known, asking for forgiveness, clarifying our values, or living with greater intention.*

The summer is upon us. You may have some downtime to head to the beach, sit outside on the porch, or head to the boardwalk just to relax. As you take time to unwind from the year, as well as relax and begin to look forward to the New Year that will be upon us in September, I want to encourage you to consider taking time to write a letter. Who would you like to write to? What do you want to say? What do you need to say? Do you want to thank someone? Apologize to someone? Explain yourself to someone? Do you want to share a story with someone, your beliefs and values with someone, or a memory with someone? Do you want to write to your children, your grandchildren, your siblings, a long-lost friend, your life partner? Take some time. Get a pen and a few pieces of paper and begin to write. One caveat – I would avoid writing something that is hurtful. That is a larger topic than this article can cover, but I would advise that the intention of this letter be to bring something new and positive to yourself and to the recipient of the letter.

I have shared some of this message with you in the past, but I do so again this summer because my sense is that we are all coming out of a time of tremendous difficulty and challenge. Perhaps, taking some time to write a letter to someone that we care about, might be something that brings us clarity and meaning, while serving as a tangible reminder that we are still here, that we are okay, that we have things we want to share with one another, for our own sakes and, we hope, for the sake of others. There is a reason that our tradition moved very early on from being an oral to a written tradition. We wanted to make sure that the wisdom of our sages lasted throughout the generations. Your wisdom is no less important. So take some time and begin composing. You owe it to yourself. You owe it to the recipient. And you owe it to the generations that will follow and want to know more about who you were and what you were all about at this moment in time. Write the letter. You will be glad that you did.
