



#### The Key to Our Spiritual Growth



How many of us remember sitting around a dinner table and being asked, "What did you learn today?" Growing up, this was a question that was asked of me with some regularity. It is a question that we continue to ask our children daily – even when the response is met with a teenage shrug. From a very early age it was clear to me, as I am sure it was to many of you, that education, learning, and asking good questions were an integral part of being a human being. The message was clear. There is always room to learn, always room to grow, and if we approach our learning with an open mind and an open heart, we have the potential to be transformed in the most profound ways.

This is certainly true when it comes to our spiritual lives as well, when it comes to making time to learn from the deep well and wisdom of our tradition. The idea that learning and

study is the cornerstone of our Jewish existence is so basic that most of us don't stop to think about it all that often. Even our scholars, and our most sacred book, the Torah, are named with the value of study and learning in mind. What do we call a Jewish scholar? A talmid chacham, a wise student. What does the word Torah actually mean? Instruction or teaching. And what does the term rabbi classically connote? Someone who is, first and foremost, a "teacher."

I mention all of this because we are just days away from celebrating the Festival of Shavuot, a time in which we celebrate the receiving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. Every holiday comes with a ritual of celebration. Hanukkah has the Hanukkah candles, Passover has the Seder, and Sukkot has the Sukkah, lulav and Etrog. What does Shavuot have (besides cheesecake!)? It has the ritual of study, of Jewish learning. It was the mystics of Tzefat, in the 16th century, who believed that it was a mitzvah to spend the entire night of Shavuot in study, to engage in what they referred to as a "tikkun leil Shavuot, a "tikkun" on the eve of Shavuot. Why was it called this? Because of the belief that tikkun, literally meaning, "healing," can only be brought into our lives, and into our world, through our willingness to learn, to increase our knowledge, to open our hearts, and then to allow ourselves to be transformed by taking that knowledge with us into the world and allowing it to inform our behavior.

With Shavuot just around the corner, and with perhaps some downtime coming this summer, I want to invite each of you to check in with yourself about your Jewish learning. Ask yourself: When is the last time that I consciously sat down to learn something Jewish? When is the last time that I intentionally tried to expand my spiritual growth by taking time to begin exploring the wisdom of my people? What might be some areas where I would like to learn more, and what am I going to do about it?

There is so much out there – and I know that the vast amount of material available in print and online can make Jewish "learning" seem very intimidating. But this Shavuot I am asking you to consider taking one small step. I am inviting you to start somewhere, anywhere really, in the hopes of bringing more tikkun, healing into your soul, into your life, and into your world.

How to get started? Here are a few suggestions:

Call or email me. I would love to explore some ideas with you that might help you get started. I would be more than happy to meet with you to discuss in person, either in my office or over coffee.

Check out some Jewish courses on line. Look at the American Jewish University, the Jewish Theological Seminary, the Shalom Hartman Institute, the Institute for Jewish Spirituality, or Hadar to get started. Just Google them and explore to see if there is something that peaks your curiosity.

Consider making space in your personal calendar ahead of time, and sign up for an adult education class at the synagogue, or in the community next fall.

Buy a Jewish book that looks interesting to you and begin reading it and discussing it with family and friends.

Come to Shabbat services and engage in our weekly Torah learning.

Check out the many Jewish podcasts that are out there (start with Google) to see what might be interesting to you. A few that I enjoy are "Identity Crisis," "For Heaven's Sake," both put out by the Shalom Hartman Institute.

There is no question that a commitment to Jewish learning takes discipline, dedication, and can be an endless pursuit. That is why the Talmud traditionally starts on page 2 – because there is never an ending to what we might be able to learn. But as our sage Ben Bag Bag once taught, we are to "turn it and turn it for everything is in it. We are to look deeply into the well of our tradition, grow old and tired through our study, never stopping from our ability to learn – because there is no greater virtue in life than this."

Good luck! And may your learning lead you to a life of deep purpose, meaning, spiritual growth and sacred connection.


