YOU CAN ALWAYS RETURN

A few months ago I went to do a bunch of returns of things that we had ordered online, but, for one reason or another, needed to be brought back to the store. Somehow, over the years, "doing returns" is a "skill set" that I have developed – but it is not always so easy. I was reminded of this when I walked into the Gap and Old Navy, only to find that they had "tightened" their policy. No returns after 30 days. Period. No exceptions. I was frustrated, even though I understood where the company was coming from. The clothing was donated (an opportunity to do a mitzvah, turning a negative into a positive).

I know that I am not alone in this experience. Unfortunately, when it comes to commercial "returns," there are times when the opportunity simply expires. It is too late. We have missed our chance. But fortunately, when it comes to "spiritual returns," there is no expiration date. Every year, as long as we continue to be blessed with the gift of relative health and life, we are given an opportunity to return. An opportunity that is fast approaching as we prepare to begin the year 5783 in the Jewish calendar.

Really? You may be thinking to yourself, "Is it time to start thinking about the High Holidays" – already?! Yes. Because while the holidays often seem "early" or "late," the truth is that they are always right on time – falling on the first and second day of the Hebrew month of Tishrei. Fortunately, these *Yamim Noraim,* these Days of Awe, include an entire month, the month of Elul, which is an invitation to each of us to "return." We are invited to return to our best selves; we are invited to return to our priorities; we are invited to return to our spiritual homes.

One thing I know about "returning" things is that it takes some effort. Whether we are returning an item to the store, returning to a habit, to a job, or to a relationship, there is some effort involved. We have to get ourselves organized; we have to get ourselves prepared. Spiritually, emotionally, personally, we have to get ourselves ready for the "return." What happens if we try to return an item to the store and we are not prepared? The return doesn't go very well. The same is true of our "return" to this time of year. Despite the fact that it is summer and we may not feel like we are in the proper head space, despite the fact that so many live lives that are incredibly busy and overscheduled (even in the summer), if we want to be able to "return" effectively, if we want to get anything out of our "return," we must *make* the time during the days and weeks ahead to take the process of return seriously. Don't worry, if you are reading this in the beginning of August, you still have a bit of time. Elul officially begins on Sunday, August 28. But consider this some advanced notice. We cannot simply show up at synagogue toward the end of September this year for a few days and expect to emerge with a sense of renewal and transformation if we failed to get everything organized for our "return." It is in that spirit that I would like to share with you my annual questions as one way to help you get started with this process. I invite you to take these questions seriously, creating some time in the coming months to sit down with pen and paper and actually answer them. Bring them with you to synagogue, to the physical act of "returning," to remind you of what you are trying to accomplish during these *Yamim Noraim*.

What brought me the most joy this year and what brought me the most pain?

What do I regret not doing this year?

Who did I hurt, and how can I make up for what I have done?

Who do I need to forgive and how can I go about forgiving them?

What are the most important relationships in my life and how can I nurture them in the coming year?

What was a Jewish high point for me this year? What was a Jewish low point?

What was my relationship with God like this year?

How did Judaism affect my life this year? Am I satisfied with Judaism's role in my life?

What are my goals in life and what I am I doing to achieve them?

Where do I see myself in five years, ten years, or twenty years?

How has Covid changed me and am I living in a way that reflects that change?

If I could change one thing about myself, what would it be?

Engaging in this process of *teshuvah*, literally "return," is the key to bringing meaning, purpose, wholeness, and a sense of the sacred into your life. It is the key to getting the most out of this time of year. If done honestly, this process will give you deep insight into who you are, where you been during this past year, and where you would like to be going.

Good luck with your return. God's door is always open, and so is ours.

Shanah Tovah U'metukah. May each of you and your families have a good and sweet New Year.


