

RECOGNIZING THE GOOD- MAKING EVERY DAY "THANKSGIVING"



Do you like coffee? Are you one of those people that can't start your day without coffee? I am not (I prefer tea), but years ago, I read an interesting book by A.J. Jacobs entitled *Thanks A Thousand: A Gratitude Journey*, which began with the following description:

It's a Tuesday morning and I'm in the presence of one of the most mind-boggling accomplishments in human history. This thing is so astounding in its complexity and scope, it makes the Panama Canal look like a third grader's craft project. This marvel I see before me is the result of thousands of human beings collaborating across dozens of countries. It took the combined labor of artists, chemists, politicians, mechanics, biologists, miners, packagers, smugglers, and goatherds. It required airplanes, boats, trucks, motorcycles, vans, pallets, and shoulders. It needed hundreds of materials – steel, wood, nitrogen, bugger,

pallets, and shoulders. It needed hundreds of materials – steel, wood, nitrogen, bugger, silicon, ultraviolet light, explosives, and bat guano. It has caused great joy but also great poverty and oppression. It relied upon ancient wisdom and space-age technology, freezing temperatures and scorching heat, high mountains and deep water. It is my morning cup of coffee. And I'm grateful for it. Really, really grateful (Introduction, Jacobs, Thanks A Thousand).

The book goes on to describe the thousand or so steps involved in bringing you that morning cup of coffee! The message? We would do well to consider just how many things on any given day we take for granted, and just how much there is to be thankful for in our daily lives. In Judaism, we call this idea "hakarat ha-tov," which literally translates to "recognizing the good." In order to train ourselves to be more grateful in our daily lives, we have to practice, we have to seek out the good. This may not take us around the globe or lead us to write a book about just how many people were involved in bringing us our mail, packages, food, water, heat, electricity, internet, etc. on any given day. But, taking time to "seek out" the incredible blessings in our lives, is a basic Jewish spiritual practice that we would do well to consider carefully as we approach Thanksgiving this year.

Cultivating an attitude of gratitude is fundamental to Jewish living. From the *modeh/modah ani* prayer that we are to say first thing in the morning, expressing our gratitude for the gift of life, to the many blessings we are encouraged to say throughout the day, we are invited to look for daily opportunities to express our thanks to God for the blessings and good fortune that so many of us experience in our lives. This is not always easy. As Rabbi Mordecia Gifter once taught: *We humans have a tendency to always want more... It is easy to forget to feel grateful and happy with the good we already have.* (Nevertheless,) *we should strive to feel a joy that is complete. Lack of joy with what we have is destructive both physically and spiritually.*

As the old cliché goes, many of us see the glass as half empty, instead of glass full. We have *this* struggle, or *that* problem. These challenges are real, they are painful, and they are difficult. And, at the same time, we are being reminded here that we have real blessings in our lives as well. The challenge is how we might learn to train ourselves to recognize them *(hakarat ha-tov)* as we go about our daily lives. It is a challenge that is critical because, as Gifter correctly points out, our inability to see the glass as half full is not good for our physical or spiritual health.


This year, at your Thanksgiving tables, I want to encourage each of you to practice *hakarat ha-tov*, and challenge each other to bring this exercise into your daily lives. Go around the table and name one very specific thing for which you are grateful (not just family, health, and friends). Take time to consider just how many things went into that "gift" that was a source of pleasure, enjoyment, or meaning in your life. And then, when you are done, consider reading the following prayer at your table.

A Thanksgiving Prayer - Rabbi Naomi Levy

For the laughter of the children, for my own life breath,
For the abundance of food on this table,
For the ones who prepared this sumptuous feast,
For the roof over our heads, the clothes on our backs,
For our health, and our wealth of blessings,
For this opportunity to celebrate with family and friends,
For the freedom to pray these words
Without fear, in any language, in any faith, in this great country,
Whose landscape is as vast and beautiful as her inhabitants.
Thank You, God, for giving us all these. Amen.

May this be a meaningful Thanksgiving for you and your families, and may each of us challenge ourselves to grow spiritually by embracing **every day** as an opportunity for "thanksgiving."


