#### BETHE MIRACLE; BRING THE LIGHT



The famous story in the Talmud about the miracle of the oil in the *Beit Ha-mikdash*, the Temple, lasting for eight days begins with a question. *Mai Hanukkah?* Loosely translated our sages were asking: *What is Hanukkah all about anyway? Why do we have the practice of lighting a Hanukkiyah? Where does this custom come from?* It's a good question, and one that might be surprising to us until we stop to realize that Hanukkah is a later holiday, one that is not mentioned in the Torah or even the Hebrew Bible (the story of the Maccabees is in the Apocrypha). The sages seem to have been working on and around that question throughout the discussion on the page of Talmud. The question occurs in the middle of a lengthy conversation, as if someone is asking: "what, exactly are we discussing here?!" Hidden amidst the lengthy discussion – about why the Hanukkiah is lit, how it is lit, how it's

light is to be used, where it is placed, and what blessings are said, etc. are at least two answers to that original question.

Mai Hanukkah? What is Hanukkah all about? Hope & Bringing Light Into The Darkness.

Hope is the answer exemplified by the story of the oil miraculously lasting for eight days. Bringing more light into the darkness of the world is the rationale given for why we "count up" with our candles (from 1-8) instead of "counting down" (from 8-1). There are times in our lives, and in our world, when it can seem like these two things are in short supply. Where is God? Where is our miracle, we wonder? But perhaps we are asking the wrong questions.

There is an important story that was once shared by Chaim Potok about a Hanukkah during the years of the Holocaust when "darkness almost overpowered the light." Potok explained:

My world seemed thick with that darkness when Hanukkah came that year on the twenty-fifth of December. I remember my father chanting the blessings over the first candle on the first night of the festival. He was short and balding, and he chanted in a thin, intense voice. I stood between him and my mother, gazing at the flame of the first night's candle. The flame seemed pitiful against the malignant darkness outside the window. I went to bed and was cold with dread over the horror of the world.

The next night two candles were lighted. Again my father chanted..."We kindle these lights on account of the miracles, the deliverances, and the wonders which You did for our ancestors... during all eight days of Hanukkah these lights are sacred... We are only to look at them, in order that we may give thanks unto Your name, for Your miracles, Your deliverances, and Your wonders."

I wanted a miracle. But there was no miracles during that Hannukah. Where was God? I kept dreaming of burning synagogues.

On the eighth day and final night of the festival I stood with my parents in front of the burning candles. The darkness mocked their light. I could see my parents glancing at me. My mother sighed. Then my father murmured my name. "You want another miracle?" he asked wearily. I did not respond. "Yes," he said. "You want another miracle." He was silent a moment. Then he said, in a gentle, urging voice. "I also want another miracle. But if it does not come, we will make a human miracle. We will give the world the special gifts of our Jewishness. We will not let the world burn our souls."


The candles glowed feebly against the dark window. "Sometimes I think man is a greater miracle-maker than God," my father said tiredly, looking at the candles. "God does not have to live day after day on this broken planet. Perhaps you will learn to make your own miracles. I will try to teach you how to make human miracles."

I lay awake, a long time that night and did not believe my father could ever teach me that. But now, decades later, I think he taught me well. And I am trying hard to teach it to my children. (Zion, Spectre, A Different Light; originally published in McCall's Magazine, 100, No. 3, Dec. 1972, p. 30)

Mai Hanukkah? What is Hanukkah? It is the holiday when we are reminded never to lose hope. It is the holiday when we are reminded, not to wait for the miracle, but to be the miracle. As we take the shamash (the helper candle) in our hand each night, we are to remember that it is our job to help, it is our job to serve, it is our job to look for opportunities to be the light for other people each and every day. As we come out of the nearly three years of a pandemic, continue to wrestle with the divisions, pain, and anger in our country, as we wrestle with daily challenges personal, professional, and societal, let us take this message to heart. As the darkness of winter settles in, may we never lose hope, and may we always remember our sacred responsibility to bring light and love into the lives of others as often as possible.





## MEET THE AUTHOR SERIES ZOOM EVENT!

Sunday, January 15, 11:30am Meet Jonathan Dunsky, author of *A Death in Jerusalem* 







A Death in Jerusalem is a historical mystery set in Jerusalem in 1952, a time when life was divided in two, with barricades and walls between the eastern and western parts of the city. Rich in historical background, the book deals with one of the most contentious political issues in Israel's history, whether or not Israel should negotiate directly with Germany for reparations for the Holocaust. This issue divided Israeli society and the struggle against negotiations reached a boiling point on January 7, 1952, when protestors stormed the Knesset following a fiery speech by Menachem Begin. Not merely a mystery, A Death in Jerusalem is a journey back in time to a young state of Israel, beautifully capturing the country, the city, and its people.

Jonathan Dunsky is the author of the Adam Lapid mysteries, a series of historical novels set primarily in Israel in the 1940s and '50s. A longtime student of history and an avid reader of crime fiction, Dunsky combined his two passions to create his protagonist, Adam Lapid, a Holocaust survivor who works as a private detective in the fledgling State of Israel. A native of Israel, Dunsky did not grow up speaking English at home. As a teenager, he decided he wanted to master the language and so started reading books in English and checking unfamiliar words in the dictionary. It's a habit he keeps to this day. The Adam Lapid series numbers seven novels and one short story, so far. Dunsky is writing the eighth novel in the series, with many more to come. In addition, he has published a stand-alone thriller called *The Payback Girl* and a number of short stories in various genres. Dunsky resides in Israel with his wife and two sons.
