STANDING UP TO ANTI-SEMITISM THROUGH STORIES OF SURVIVORS



Last weekend I was on the phone with my dad speaking about nothing in particular. After the update about his grandchildren (of course) and some discussions about the happenings of the previous few days, the conversation somehow turned to the uptick in anti-Semitism that we are seeing in America. "I really had it quite easy as a child," I said. "Sure, there was one kid who bullied me when I wore a kipa in public school my senior year of high school, but other than that, I thought most of the anti-Semitism stuff that you grew up worrying about was a thing of the past. *Boy, was I wrong!* I said..."

My father's parents came over before WWII, but a good deal of his family came after. He had some cousins who survived, and some who did not; some aunts and uncles who made it through, but many who did not. The Holocaust was not as "distant" a concept for my dad as a young child as it was for me growing up. As our conversation turned to Kanye, Kyrie Irving, issues of Holocaust denial, etc., I could hear my dad's anger through the phone. "I have no patience for those people," he exclaimed. As we both lamented how social media is not helping the situation, and discussed the importance of educating the next generation about the specifics of the Holocaust, I was proud to tell him about another thing that his older grandchildren were doing, right here in our congregation – interviewing, filming, and bearing witness to the last generation of Holocaust survivors. Let me explain.

Last summer I was approached by one of our members, Dr. Shira Meyer, about a program entitled "Names Not Numbers[®]," an oral history film project and curriculum created by an educator named Tova Fish-Rosenberg (namesnotnumbers.org). Shira wanted to know if we might be able to bring such a program to our community and how she and her husband, Ariel, might be able to support us in that endeavor. Thanks to her leadership, their support, and the vision of our ever-talented Director of Youth Education and Engagement Rachel Weitzenkorn, this idea was turned into reality. Over the past few months, nearly 20 teens in our community (members and local friends of members) have been learning history, journalism techniques, and film-making skills – all in the name of bearing witness to the stories of the few survivors who are left in this world. Giving up their precious Sunday mornings (and the teenage love of sleeping late), these teens have been empowered to bear witness, take responsibility, and speak truth to those who would minimize, distort, or deny the history of our people. Unlike my more naïve teenage years, these kids don't need to be told that anti-Semitism is alive and well. They see it in their social media feeds, and hear it from their siblings who experience anti-Israel sentiment on college campuses. Through this wonderful program, they are learning about hatred of Jews specifically, and the dangers of intolerance and ignorance more generally, directly from the source – from the mouths of those who survived.

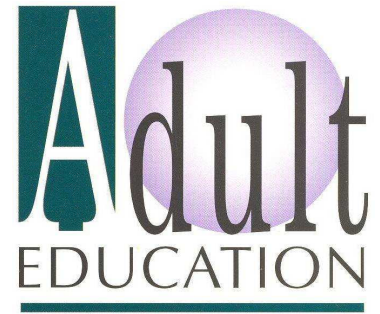
In the past few weeks of interviews, these teens have met some extraordinary individuals. Hanna Wechsler shared her experiences surviving Auschwitz with her mother, and reminded her listeners never to let "others define us" and always to "speak out against anti-Semitism" in any form from anyone. Arthur Spielman shared his journey fleeing from country to country while hiding as a Roman Catholic who privately held onto his Jewish identity at all costs and at significant risk to his life. "I am lucky altogether," he gratefully said to me before beginning his story. Arthur reminded the teens to "never forget where you came from because people still deny what happened, with anti-Semitism being promoted by politicians and Jew-haters all over, still." And finally, our teens were blessed to hear from our very own Eva Wiener, who shared her incredible story as a baby on the St. Louis, reminding us (among other things) of the kindness of one person, the captain, who did his best not to give up on his passengers. Listening to her story, we were reminded of the difference that one person can make in the lives of others.

I encourage all of you to mark your calendars now for the premier of our "Names, Not Numbers: A Movie in the Making[®]" film debut in the spring. See page 8 of this bulletin for details.

Rav Todot, a huge thank you to our wonderful educator, Chaya Friedmann, as well, who gave of her heart and her time to help our teens understand this critical history of our people and its implications for today. We are also so grateful to our own Rob Solomon, who gave of his time and talents to give our teens a short journalism lesson by teaching them how to create thoughtful and productive interview questions for our survivors.

As we prepare to wrap up this experience with our teens, it is my prayer that future generations be more tolerant, loving, and respectful of *all* of God's creatures. May these leaders of tomorrow, who were privileged to take part in this program, always remember their responsibility to speak up and speak out in the face of anti-Semitism, bigotry, and intolerance.

Meet Jonathan Dunsky, author of *A Death in Jerusalem*



A Death in Jerusalem is a historical mystery set in Jerusalem in 1952, a time when life was divided in two, with barricades and walls between the eastern and western parts of the city. Rich in historical background, the book deals with one of the most contentious political issues in Israel's history, whether or not Israel should negotiate directly with Germany for reparations for the Holocaust. This issue divided Israeli society and the struggle against negotiations reached a boiling point on January 7, 1952, when protestors stormed the Knesset following a fiery speech by Menachem Begin. Not merely a mystery, *A Death in Jerusalem* is a journey back in time to a young state of Israel, beautifully capturing the country, the city, and its people.

Jonathan Dunsky is the author of the Adam Lapid mysteries, a series of historical novels set primarily in Israel in the 1940s and '50s. A longtime student of history and an avid reader of crime fiction, Dunsky combined his two passions to create his protagonist, Adam Lapid, a Holocaust survivor who works as a private detective in the fledgling State of Israel. A native of Israel, Dunsky did not grow up speaking English at home. As a teenager, he decided he wanted to master the language and so started reading books in English and checking unfamiliar words in the dictionary. It's a habit he keeps to this day. The Adam Lapid series numbers seven novels and one short story, so far. Dunsky is writing the eighth novel in the series, with many more to come. In addition, he has published a stand-alone thriller called *The Payback Girl* and a number of short stories in various genres. Dunsky resides in Israel with his wife and two sons.
