THE SOCIAL AND SACRED CONNECTIONS OF OUR SPIRTUAL HOME



I have always loved going to weekday minyanim and Shabbat morning services. But not only for the reasons that you might imagine. It is true that *tefilah*, prayer, is a central part of my life. Creating intentional time and space, each day, to check in with myself, find moments of grace and gratitude, and strive to connect with that which is greater than all of us, the Holy One of Blessing, is a long-established part of my daily spiritual practice. But at the same time, I do not only enjoy services for the spiritual connection that is found through *tefilah*, I enjoy them for the spiritual connection that is found through *kehillah*, through community, through gathering. There is the old joke which quips that *Goldberg and Schwartz both go to synagogue*. *Goldberg goes to synagogue to talk to God and Schwartz goes to talk to Goldberg*. I go do to both. And I know that I am not alone.

When I was a teenager, I began attending *shul* semi-regularly with my Uncle. We would sit together and I would loudly and proudly sing along to all of the prayers that I knew (probably a bit too loudly!). The services were enjoyable, and after I eventually got over my anxiety when it came to leading, I liked being asked to lead various parts of the service from time to time – squirming a bit as the Cantor and Rabbi argued over my future profession. *But what I remember most is the people.* I remember Sam, the man who I thought was around 100 years old (probably in his 70s) who used to cut the challah at Kiddush. To this day, I cut the challah the way he did. I remember Justin, from the weekday morning minyan, who always asked about my family and invited me to sit with the men (back then, it was mostly men) afterwards for bagels. How could I, a growing teenager, refuse? I remember the Cantor, for whom I would diligently race to the front of the line at the Kiddush to bring her a cookie after she had worked so hard (chocolate chip was her favorite, I believe); and the Rabbi who was endlessly patient with my questions about all things Jewish. Indeed, I owe a good part of my rabbinic identity to him – may his memory be for a blessing.


The point I am trying to make is the synagogue service was a place where I felt a sense of belonging, a sense that I was cared for by others, a sense of deep connection to my heritage. It wasn't only about the *tefilah*, it was about the atmosphere that was created by a community that had decided to become more like a family.

We too, are blessed to be a part of such a prayer community that seeks to create deep and special connections among all who attend. Just to give you a few examples from the past few weeks. There was the individual who was honored by our director of ritual engagement, Ben Laskowitz, for becoming a "Master Torah Reader," celebrating their 24th reading from the Torah. This honor did not come easily, but here was someone who stood out to all in attendance (as have others) as an example that it is never too late to learn a new skill in life, to deepen your connection to Judaism. That same morning, another person stood up for an Aliyah and quietly remarked: "You know, this is my first Aliyah – ever!" When she was younger, women did not have aliyot. As she stood with her Shabbat morning family, we were able to honor her for reaching such a wonderful moment and take just a moment to express gratitude for witnessing this moment together. And then, there was the moment when another woman (in her 90s!) was presented a talit, for the first time in her life. A talit, which was made for her by CTE member Rabbi Ellen Wolintz-Fields. Talk about an emotional and sacred moment!

This is not only a Shabbat phenomenon. I was recently at a board meeting when one of our evening zoom regulars shared how important it has become for her to log on, every night, for 15 minutes to join in the zoom minyan. Like many, she started joining on zoom to say Kaddish for a loved one. But she stayed because she understood how important the relationships in that zoom minyan were to our community. Even virtually, we are blessed to have people who gather together each night to connect with one another, to pray together, to share together, and in particular, to support those who are grieving. As this person said to me: (I'm paraphrasing): It is not because I feel so religious, but because I just want to be there for others. I want to do the right thing.

This is what families do for one another. They show up. They pray together, talk together, celebrate together, and grieve together. They socialize together. They share in joyous moments, big and small. I love each Shabbat when we share "good news" and hear about all of the good things happening in the lives of our members. Some people have even started making lists during the week to share on Shabbat. You, too, are a part of this family of families, this sacred, spiritual community of sharing and gathering. As the secular new year gets started, I want to invite you to consider joining us for services — weekday mornings (8am, Sun. 8:30am), evenings on zoom (7pm), Friday nights (6:15pm through the spring), or Shabbat morning (9am). Come for the service, come for the people, or come for both. We would love to have you join us!



The film will highlight twenty-three 8th-12th grade students across Monmouth and Ocean counties interviewing three Holocaust survivors, Arthur Spielman, Eva Wiener and Hanna Wechsler, who have unique and life-changing stories.




